



NOTES FROM FATHER BOB...

TWENTIETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME 2013

While I was on vacation I had the opportunity to watch a BBC program which focused on the conquistadors who established Spanish Rule of Latin America in the sixteenth century. While many Church leaders found no contradiction between this savage colonization and their Christian faith, the Dominicans opposed the system by which Indians were disposed of their lands. The prophetic preaching of Antonio Montesino is outstanding and leads to the conversion of Bartholomew Las Casas, a key figure in the development of the recognition of the human rights of the Indians. The story of the conversion of Las Casas is inspiring since it shows how the Spirit of God penetrates to the depths of the human heart where God's voice echoes words of truth.

Las Casas was a diocesan priest who had slaves entrusted to him. This was a common practice, upheld by the Church but opposed by the Dominicans. On one occasion he was refused absolution in confession unless he freed his Indian slaves. Initially, he did not change his life but later reflecting in prayer on the Book of Ecclesiasticus, chapter 34, he realized that the system was wrong. He recognized Christ suffering in the Indian people, even though they were not Christians. The Word of God which proclaims the dignity of every man and woman penetrated through layers of cultural blindness so he was able to recognize the truth of his situation. God was recognized in the outsider or the foreigner – the Indian. The wrong which had been done and the sin of the ill treatment began to be recognized and denounced. He abandoned his slaves and became a Dominican. He spent his life preaching about the rights of the Indians and later engaged in debate in Spain in order to protect them. Las Casas became prophetic in his words and his deeds and for this we remember him.

Bartholomew Las Casas did not die a martyr, though he faced opposition and division. However, his preaching changed the way in which people viewed the native Indians of Latin America. Today's gospel depicts the preaching of Christ bringing division among families. Luke recognizes that the truth of the gospel will meet opposition just as Christ met antagonism and hostility which led to the cross and Calvary. Jesus disturbed the established order of the Jewish priesthood and the superiority of the Pharisees. He associated with people considered outside the Law and healed on the Sabbath. Thus he proclaimed he was the Messiah.

The prophet Jeremiah, God's agent, is dumped in the well of the court because he has spoken out and told people that their battle is in vain and that they must surrender to the King of Babylon. This message makes no sense to nationalists or patriots but is God's word and so must be followed. The exile will be a time by which God punishes his people but he will later lead them back rejoicing to Jerusalem. While the Jewish King's supporters threw Jeremiah into the well, he is rescued by an outsider, an Ethiopian or Cushite. God is at work outside the people of Israel and through the outsider saves Jeremiah who is able to continue to preach his message. God's ways are not the ways of humans; they cannot be limited.

The emotions and attitudes of the human heart are complex and often blinded by rationalizations, cultural values or structures of the sin which perpetuate prejudice or discrimination. The disciple will be open to the gospel in order to see the truth more fully. Living faith with honesty and justice may be ridiculed by other members of the family. Proclaiming gospel values will often meet resistance from family, friends or other people in society. When we denounce injustice, to protect the unborn child from abortion, to argue that the embryo should be treated as a person will bring opposition from many people in today's society. When we take a stand for just and equitable immigration reform we can meet with much opposition. The values of the gospel will be opposed especially when they disturb complacency or wrongdoing. The witness of Christians throughout history can inspire a person to live the gospel more faithfully. The letter to the Hebrews urges Christians to keep running steadily in the race which they have begun. Like athletes the training may be difficult; the cross may have to be endured, but the victory is guaranteed by Christ.

THE COSTS OF DISCIPLESHIP

Today's responsorial psalm, Psalm 40, is more familiar to us with the refrain "Here am I, Lord." This "Here am I" is Jeremiah's great prophetic response to God's call. But today's story of Jeremiah and the refrain "Lord, come to my aid!" remind us that there are always two sides to following the call of God. The author of the Letter to the Hebrews knew this, too. He reminded his readers that even weighted down with burdens and sins, we can still persevere by keeping our eyes fixed on Jesus, who himself knew the shame and pain of the cross, but saw beyond it to the joy of sitting at the right of the throne of God. Jesus himself gave the disciples a "sneak preview" of a baptism that would not be as wondrous as the one in the Jordan that inaugurated his ministry, but would be one of fire and anguish. Today's words from scripture may not be terribly soothing, but in their honesty and strength we can acknowledge the difficulties of daily discipleship, and take comfort in the assurance of our own salvation in Christ.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

The wonderful diversity of life and worship among Roman Catholics of East and West is an example of God writing straight with crooked lines. The steady hand of the villainous Emperor Diocletian drew a line across Europe and Africa that split the empire in two, and for the most part determined how Christians would worship two thousand years later.

Italy's heel and the far northern city of Trieste fell on the Eastern side, and have had a form of Eastern liturgy ever since. Constantinople, which soon became the seat of the Roman Empire, became a base for Christianizing the East up to Russia and Poland. Poland was on the Eastern side, but a series of wars and medieval mayhem pushed the religious boundary back to the Ukraine, and Poland remains an outpost of the Latin Church to this day.

An old rule of thumb declared that whatever religion was observed by the local prince, the people had to follow. This gave rise to persecution and migration as people sought toleration for their expressions of faith. In the United States, we are accustomed to peaceful collaboration among Christians of East and West, a situation that challenges churches that still feel the pinch of age-old division.



THE LOVING RESPONSE OF FAITH

"Behold I am a handmaid of the Lord; let it be to me according to your word."—Luke 1:38

Many of us seek God in order to have him fulfill our own dreams and plans for our lives. But Mary and the saints were the kind of people who truly lived by faith. Instead of always telling God what to do, they listened attentively to God's Word, affectionately wanting to know God's heart, so they could devote their lives to fulfilling his plans.

We see this faith-filled response in Mary's words to Gabriel at the Annunciation. After hearing from the angel that God wanted her to become the mother of the Messiah, she didn't simply say "OK." She responded joyfully, longing to do whatever her beloved desired of her: "I am the handmaid of the Lord; let it be to me according to your word" (1:38).

John Paul II and others have pointed out how in the original Greek of the New Testament, Mary's words "let it be to me" indicate not a passive acceptance of God's Word, but an active, loving embrace of it. Mary does not simply submit to God's plan; she longs to fulfill it, "making it her own" (John Paul II, General Audience, September 4, 1996). Mary responds like a lover who, once she sees what is on her Beloved's heart, ardently seeks to fulfill his desires. She inspires us to approach God's Word with attentive love, seeking to know God's will in order to satisfy his desires.

"To Teach Who Christ Is" Archdiocese Launches \$350 Million Campaign for Education, Faith Formation

On June 5, Cardinal George announced a major fund-raising effort for Catholic education and faith formation in the Archdiocese of Chicago—the \$350 million *To Teach Who Christ is Campaign*.

The campaign has been structured to create significant financial support to archdiocesan Catholic schools, religious education for children and teens, adult faith formation and capital needs for parishes and schools.

To Teach Who Christ Is is an archdiocesan, wide-parish-based campaign with an enhanced major gift effort that has already raised \$82.5 million, or approximately 24% of the total. The campaign will be rolled out in parishes over a three-year period.

The total goal for parishes is \$250 million with 60% of the funds raised to remain in the individual parish for its specific needs and 40% to be distributed through the archdiocese.

The campaign offers benefits to archdiocesan Catholics in Cook and Lake counties, to individual elementary and high school children and to the entire metropolitan community.

"The Catholic schools of the Archdiocese of Chicago and our faith formation programs make their case in the lives of those transformed by them," said Cardinal George. "The alumni of our schools and parishes are living and working in Chicago, the suburbs and around the world. They are the reason, and the winning conclusion, to the need to conduct the *To Teach Who Christ Is* campaign. The campaign is well named. That is our mission. It's what we do—we teach the world who Christ is."


