

#### NOTHES FROM FATHER BOB...

#### NINETEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME 2015

A young man in the seminary was struggling with the question of his vocation. He was now in the fourth year of his studies and had some experiences working in a parish and in a local prison. A moderately extrovert kind of person, he also enjoyed a lot of success in his work with young people. His fellow students found him to be very approachable and held him in high esteem. But his success was at the core of his inner struggle. Surely, all this good work that now engaged his energies could be done without his being a priest? Lots of good people were doing similar things and with great results. Over the space of two hours one morning he shared his thoughts with his confessor, an elderly priest of great experience. To the student's dismay the priest said very little in response to his pained outpouring, but presented him with a small block of wood with an inscription on it. The inscription read as follows: 'In everything you do, put God first'. The young man embraced this simple message as his personal motto. With his heart and faith focused on God, his life was transformed. He grew as a follower of Jesus.

Faith is God's gift to us. It is not a human achievement. The gospel teaches strongly that it is the Father who draws us to Jesus. In other words the Father enables us to receive Jesus as he really is, namely, the Word made flesh. Today Jesus explains a passage of the Old Testament in relation to himself. This passage is a statement of faith by the People of God about their special relationship with him. They have a sense of their uniqueness as being specially chosen by God out of all the nations on earth. The sacred writings in the Law and the Prophets have convinced them that indeed this is the case. The written words of the Hebrew Bible remain as a permanent proof and reminder that their faith in the one true God is well founded. They are a thankful people, fully aware that they have done nothing to deserve their glorious calling. They know the Scriptures, which teach that a time will come when God will go beyond the written word and will write his Law deep within their heart. God will personally teach each one of them. But John's Gospel claims that this belief is now fully realized in the person of Jesus of Nazareth. Who is willing to accept it? They know him too well. He is a local man whom many may have known from childhood. In spite of the miracle of the loaves which they have witnessed, his claims about himself strain the boundaries of their belief. Yet Jesus persists in his teaching that he has been sent by God in fulfillment of the promise. From now on all encounters with God are intended to be deeply personal experiences of Jesus. Here Jesus invites his hearers to be open to God's movement in their hearts. The Father's gift to them is to believe in Jesus and have eternal life.

Our faith in Jesus is a way of life which includes and affects everything we say, think, and do. Nothing can be excluded. This is why faith can sometimes challenge us deeply. It is quite common to find Christians who live two lives, namely, one for Sunday worship and another for weekdays when life is lived independently of God. But we need to have a single mind about our faith relationship with the Lord.

A personal faith that is centered on Jesus is a truly joyful experience that sets us free. We become teachable and able to hear and receive his word. These are the hallmarks of being a true disciple. His word gives us the wisdom to distinguish what is of true and lasting value from the trivial and passing. It is good sometimes to have a fellow traveler on the way of faith. Whether we see our companion as a confessor or soul-friend the purpose remains the same. This person will allow us the freedom to share our faith, to talk about our experiences as we seek to follow in the footsteps of Jesus. As we share we grow and mature in our relationship with Jesus to whom the Father has drawn us. At the same time we grow in love for our sisters and brothers in the community of the Church to which Jesus has drawn us for fellowship and life.

CATECHIST: The classroom teacher who actively shares their faith and love of Jesus with the children. You do not need previous experience – we provide training, all materials and resources, even written lesson plans! Catechists receive a \$100 tuition credit or stipend at the end of the year. We currently have openings in Grades 1-6 on Sunday mornings and Monday evenings, as well as openings in our Early Childhood Religious Education classes. Co-teaching or Partner teaching is also an option here!

AIDE: The classroom helper who assists the Catechist and students in the classroom as needed. You do not need previous experience – just a desire to help and share your faith with the kids! Aides receive a \$50 tuition credit or stipend at the end of the year. We currently have openings in Grades 1-5 on Sunday mornings or Monday evenings, as well as openings in our Early Childhood Religious Education classes.

OFFICE HELPER: A new volunteer opportunity! This volunteer will assist us in the office during regularly scheduled RE class times. This person will answer phones, monitor children arriving late/leaving early, assist in maintaining a safe environment for our students in the building, and assist with attendance. Office Helpers will receive a \$100 tuition credit or stipend at the end of the year. We currently have openings on Sunday mornings or Monday evenings.

**SUBSTITUTE CATECHIST:** Occasionally, a Catechist may be absent or need to miss a class. We need people who are willing to serve in this capacity. Volunteers can stipulate a preference for subbing on Sunday morning or Monday evening.

Attendance at a Protecting God's Children session is required of all volunteers 18+ who work with children. This is mandated by the Archdiocese of Chicago. Trainings will take place here at St. Cletus at the end of the summer.

#### FOOD PANTRY UPDATE: STILL TIME TO DONATE!


- Most needed items include cereal, juice, paper goods, personal care items, laundry detergent, and diapers, especially size 5-6. All current date non-perishables are appreciated!

#### A STATEMENT OF THE U.S. CATHOLIC BISHOPS

#### AN OVERVIEW OF DOMESTIC VIOLENCE

- Domestic Violence is any kind of behavior that a person uses to control a partner through fear and intimidation.
- It includes physical, sexual, psychological, verbal and economic abuse.
- Examples include battering, name calling and insults, threats to kill or harm one's partner or children, marital rape, or forced abortion.

#### WHY MEN BATTER

- Men who abuse generally share some common characteristics.
- ♦ They tend to be jealous, possessive and easily angered.
- ♦ They hold a view of women as inferior.
- ♦ Many believe that men are meant to dominate and control women.
- Many try to isolate their partners by limiting their contact with family and friends.
- ♦ Alcohol and Drugs are often associated with domestic violence, but they do not cause it.
- ♦ Men who batter learn to abuse through observation, experience, and reinforcement. They believe that they have a right to use violence. Their behavior gives them power and control over their partner.
- ♦ Typically, abusive men deny that the abuse is happening, or they minimize it. They often blame their abusive behavior on someone or something other than themselves. They tell their partner, "You made me do this."

#### WHY WOMEN STAY

- ♦ Fear: Fear for themselves, fear for their children, fear that they cannot support themselves.
- Disbelief: Women often are incredulous when a violent act first occurs. She many believe her abuser when he apologizes and promises that it will not happen again. When the abuse happens again many women believe that if they just act differently they can stop the abuse.
- ♦ **Shame:** Women may be ashamed to admit that the man they love is terrorizing them. Some cannot admit or realize that they are battered women.

**REMEMBER:** Some battered women run a risk of facing more violence when they leave their abuser or seek help from the legal system. It is important to be honest with women about the risks involved. If a woman decides to leave, she needs to have a safety plan, including the names and phone numbers of shelters and programs. Some victims may choose to stay at this time because it seems safer. Ultimately, abused women must make their own decisions about staying or leaving.

PRAYER FOR THOSE AFFECTED BY DOMESTIC VIOLENCE: God of peace, there are many places and many people who do not experience Your peace. Right now there are many women and children who live under the dark weight of the fear of violence right in their own homes. We pray for Your protection, and for wisdom for friends and officials to help bring the right protection to them. We pray for the many men who themselves feel powerless and confused about their relationships. We ask that You help them find healthy ways to work out their frustrations and to find hope without resorting to destructive impulses. God, we ask for your perfect peace. Amen.




