NOTES FROM FATHER BOB...

PENTECOST 2014

“A VARIETY OF GIFTS BUT ALWAYS THE SAME SPIRIT.”

Today's second reading is from a letter of Paul to his friends in Corinth. He explains that it is not even possible “to acknowledge that Jesus is Lord” without the assistance of the Spirit. To put the point positively, it is the active presence of the Spirit that enables us to accept the truth at the heart of Christianity – Jesus is risen, he is truly risen, he is with us, he is Lord.

Paul goes on to say that the Spirit blesses the Church with a variety of gifts or charisms. In ordinary speech a charism means an exceptional natural talent, but as used by Paul it means a special gift bestowed by the Holy Spirit. It is a grace given by God ‘for the common good.’ Such gifts are allotted to the laity just as much as to the ordained. Some are dramatic, such as those of healing or of speaking in tongues; but many are less striking, such as those of teaching, of helping others, of administration. Indeed, every gift we have is a potential charism, something that can be put at the service of all.

Paul insists that the Holy Spirit who is responsible for the rich diversity of gifts in the Church is also responsible for the gift of unity. Many gifts “but the same source, the Holy Spirit”; “all sorts of service to be done but always to the same Lord (Jesus)” and “in all sorts of different ways in different people, (but always) it is the same God who is working in all”. “Just as a human body” says Paul “is made up of many parts and yet remains ‘a single unit’, so, thanks to the Holy Spirit, the Church is one though made up of many different members, each with their own unique gifts.”

An early Christian writer, speaking of the effects of Holy Communion, noted that ‘he (or she) who eats the bread (of the Eucharist) with faith, eats at the same time the fire of the Holy Spirit’. On this Sunday we might consider our own parish community and ask to what extent the ‘fire of the Holy Spirit’ is in evidence here. Is our parish alive? Are people devoting their time, their gifts, their energies to building up of community? Are we open to new ways of doing things or firmly anchored in the past? Are we completely self-centered as a parish or do we look beyond our parochial bounds? Is our unity manifested in genuine friendliness to one another, in readiness to listen to and to serve one another? Does our parish community live in harmony or is it driven by divisions?

Asking such questions can be valuable. But only if we are prepared to ask a supplementary question: “If things are not as they should be, what can I do to improve the situation?” If enough of us were ready to adopt that attitude, who knows what might happen? Might not the Holy Spirit put the finishing touches to our small efforts, bringing about a miniature Pentecost in our midst and so renewing the face of the earth right here at St. Cletus?

PARISH TRANSFORMATION

The very first Pentecost was a great moment of transformation for the disciples and the early followers of Jesus. The coming of the Holy Spirit transformed those first believers into men and women of action which enabled them to spread the Good News of the Gospel with passion and effectiveness.

Soon you will be receiving in the mail, information from our Parish Transformation Implementation Committee about the goals for our faith community over the next several years. The Transformation Committee has worked extremely hard during the past several months to identify specific areas of need and to develop goals for implementation within our parish.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank all of the volunteers that were so faithful and committed in their efforts to discuss, discern, and develop plans as we move into the future. This effort is a perfect example of the Holy Spirit at work within our faith community. Through their dedication and commitment along with the guidance of the Holy Spirit we can use this opportunity to grow even stronger in our efforts to effectively spread the Good News of the Gospel as we move forward into the future.

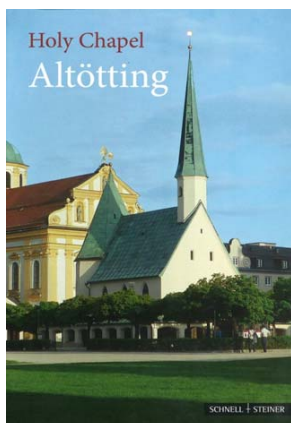

A GIFT FROM "THE CHAPEL OF GRACE" in Altötting, Germany



We have a beautiful new addition to our Marian Shrine area within the old church Baptistry in the Narthex. Through the generosity of Msg. Alois Furtner along with our own parishioners Dr. Thomas Bednar and Dr. Elfriede Linsmaier-Bednar we have been given a beautiful new candle from the famous and centuries old pilgrimage site of the Chapel of Grace in Altötting, Germany. The candle depicts the image of an enthroned Madonna and child as shown in the image above from the candle.

There is a rich history of this chapel that has developed over the centuries of this site being a well-attended place of pilgrimage and many miracles have been attributed to the intercession of the Mother of God here.

This site has risen to become Germany's most famous Marian Pilgrimage Site. As mentioned in the Shrine's brochure: "In 1321, the town seal for Neuötting displayed the Marian chapel at Altötting with an enthroned Madonna within its opened door. First of all, this demonstrates that Holy Chapel was already a pilgrimage site, secondly, that the 14th century Marian image at the time differed from the one at present."

"According to later sketches, two miracles in 1489 were said to have suddenly unleashed the pilgrimage that continues to flourish today. In both cases, a small boy was brought back to life thanks to the intercession of the Mother of God. Indeed, the reputation of Altötting had expanded so rapidly that pilgrims from the southern region of Germany, Austria, Bohemia, Hungary, and Switzerland soon descended upon the city. Among them – and as early as 1491 – were highly esteemed personages such as Frederick III and George of Bavaria, the duke of Bavaria-Landshut. This is demonstrated by the image of the Virgin Mary in the lunette at the actual Chapel of Grace entrance."

"Moreover, the number of entreaties continued to increase, with a sampling of them having been published. In 1494, there were already 25 miracles; by 1497, this number was increased by 77. In 1623, the Jesuit priest Johannes Saller cited a total of 2,148 miracles. Not only were these acknowledged by the so-called book of miracles, but also by over 50 panel paintings, completed between 1520 and 1540 and measuring up to two meters in height. Commissioned by the chapel administration for the chapel's ambulatory, they were soon joined by a multitude of private ex-votos."

"As a result of increasing pilgrimage activity, it became necessary to expand the Chapel of Grace and the parish church (via the addition of a nave and a partially new construction, respectively)." The Chapel continued to develop, change and grow over the centuries. "Even now, approximately a million people make the pilgrimage to Our Lady of Altötting: men and women, young and old, high-minded and humble, urbanites and rural inhabitants, Bavarians and non-Bavarians alike. They come from near and far, alone and in groups, on foot (over a multi-day trek), by bicycle, motorcycle, car, bus and train. Along the way, they seek an encounter with God and those around them, a sense of community through song and prayer, and at the site itself, intercessions to God and assistance in matters of sickness, jeopardy, and distress upon the body, spirit, and soul."

We sincerely thank Msg. Alois Furtner and Drs. Thomas and Elfriede Linsmaier-Bednar for this latest addition to our shrine area. May this candle and the great pilgrim site it depicts inspire the faithful here at St. Cletus for many years to come.

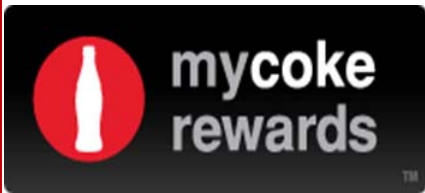

PENTECOST SUNDAY

There are different kinds of spiritual gifts but the same Spirit; there are different forms of service but the same Lord; there are different workings but the same God who produces all of them in everyone."

1 Corinthians 12:4-6

The Spirit gives each of us different gifts. The reason we are given those gifts is so that we may perform different forms of service for the Lord. If you don't use your gifts for the Lord, who will do the special work that God had in mind for you alone?

RECEIVE THE HOLY SPIRIT

At last! The power hinted at and the Spirit promised are unleashed on this holy day. We call it the birthday of the church. Try to listen to today's scripture passages with sense of how electrifying these events must have been to those who lived through them. Up until now, they have been waiting in the upper room. In today's first reading, that room is filled with wind and fire and bold proclamations in foreign tongues. In the second reading, Paul describes the Pentecost event, too. His description includes all of us. The Spirit lives on in the church in each of us who are members of the Body of Christ, given different gifts from the same Spirit. Only after Pentecost could the apostles look back and understand what Jesus meant when he said, as reported in today's Gospel reading, "Receive the Holy Spirit."

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Before there was water, there was fire. Once in a while, a volcano hints at the sizzling magma upon which the whole human enterprise floats. Over eons, the surface cooled off a bit, and rain sizzled down for thousands of centuries, filling the oceans and sculpting the earth. We Christians can catch God's glory in a shimmering pool of water, but we can also capture God's burning desire to fan the tiny flames of our baptismal candles into something that will make a difference.

In Sicily to this day, there is a custom of scattering rose petals down from the ceiling of church on the heads of the faithful, an effective reminder of the "tongues of flame" descending on the apostles, and a sign that the Holy Spirit still is poured out on the baptized. It is not merely a quaint custom, but a fairly potent sign of what baptism does. An interesting sidebar: if you have traced the Epiphany blessing on your doorway in chalk, Pentecost is the day to erase it. From now on, no need to rely on the "wise men"—you are alive in the Spirit!

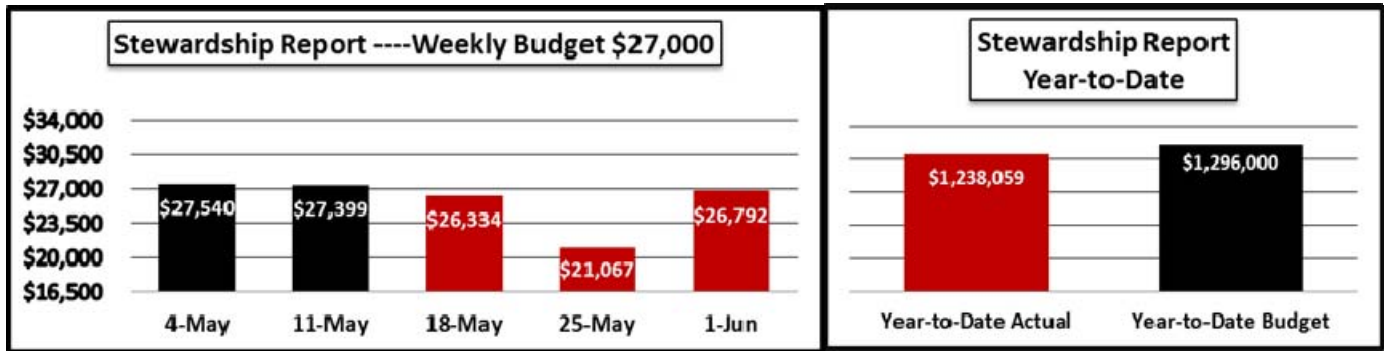
