

GOD'S WORD TODAY

Easter changes everything. Listen carefully to today's Gospel passage, and notice the fact that this account includes Jesus breathing on his disciples. The same Greek word for breathing used in this passage also appears at the very beginning of the Bible. There, in Genesis, the Lord God breathes upon Adam, giving him life. In the Gospel passage, through this act of breathing on the disciples, the risen Jesus gives them new life. What does new life in the resurrected Christ look like? We need only look at the first reading to discover what a community of believers acts like when its members are living lives in the risen Christ. As we prepare to listen to the scriptures, let us pray that the breath of God will fill us with new life and help us live like the early Christian communities, when there was no needy person among them.

VISIT OF THE SEVEN CHURCHES



Holy Thursday at St. Cletus Parish was special this year! Not only did we have the always beautiful liturgy, we also had the opportunity to visit other stunning Catholic churches in the Chicago and Cicero areas. In our mini-pilgrimage, Fr. Edgar and 33 more parishioners, followed in the ancient tradition of the Visiting of Seven Churches. This tradition calls us to visit seven churches to show solidarity with Jesus as He contemplates the events that await Him on Good Friday.

Right after Holy Thursday Mass, we took a bus and set out towards Cicero, IL, our first stop, where we visited **St. Mary of Czestochowa Church**. This parish was founded as a Polish parish in 1895. It is a prime example of the so-called 'Polish Cathedral style' of churches in both its opulence and grand scale. The church is well known as the site where Al Capone's sister Mafalda married in 1930. Fr. Waldemar Wieladek, its pastor, welcomed us warmly and kindly showed us around.





We left St. Mary of Czestochowa in route to **St. Jerome Croatian in Chicago**. This church is also a historic church of the Archdiocese of Chicago. The parish's original church and rectory were purchased from German Protestants. It was blessed and opened its doors for public worship on December 5, 1912. The style of the church is not very common. In an effort to expand the church, balconies were constructed to accommodate more of the faithful. A group of parishioners welcomed us and described for us some of the most important features in the church.

Our third stop was **St. Mary of Perpetual Help**, which was seven minutes away from St. Jerome. St. Mary is, unquestionably, the most stunning church in the group. Founded in 1882 as a Polish parish, St Mary of Perpetual Help remained a parish for Polish workers in the Union Stockyards until the yards closed in the early 1970s. In recent years the neighborhood has seen a growth in new housing and has seen an influx of new residents of many backgrounds and cultures. The church, designed by Henry Engelbert in a Romanesque-Byzantine style, was completed in 1889. The present pastor is Fr. Tom Aschenbrener and, along with Fr. Bart Juncer, a resident priest, proudly showed us around the recently restored church.





The last church we visited that night was **St. Barbara's in Chicago**. St. Barbara is three minutes away from St. Mary of Perpetual Help, and is another historic church of the Archdiocese of Chicago. It was founded in 1909 as a Polish parish to relieve overcrowding at St. Mary of Perpetual Help. The first pastor of St. Barbara was the brother of St. Mary's pastor at the time. Therefore, the birth of St. Barbara Catholic Church was known to be a family affair! It is one of the few octagonal houses of worship in the archdiocese. There are 25 stunning stained glass windows depicting the Gospel and the lives of the saints. The present pastor is Fr. Arthur Marat who was very attentive and, with a group of his parishioners, gave us brochures with information about the church's features.

Although we visited only 5 churches (counting St. Cletus), the experience was well worth the effort. We were so energized by it that, we wanted to continue visiting churches all night! But, of course, we wanted to bring everyone back before midnight, and we did!



If you are new to the program, please bring a copy of your child's Baptismal certificate when you register unless they were baptized at St. Cletus.






