



### NOTES FROM FATHER BOB...



#### Trinity Sunday 2015

One of life's greatest joys is to watch little children as they begin to explore the world on their own. We can see their eyes gradually open to the wonders around them. They are in to everything, experimenting with touch and taste, and learning to use all their senses. It is a challenging time for parents, especially when they learn to speak and ask the why, the what and the how. Handling their difficult questions is a great skill. It is a case of trying to satisfy their little minds for the moment, knowing that there is so much more to learn and that even then they and we may never fully grasp the mystery.

So, how do we deal with questions about things of which we are not really sure? For example, I may understand a little about jet engines and aerodynamics, but I still marvel that a huge plane manages to take off so gracefully.

Just like children, we adults are surrounded by a wonderful and mysterious world. Although we may reckon ourselves wise in the ways of the world, we are still very much aware of our inability to make complete sense of it all. Often we can give no clear answer, especially to the question, 'why?' In such moments it is good just to marvel at the mystery and rejoice in the fact that it is.

The word 'mystery' has a rich and deep Christian significance. It is a word that we use, not to avoid thinking about the 'big issues' of faith, but to help us explore our very limited understanding of the nature of God. This is a process which Jesus himself, Son of God but incarnate as a human being with a finite human comprehension, has entered before us.

Jesus was aware of a Father who loved him passionately. He knew that God was no distant landlord unconnected with his life. God was Abba, Father, desiring the love of his children and desiring the very best for each one of them. There can be no logical explanation why God should love his creation so intensely. Our theologians and philosophers may strive for answers, but, in the end, we simply have to acknowledge, that is just how God is. That God wants us to be close to him is a great mystery, yet it is also the fundamental truth underlying the faith we profess.

Jesus was not content simply to explain his theory of God the Father. He strove to demonstrate the mystery of God in the building up of God's Kingdom here on earth. He came, not simply to educate us, but to enliven, liberate, and inspire us. He came to fill us with the Holy Spirit, God's uniting love. Just like people who stand amazed at a wondrous sight, Jesus is not content to keep the experience of God as Father to himself. He has no option but to invite other people to marvel at the same mystery. This is the reason for the great commission we witness in today's gospel.

The first command of Jesus is 'to go'; to leave the safe secure world and be active. Our sharing in the mystery of God is not simply a passive wonder, it drives us to leave our isolated worlds and stride forth with zeal in our desire to draw others to experience the same mystery.

Next, Jesus instructs his followers to 'make disciples'. Ideally, before we formalize our adherence to a particular way of life, code of conduct, or belief system, we should have experienced the value of such a commitment. For Jesus the first reality is that people should be introduced to God as father and be so amazed by the encounter that they are then drawn to commit their whole lives to God. Perhaps too often we have tried to force others to accept the 'package' without introducing them to the giver of the gift. When this happens the mystery is reduced to abstract ideas – one-in-three, three-in-one – rather than a vibrant life-giving relationship.

Once we come together in God's family we can teach each other, to witness in word and deed to the mystery of love in our lives: to do what Jesus commands. We become a people who are 'tuned in' to the greatest mystery of the universe.

Hispanic Adoration continues from 7:00-8:00 p.m.


## FAREWELL TO FR. EDGAR PLEASE NOTE DATE CHANGE!

## RELIGIOUS EDUCATION REGISTRATION REMINDER

Register your child/ren now for the 2015-2016 Religious Education Classes. We are excited to begin a new year of learning about our loving and generous God!

St. Cletus offers religious education classes for preschool aged children (3-K) in our Early Childhood Program, as well as for children in 1–8 Grades. You must be a registered parishioner to enroll your child in our program. If you need to register in the parish, please contact the rectory @ (708) 352-6209.

If you are new to the program, please bring a copy of your child's Baptismal certificate when you register unless they were baptized at St. Cletus.

Sacramental Preparation is a two year process, with children in Second Grade receiving the Sacraments of Reconciliation and Eucharist (after completing 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> Grade) and children in Eighth Grade receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation (after completing 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> Grade). Older children in need of the sacraments of Reconciliation and Eucharist will attend special classes.

Grades 1-6 meet on Sunday (9:15-10:45 a.m.) or on Monday (6:00-7:30 p.m.)

Grades 7-8 meet on Sunday (\*9:15-10:45 a.m.)



#### THE TRINITY IS LOVE

Theologians throughout the Christian centuries have spilled much ink (and, on occasion, some blood) in describing and defining the mystery of the Holy Trinity. One of the earliest, most poetic, and beautiful descriptions comes from St. Augustine in *De Trinitas*, wherein he describes the Trinity as One (the Father) who loves, One (the Son) who is loved, and One (the Spirit) who is love. And these three Ones are also one Three.

It might be wisest for us to leave the technical wranglings to the academic theologians, and focus on the fact that the three Persons of the Trinity are indeed persons; they are best known and understood in their love for each other and for us. We are made in the image of those loving persons, and our best relationships are lived out in the context of love. Truly loving relationships are inexhaustible mysteries to be lived in joy. If this is true of our human relationships, how much more so is it true of our relationship with the Trinity. And how much more does it call upon us to be joyful, loving witnesses of the holy mystery of the One in Three. This is the mystery to which we were called when we were chosen to be God's own, baptized with water in the name of the Holy Trinity.

#### TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

There are plenty of "treasures" in our tradition that if resurrected today would cause anxious moments for bishops! Many concern marriage. There was a time when the church "consecrated" both virgins dedicated to prayer and charity, and brides dedicated to husband and family. Virgins were blessed in the sanctuary of the church, and brides in the sanctuary of the home. The custom of blessing the bride in the marriage chamber was standard in England, Ireland, Spain, and France until the eleventh century.

If the groom (the groom's side planned the wedding) chose from the full menu of liturgy, there would be a blessing of the bridal room, solemn evening prayer on the eve and morning prayer on the day of the wedding, a blessing at the church door of the spouses, and then in the church for the wife alone during Mass, and Communion. After the feast, a priest would represent the bride's father in presiding over the legal process by which the bride transferred from her father's clan to her husband's. Some enduring customs hearken back to these days when marriage was seen as a contract between men (the bride's father and the groom) and was not so much about living out one's baptismal call, and certainly not about the equality of the spouses in Christ. Happily, this baptismal focus has been restored and unhelpful customs set aside by today's marriage rite.


#### **First Graders Making Rosaries**




#### SC Ecology Club Plants Flowers
