



NOTES FROM FATHER BOB...

THIRD SUNDAY OF LENT 2013

Mike was sixteen years old when he landed up in an institution for young offenders. He blamed his troubles on "mixing with the wrong crowd". Today, he is twenty-four, finishing his degree and heading for medical school. It's a monumental turnaround. But how did it come about?

He was lucky to be offered a scholarship from a program which provides financial aid to young offenders and those at high risk of offending. Those behind the foundation – judges, lawyers, police officers, government officials and concerned citizens – believe any young person can become an educated, responsible and contributing member of society, if they are given financial and other support. There is an interview process and the young offenders must have support from probation and parole officers.

The foundation has also established library programs in 4 youth detention centers, and a steel-band program aimed at confidence building; detainees are taught to repair and maintain bicycles, and sharpen and care for skates. Those items are then distributed to low-income children, providing the young people behind bars the chance to give something back to the community, as well as instilling in them a sense of pride – something most of them are sadly lacking. A judge, who is a patron of the foundation, says, "I've always believed in giving young people a second chance and the results pay dividends, not just to the kids, but to society." Mike himself is grateful for his second chance. "They supported me," he says. "I was given hope when there wasn't hope."

Today's parable has been called the parable of the second chance because it teaches that God offers people a second chance, as the apostles Peter and Paul could testify. The gardener tells the owner of the vineyard that it is necessary to give the fig tree another chance to produce fruit. With nourishment and care, something may come from the life of the tree.

This parable follows two stories which highlight the need for repentance and starting lives anew, in order to move forward with God. Jesus is told of two terrible recent tragedies: some Galileans have been murdered in the Temple in Jerusalem, while at Siloam a tower has collapsed, killing eighteen people. People are saying that there is a connection between these tragic events and the moral disease in their midst. Jesus calls for repentance and assures his listeners that it is never too late to turn around their lives to bear fruit in God's eyes.

When Jesus asks people to repent, he is not simply asking them to do something religious; rather, he is asking them to dare to see differently, to look at God, the world and themselves through a different lens. The time to repent is the time to let go of one way of seeing and thinking, in order to embrace the risk of seeing and thinking differently and, therefore, living differently.

We tend to think of the word "repent" as a bit old-fashioned, perhaps as meaning that we should be walking around beating ourselves in public. But in the New Testament the word translated as 'repentance' is the Greek word METANIO. This word means 'a change of mind accompanied by regret and change of conduct'. Lent is an opportunity for new beginnings for ourselves; perhaps we should also take the opportunity to give one another a second chance.

Consider someone whom we really don't like, maybe one who has wronged us or someone who is socially unacceptable. What can we do to give them a second chance? Do we know of any young offenders or young people who are unemployed and harboring a grudge that society has let them down? What measures can we take to help give them a second chance? Some Christian projects work with young offenders trying to reintegrate into society, or help unemployed youth to gain work skills. We could find out about such initiatives and support them.

And what about ourselves? The death and resurrection of Christ assures us that God never gives up on us, even if we give up on ourselves. Perhaps we need to give ourselves a second chance and allow those around us, particularly those who love us, to help us start anew. All kinds of assistance can be given, but it is up to us to be responsive to the care that is given. We can think of the little fig tree, and find those things that nourish us and urge us to grow stronger and more faithful, as we strive to turn our lives around.

In contrast to our culture that puts much stock in progress and has very little patience for mistakes or failures, today's Gospel on the parable of the fig tree provides a hopeful alternative. In God's orchard there is patience, even with the little tree that doesn't bear fruit as it should. The gardener promises to cultivate and nurture the ground – such cultivation (breaking up the soil around us) and nurturing (or manuring) may not seem pleasant to us initially, but it is God's way of calling us to grow.

Hope


We are at our best at Sunday Mass, when we are focused and paying attention to what is going on right now. That isn't, however,

SUPPLEMENTING FAITH by Danielle Bean

"Make every effort to supplement your faith with virtue. And virtue with knowledge, and knowledge with self-control, and self-control with steadfastness, and steadfastness with godliness, and godliness with brotherly affection with love."

2 Peter 2:1-5

Sometimes, faith is the easy part; it's the call to love that trips me up. That's how I found myself standing in a long line for confession one Holy Week not too long ago. The number and variety of penitents was striking. Every one of us, from the blue-haired teen nervously nibbling her thumbnail to the old man with an oxygen tank strapped to his back, were waiting.

We were waiting for the grace of God's forgiveness, for the healing that comes through the sacrament of reconciliation. Not because we were worthy, but because, for all our other imperfections, we had gotten one more important thing right: We knew that we needed Jesus and he was worth waiting for.

Even if we have faith, we are called to supplement that faith with other virtues. That's the hard part. I recognize Christ in the Eucharist and in the confessional, but how readily to see his face in my husband, my children, or my friends? Do I see him in my own hands, feet, mind, and voice—the ones with which he longs to practice his mercy?

The same Christ who walked the earth, who healed the sick, who bled on the cross, and who rose from the dead is truly present among us. He is in our churches, in our homes, in our hearts, and behind the face of every person we meet.

ACTION STEP

Our Lord is here. He alone can fill us where we are lacking, strengthen us where we are weak, and heal us where we are broken and burned. Will we seek him? What do you need to bring to our Lord in confession? When will you make the time to go?

FOUND AND LOST AND FOUND AGAIN by Gerry Straub

I love Lent. Lent is a journey to Easter, a journey to resurrection. I need Lent because I get busy and I forget that Christ rose from the dead. And in my fog of forgetfulness, I lose sight of how that unique event needs to have continual meaning for me, that this gift of new life still happens for me. But worse than forgetting, I fail to live the reality of the Resurrection, and in doing so I turn Easter into nothing more than an annual commemoration.

The gift of new life that the Resurrection of Christ gives to each of us should dramatically change the way we view the world and the way we live life. But the reality of the end of death quickly fades into a dream. Yes, we will die, but Christ forever changed the nature of death. It is no longer an ending, but a passage - a Passover - to eternal life. Yet we forget, distracted by a thousand things, 995 of which are trivial. Christ made us partakers of His resurrection; that is the core of the Christian faith. But, sadly, it is not the core of our daily experience.

Living a life of "faith, hope and love" seems virtually impossible because of our inherent weaknesses. God continually asks us to put Him first, and seek Him at all times and in all things. We want to put God first, but we are busy, engulfed in so many distractions and preoccupations that we forget and we fail to do it. And our forgetfulness makes it easy for sin to sneak back into our lives. Slowly, the new life of Christ recedes back into the old life of man. We become shallow and stingy. Joy loses its smile and our faces turn dismal. Life loses its meaning; everything becomes pointless. God has left the building...or so we think. But no, God never leaves. It is us who turn our backs on God, and step by step walk further away. Until Lent rolls around, and prompts us to turn around and begin our journey back to God. The God we found, but lost...and who mercifully gives us an endless number of second chances to find Him again. Lent helps me see and taste the new life in Christ I so easily betray. Lent is a time to repent and return to the Source and Sustainer of life.

I love Lent. Lent helps me find what I have lost. Lent helps me fall in love again.



TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Hollywood has given us an image of Moses slipping off his shoes before a burning bush. God has just called Moses by name, and so that Moses doesn't miss the meaning of this breakthrough in human history, God requires that all barriers to the experience be eliminated. If you've ever tried to maneuver barefoot across hot sand, or pick your way along a rocky beach, you know how sensitive feet can be.

Within the Church, there are religious orders with a custom of going barefoot, not merely to show poverty, but to be an outward sign of a desire for connection with creation, a desire to go through life alert to what God is doing. In early days, when reconciliation was a once-in-a-lifetime possibility, penitents often went barefoot for a long period of time as a sign of their conversion. Even today, people follow an ancient practice of slipping off their shoes to walk in the procession to the cross on Good Friday. It is striking that the first use of our newly-scrubbed feet from Holy Thursday night is to walk resolutely in the footsteps of Christ to the cross.




