

THE GOOD SHEPHERD

The Good Shepherd not only knows us but has given his life for us. We belong to the Shepherd. His life is the source of our life. One part of this relationship is firm—God's part. The Father has entrusted us to the Son, and the Son will not let go of our hand.

The other part of this relationship depends on us, of course. In today's Gospel, Jesus assumes our openhearted good will. "My sheep hear my voice . . . and they follow me." This hearing and following is a daily undertaking that implies responsibility. Take Paul and Barnabas, for example. They moved ever closer to the reality that salvation was also meant for those members of the flock who did not yet know God's saving power. The Gentiles were the sheep known by the Shepherd. Paul could finally see that now was the acceptable time for them to know the Shepherd. Now the circle could be completed. Finally, those who were known and loved by the God of Jesus could know and follow the God of Jesus. There will never be a last chapter to this story of salvation.

NOTES FROM FATHER BOB...

FOURTH SUNDAY OF EASTER 2013

St. Paul had been a senior Pharisee and the local Jews might have first thought of him as a visiting celebrity. Imagine their horror to find him preaching about Jesus and preaching to the pagans too. Paul makes clear that he has come not to his fellow Jews but to all who will accept Jesus. The whole book of the Acts of the Apostles charts this move away from the idea of the Good News being for the people of Israel alone, and towards a global Church of believers of all nations. We are so familiar with the idea of a global Church that it can come as a surprise to remember that this was such a radical idea. St. Paul paid for his radical ways over and over again as he was repeatedly ejected from places where he preached, was imprisoned multiple times and was finally executed.

Our second reading, from the book of the Apocalypse, describes John's vision of the great crowd of the saved from all nations. Again this reinforces the idea of Jesus as the savior not just of the Jews but of the whole world.

Jesus' words in today's Gospel are a bit more subtle. In other parts of the Gospels, Jesus welcomes those who are not Jewish – Romans, Samaritans and those rejected by Jewish society. But in today's passage he uses the metaphor of sheep and their shepherd. It's an image we frequently find in the Bible: King David had been a shepherd boy, the psalm "The Lord is my Shepherd" talks of God's care for us, and Jesus tells the parable of the lost sheep. In today's Gospel reading Jesus promises that his sheep will be cared for; and that these sheep will not just be cared for in this life, but will have eternal life and can never be lost.

We are lucky enough to be part of that great flock of sheep. Through the actions of the apostles and their successors, God's word has been made available across the world. And over the centuries it has spread to people of all nations. All these people are part of the great flock who look to Jesus as their shepherd and who listen to his voice.

This global family of Christians does not just provide us with the community we have here on earth. More fundamentally we can all look to the promise of salvation, which Jesus offers us in today's Gospel. We are promised the greatest gift of all: not just a level of love and mercy in this world which is beyond our deserving, but the promise of eternal life. All we are asked to do is to listen to the word of Jesus our shepherd.

Think of someone you have long admired from a distance. It might be an author whose books you can quote verbatim. Perhaps it is a musician or singer whose latest CD is what you hear every night before you go to sleep—whether or not it's actually playing on the stereo. Or you might think of an artist whose masterpiece is prominently displayed as your screen saver, like your own personal treasure. This kind of hero worship is a human universal—an experience commonly shared by art historian, stay-at-home mom, and teenage-boy-band fan alike.

And yet, no matter how many interviews or biographies we commit to memory, nothing is quite like having the opportunity to meet one of these "stars" in person. This is the power of author book signings, live concerts, and conferences. All the ideas and facts and trivia literally come together and come alive in the personal encounter.

So, how do we Christians encounter Christ? We meet him in the ordinary moments of our lives, each time we encounter love. Like the celebrity encounter, that personal encounter allows us to transcend the gap between knowing about him and actually knowing him. Unlike the concert or conference meet-and-greet, however, the meeting with Jesus is infinitely more personal and profound.

In the sacraments, the Bridegroom has given his Bride seven extraordinary means of deep encounter. Of these, "the Eucharist is the outstanding moment of encounter with the living Christ." (Pope John Paul II, Ecclesia in America). The Eucharist is the highest point of prayer, and he who prays, sees.




St. Cletus School First Grade Tech Savvy
