

NOTES FROM FATHER BOB...

THIRTY-THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME 2013

The early Christians were anxious to know when the Day of the Lord would be, when the Lord Jesus would return in power and glory. Some of them expected the second coming of Christ to be very soon. We see the effects of all this in the second reading – some Christians are so convinced of the imminent return of the Lord that they stop bothering about the ordinary tasks and responsibilities of life. What's the point in wasting your time working if the end is near? When the Romans destroyed the Jerusalem Temple in 70 AD, many Christians believed this might well be the final great sign that the end was indeed near, that the Day of the Lord was approaching.

Luke is careful to make sure that the Christians of his community do not get carried away. Jesus says that says that anyone who claims to know when the end is, or who cites wars, plagues and natural disasters as evidence that the end is near, is an imposter. Refuse to believe them, he says. The message from Malachi, Paul and Jesus is clear: don't look to the future, but look to the present, to your life here and now. It is in the present moment that your salvation is being worked out. The picture Jesus paints of the present is far from idyllic: betrayal, persecution, even death for the sake of faith in him. Little wonder that some early Christians longed for the imminent return of Christ to put an end to their suffering. But Christ speaks of this present time as a real opportunity – a chance to bear witness to their faith, to the reason for their hope. It is that faith which enables the Christian to face the problems which life brings. It is not that Christians are immune to suffering, persecution, disease or death, but rather that their faith means they are able to overcome these disasters. Yes – you may die for your faith, says the Lord, but your endurance will win you your lives – the gift of eternal life.

We can all be tempted to live in the future. Perhaps we long for escape from the boredom or drudgery of our lives, perhaps to escape from violence or oppression in its various forms. The challenge is not to wait for the future for things to be better, but to allow this day – every day – to be the Day of the Lord for us, to be a time when the Lord can come with power into our lives, to bring his healing and salvation.

Seize the day – use the opportunity of the present moment to bear witness to your faith and hope. Don't let the tragedies and disappointments of life deflect you. Persevere, endure. Today is the Day of the Lord: he comes precisely IN our everyday lives. As Christians we are to live in the present moment, for this is where we find Christ, and it is here and now that we are to bear witness to him.

ST. CLETUS PARISH TRANSFORMATION UPDATE

Over 30 dedicated volunteers from the parish have been meeting every Wednesday evening for the past 10 weeks to discuss and develop our parish plan for transformation over the next 3 to 4 years. This program is mandated by the Archdiocese and helps the parish to recognize the strengths and challenges as we prepare for the future.

The process consists of three areas to be examined which are Mission (which includes a review of all of our ministry areas); School (which focuses on our parish school); Finance (which examines the parish financial structures and best practices).

In August and September around 300 parishioners completed a survey provided by the Archdiocese. These surveys combined with our weekly meetings have allowed parishioners and staff to work together to identify the strengths, define the parish's distinctive character, and look for opportunities for our parish to improve as we move into the future.

This important process and the information it surfaces helps us to reflect upon how our parish is called to live the mission of Christ and develop an action plan for the future.




Thank you to all who donated items for last week's monthly food distribution, and/or donated their time preparing for it. This is a major undertaking each month, which could not happen without YOUR participation.

My name is John Balch. In August I appealed to St. Cletus Parish to help me with my Eagle Scout project. I worked with Troop 19 to collect personal care products for client families who use the St. Cletus Food Pantry.

For more than a month, donations—both monetary and physical—poured in. To give you an idea, troop and family members helped me to count and categorize 2,000 items, among them more than 300 toothbrushes, 600 bars of soap, 300 tubes of toothpaste, and 300 bottles of shampoo.

These donations were divided and packaged into 325 bags, which were given to families who came to the St. Cletus Food Pantry distribution on October 10. As it turns out, there was a surplus of bags and according to St. Cletus Director of Social Concerns, Mary Beth Ford, the extra supplies will be used for upcoming pantry distributions, and some were already donated to a collection for U.S. soldiers overseas.
