

# Social Concerns Ministry Update!

## FOOD PANTRY UPDATE

- Our Food Pantry received 9,600 lbs. of food as one of the recipients of the U.S. Post Office May 10 Food Drive. (If we had to buy this food from the Greater Chicago Food Depository, we would have paid over \$4,850, and if we had to pay regular retail prices it would probably be double that amount)!
- Special thanks to the U.S. Postal Service, the National Association of Letter Carriers, the La Grange Post Office, the Cub/Boy Scouts of the Des Plaines Council, and all who donated to this national event, which benefitted so many food pantries and other food agencies across the country.
- A giant THANK YOU to the volunteers who picked up the donations from the La Grange Post Office, delivered them to our pantry, and sorted, boxed or shelved this mountain of food.
- Even with this donation, we still have a list of most needed items: dry pinto beans, cereal, jelly, canned fruit, powdered or canned milk and diapers.
- Monetary donations or food gift cards are also greatly appreciated. These donations can be placed in the Sunday collection basket or dropped off/mailed to the rectory. Checks should be made payable to "St. Cletus Social Concerns/Food Pantry."
- Reminder: Zak Russo, as his Eagle Project, will continue collecting cleaning supplies for the next few weeks. His bin is located alongside our food bins in the church narthex.
- Those we serve greatly appreciate your generosity and the Christian hope you provide.

#### MORE PANTRY NEWS

Our May 8, food distribution looked a little different than usual. Besides our regular monthly distribution to over two hundred households, we also hosted this month's GCFD (Greater Chicago Food Depository) Mobile Pantry for Lyons Township. The usual site, Hodgkin's Park District, was unable to host it in May, so St. Cletus Food Pantry stepped up to do so. This collaborative effort was possible with the approval and encouragement of Fr. Bob, and the aid of our Business Manager, Debbie Lestarczyk, our hard working maintenance staff, and amazing volunteers from both St. Cletus and St. Francis Xavier.

The warm weather was both a blessing...and a challenge. We received 7 pallets of beautiful first quality produce which had to be moved from the Church, where it was dropped off to stay cool, to the outdoor tent, where it was unpacked and bagged for distribution. Many willing hands served to bring this food to the hungry. The pictures below tell some of the story. The rest was told by the smiling faces and appreciation of those families who benefitted from this outreach.

## THE POWER OF THE SPIRIT

Do you recognize the sacrament that is celebrated in today's first reading from the Acts of the Apostles? When Peter and John imposed hands on those who had been baptized, they received the Holy Spirit in the sacrament of confirmation. The reading from the First Letter of Peter and the passage from John's Gospel both consider the results of our baptism and confirmation. Peter reminds us it is likely that we will have to suffer for what we believe.

In today's Gospel Jesus speaks clearly about the Holy Spirit, referring to a "Paraclete," one who will stand with us to defend us. Poignantly, Jesus promises his disciples, and all of us, "I will not leave you orphans." He has never left his followers orphaned. We have always had the Holy Spirit to guide us.

## TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION


In the tradition of the Church, not necessarily in your own life's timeline, confirmation is the midpoint of Christian initiation, standing between font and table. Full initiation is completed when a confirmed person shares in the Eucharist. Centuries ago, this first sharing in the Eucharistic assembly was marked by a first sharing in the Prayer of the Faithful. This prayer raises up the needs of the church and human community, the concerns of the faithful assembled, as they prepare to lift up the world to the Father's love. So a person could not participate in the prayer until they were anointed with the "Oil of Thanksgiving." Next, the newly baptized presented their gifts at the altar, a sure sign of their investment in a new way of life. Until the sixth century, these people normally drank a mixture of milk and honey as a kind of pre Communion. They were hungry, of course, since they were baptized hungry after long fasting, but this beautiful symbol of the promised land revealed them as God's chosen, heirs to the promise. Although the "milk shake" disappeared centuries ago, we still see the vigor of this new life whenever adults are initiated at Easter, and increasingly in confirmation ceremonies that are attentive to this meaning.
