

NOTES FROM FATHER BOB...



In the book of reflections called Living the Word Msgr. Ralph Kuehner and Father Joseph Juknialis write about a movie that was out several years ago called “A River Runs Through It.” “In the final scene of the film, A River Runs Through It, Norman McLean stands fly casting in the middle of the river that was his life and reminisces upon its people and its loves, its sorrows and its joys. There he muses how ‘eventually all things merge into one, and a river runs through it. The river was cut by the world’s great flood and runs over rocks from the basement of time. On some of the rocks are timeless raindrops. Under the rocks are the words, and some of the words are from those who we have known and loved and lived with. I am haunted by waters.’ All Souls Day belongs to all whose words are ‘under the rocks,’ to those whom the river brought into our lives in one way or another.”

“I’m never quite sure if the darkness of nighttime divides one day from the next, or if it is some mysterious cosmic glue meant to unite our days so that they are not many but only one, like all of life. If the night indeed links the days, then November 1 and November 2 (All Saints Day and All Souls Day) are simply two sides of the same coin, like the grace and sin of our lives curiously and mysteriously enmeshed as one. We are all saints and we are all sinners, all of us both sheep and goats, just some a little more and some a little less. So we remember the people of our lives – those whose words still linger under the rocks of life’s river. Even their small and insignificant deeds loom large in our memories, shining brightly in the splendor of at least our own firmament and in spite of their sinfulness.”

“We remember the people of our lives, and we think about their goodness, even though they may not have been without sin, we realize how much less life would have been without them. Then with gratitude we bring them to God in prayer, giving God the glory through Jesus Christ our Lord.”

3:00 - 5:45 - Leisure time, shopping and restaurants available in the quaint village of Long Grove



TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

For those of Mexican heritage, November 2 means celebration of *el Dia de Los Muertos*, or “the Day of the Dead.” One of the most important days of the year for many, they join All Saints and All Souls together, visiting the graves of babies and children on All Saints, since they are *santitos* (little saints) or *angelitos* (little angels). Flowers, their favorite toys, favorite music, and so on, are taken to them. The following day, people spend time—some of them all day—at the cemetery with their loved ones who have died. From the ancient customs of the Indians the families pray, talk with them, and take them their favorite food. It is a most solemn but joyful day. It is a day to celebrate Christ’s victory over death: “Death, where is your sting?” There is a mocking of death as people make skeletons, candy that represents death, and *Pan de los Muertos* (bread of the dead) and consume them in a kind of role reversal.

One of the customs is to build an *altarcito* (little altar) where one places mementos and pictures of those who have died. There are also favorite foods, candles, statues or pictures of favorite saints, books, and Bibles. Some parishes have begun to build an *altarcito* where all parishioners can join in honoring the deceased. A remembrance book can be placed to write names in. The *altarcito* is traditionally left up for the month of November.



Dr. Scott Hahn is the author (or editor) of over forty books. In 2013, Dr. Hahn was appointed the William and Lois McEssy Distinguished Visiting Professor of Biblical Theology and the New Evangelization at Mundelein Seminary.




