

Sunday, March 16, 2014 Christ on the Mountain Tops

Today's Readings: Genesis 12:1–4a; Psalm 33:4–5, 18–19, 20, 22 (22); 2 Timothy 1:8b–10; Matthew 17:1–9. Today we move from temptation in the desert to Transfiguration on the mountain. Along with Peter, James, and John, we stand basking in the light of Christ as he converses with Moses and Elijah. The vision in today's Gospel tells the three disciples, and us, who Jesus really is—the Son of God. Confronted with this wonder so unexpectedly, Peter, James, and John will need time to put the pieces together. We have the benefit of Matthew's description and centuries of Church reflection on the meaning of this event. God sent his divine Son to enter into conversation with us, to give us the courage and strength to follow him. In revealing this to us through the Transfiguration, God enables our own transformation.

Our destiny is written between two holy mountains: the mountain of Transfiguration, and the mountain of Calvary. Both suffering and glory accompany us on the holy road to Easter. During this season of Lent, as we try to lay aside distractions and focus on the most simple, essential truths, may the light of the Transfiguration guide our steps. Let us walk together with family, friends, strangers, the needy, and even enemies so that the journey may awaken in us a sense of solidarity with our neighbors, and spur us to work for the good and justice of all. May we have the courage to look into the face of the one who came to lead us out of sin and the shadow of death. May our acts of prayer, penance, and almsgiving be drawn together in a great song of praise.



THE PASSION OF THE CHRIST MOVIE, ADORATION, AND BENEDICTION




On Monday March 24, from 6:30 to 9:30 p.m., join the CREDO Committee for a Lenten mini-retreat. We will begin in Room 98 in the Education Building with the viewing of the movie *The Passion of the Christ*. After the movie, a brief period of meditation will be followed by Eucharistic Adoration and Benediction in the Church.

As Monica Miller states in her book *The Theology of The Passion of the Christ*, the movie "is a religious meditation ... and functions as an icon ... intended to stimulate, arouse, and provoke faith .. and a response to the person of Christ and his mission of redemption. "*The Passion* has the power to bring the viewer to a deeper awareness of the sacrifice of Christ and His great love for mankind to have endured such suffering." The movie "has the ability to deepen, even awaken faith."

As Roger Ebert wrote in his review, "It is clear that Mel Gibson wanted to make graphic and inescapable the price that Jesus paid (as Christians believe) when he died for our sins. Anyone raised as a Catholic will be familiar with the stops along the way; the screenplay is inspired not so much by the Gospels as by the 14 Stations of the Cross. As an altar boy, serving during the Stations on Friday nights in Lent, I was encouraged to meditate on Christ's suffering, and I remember the chants as the priest led the way from one station to another. ... For we altar boys, this was not necessarily a deep spiritual experience. Christ suffered, Christ died, Christ rose again, we were redeemed, and let's hope we can get home in time to watch the Illinois basketball game on TV. What Gibson has provided for me, for the first time in my life, is a visceral idea of what the Passion consisted of... This is not a sermon or a homily, but a visualization of the central event in the Christian religion."

Come join us to contemplate the sacrifice Christ made for us and then spend some time in His presence. If you only wish to attend the second part of the program, Eucharistic Adoration and Benediction will begin in the church at 9:00 p.m. Due to the graphic nature of the film, this event will be limited to adults only.

Last week, we saw Jesus tempted by the devil, an event that reminds us that Jesus is very much like us: human. But this week, the Gospel reveals Jesus' divinity; we travel up the mountain with Peter, James and John, and see Jesus transfigured before us into his divine form. The disciples only later realize what they had seen: the future form of the risen Jesus. What hope this vision gives to us! The hope of eternal life.

- **PRAY** for Jesus to lead you to a transfiguration moment in your life this week, a moment to see clearly what God is calling you to do or to be. Ask for the grace to live out that vision.
- **FAST** from lethargy; feast on enthusiasm.
- **LEARN** about Guatemala. It has the largest economy in Central America, but there is a big divide between the poor and middle class. The indigenous population is especially affected; almost 50% of children under age 5 suffer from malnutrition; 80% of these children are indigenous.
- **GIVE.** Follow the daily reflections below for suggestions regarding almsgiving, as well as other ways to make your Lenten Journey more meaningful.

Try

You invite your children to try new foods. You expose them to new activities and experiences to broaden their knowledge of both themselves and the world. Make sure you invite them to try new ways of



praying too. Introduce them to the beauty of morning prayer, mealtime prayers, and evening prayers. Pray using the Bible. Begin with the Psalms or one of the Gospels. 
St. Cletus Students Continue to Soar!
