

NOTES FROM FATHER BOB...

FOURTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME 2015

In Jesus' day, as now, people gathered at the synagogue, the place of meeting and general assembly, to listen to the word of God that is read every day, but especially on the Sabbath. Often, someone in the congregation would be invited to speak on the sacred text, for the Spirit of God is in people, and many are gifted to speak the words that breathe life into people's hearts.

So on this day in Nazareth, Jesus is invited to speak, and his words cause wonder and amazement. How is he so wise? Where did he get all this? He never went to college. His people are just ordinary folk, yet here he is speaking words of wisdom. How is this possible? He belongs to a working family, not to the intellectual class. Something is not quite right here. And so, even though he amazes them with his genuine inspirations, he is not to be trusted, nor accepted. It cannot be.

Such is the terrible nature of prejudice. When our mind is made up about someone beforehand, before they even speak, not only do we block out their gifts and insights for enriching life, we also deprive ourselves of the true wealth and wisdom that only another can bring.

In every country throughout the world, in every society and culture, we will find the unacceptable ones, the ones who must never be allowed into our world, to share and enrich our world. They have nothing to offer in the eyes of the prejudiced person. In this way we perpetuate the hatreds, and we cause the next generation, our children, to grow up inheriting our inbred attitudes and narrow mindedness.

The only people who benefited from Jesus' day in his home town were the sick people. For sickness causes us to be rid of our sinfulness. It brings us home to ourselves and helps us to concentrate on the true values of life – namely, life itself, health of mind and body, the true humanity of every person, and so the gentle acceptance of people.

For these sick people the words of St. Paul today were so true. I will make my weaknesses my special boast for when I am weak then I am strong. The sick people of Nazareth were strong that day, in their ability to recognize the truth and goodness of Jesus, when the entire 'healthy' crowd fell to jeering him and casting him out. In this experience healthy people found out that prejudice had sickened them almost to the point of violence and murder. On the other hand the sick people, in their weakness, found a power truly to see and appreciate the prince of life. And they were cured.

At the end of his visit home Jesus is amazed at the lack of faith. For faith is not a hard or difficult thing. Nor is it magical or mysterious. Faith is the simple acceptance of people in their goodness and truthfulness as they appear before us. Goodness, love and truthfulness ask for simple acceptance. That is the beginning of having faith in someone. In the experience of accepting others, we will come to know them as reliable, and so we are able to commit ourselves to them. That is the fullness of personal faith.

The world needs such faith in order to live. Too often we operate out of caution, or distrust, and that makes life very difficult for us. Sometimes we operate out of prejudice. That makes life impossible. But a simple faith, in God and in each other – now -- that would make us truly wise. Let us not despise the prophets.

DOMESTIC VIOLENCE OUTREACH MINISTRY

What are the causes of domestic violence?

¹Domestic violence is learned, purposeful behavior and is a manifestation of the abuser's need to achieve and maintain power and control over the victim. Abusive behavior is learned and reinforced:

- Through observation
- Through experience
- In culture and in society
- In the family
- In communities, including schools and peer groups
- In faith, religious, and spiritual institutions
- Through our failure to hold batterers accountable for their actions.

²The single most influential factor of domestic violence in adulthood is domestic violence in the household in which the person was reared. Children who grow up in an environment where control is maintained through verbal threats and intimidation and conflicts escalate into physical violence, are more likely to resort to the same methods of abuse as adults.

³There are, however, a number of predictors that **may lead** to domestic violence.

- An **environment** where violence is either taught, by example, or accepted as "normal" will imprint upon a child's psyche.
- Domestic violence is often linked to **poor self-esteem**, isolation from social support, a manipulative nature, and a desire for power and control.
- **Drug and/or alcohol abuse** may be a precursor to domestic violence. Substance abuse leads to out-of-control behavior. The number one commonality within the dynamics of most alcoholic families is poor emotional health. Domestic violence is more frequent where individuals experience loss of physical health and/or wage-earning power.

DOMESTIC VIOLENCE IS NOT CAUSED BY:

- Illness
- Genetics or biology
- Alcohol and drugs
- Out-of-control behavior
- Anger
- Stress
- The victim's behavior or actions
- Problems in the relationship
- Children or pets
- Satan, demons, or evil influences

GOD'S WORD TODAY

Today's second reading gives us a remarkable example of what the life of faith is all about. Saint Paul tells the Corinthians that he was given a "thorn in the flesh." Scripture scholars have debated just what this "thorn" really was. Perhaps it is best that we do not know exactly, for each of us has our own "thorn in the flesh." It may be chronic illness, a fractured relationship, deep disappointment, unemployment, or any number of things. It is Paul's attitude that we are called to emulate. When we are tempted to groan or complain about our own "thorns in the flesh," let us remember that it is in weakness that we are made strong. This is a central paradox of the Christian life, one that is difficult to live. May Saint Paul intercede on our behalf so that we will be strengthened in faith, even in our weakness.



God asks each of us to do some special work for Him. He gives us the resources we need to do His work. However, do we listen to God when He calls? Do we get up on our feet and give our talent to do the work He asks of us? Remember, God doesn't call the equipped, he equips the called.
