### NOTES FROM FATHER BOB...

#### TWENTY-FIRST SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME 2015

Today's readings present us with choices. Joshua offers the people of Israel a clear choice. They have conquered the land God promised them and now stand on an important threshold. Joshua realizes that this is a time for decision, and that the decision they make now will affect their whole future. The people look to the past and choose the lord as their God – not out of any sense of mere traditionalism or conservatism, but because God has proved himself to be faithful, their redeemer, their liberator and protector. They make a decision to face the future based on their past experience of God's goodness.

Jesus also gives his disciples a choice: "Do you want to go away too?" Peter gives an answer based on experience. The disciples have spent time with the Lord, listened to his words, seen him perform miracles, watched how he dealt compassionately with people. They have come to know him – to know that he is the "Holy One of God", to know that he brings hope and healing into people's lives – that he has the message of eternal life. They have come to have faith in him: "we believe". Their faith is not certainty: Jesus knows that, like those who walked away, the disciples who stayed would have doubts, questions, many things they simply did not understand. That is why he asks if they too will leave. But although they do have questions, his disciples make a decision based on experience, based on their experience of the Lord. It is a gamble – they had no guarantees about how their lives would turn out or what hardships they would have to endure if they remained with Christ.

Why were so many of Jesus' disciples put off, so that they couldn't make that decision to remain his disciples? They too had heard and observed Jesus. But they chose what they already had rather than take the risk of following him. They opted for safety and security, rather than being open to the message of Jesus.

Choosing whether or not to follow the Lord is a choice we all have to make each day, as the changing circumstances of our life requires us to decide whether to risk trying to live by his teaching or to walk away and remain safe in our old securities. The doctrine which provoked people to leave Jesus was his teaching that we should eat his body and drink his blood, if we are to have life within us. The presence (body and blood) of Jesus is not confined to the Eucharist.

Christ also promised that he would be found among the poor, the weak, the sick and imprisoned, the lonely and the hungry – among the people who make us feel uncomfortable or who make implicit or explicit demands on our time, our concern, our money, our friendship.

Do we recognize Christ's presence – his life-giving body and blood – among these people, or do we prefer to remain safe and comfortable by closing our eyes and ears to the needs and demands of the poor? Liberation theologians tell us that disciples of Christ who do not feel called to fight against injustice and oppression are Judases, refusing to follow Jesus. Their conduct is a denial of Jesus and a betrayal of his message of life. It is easy for us to stay with what we have, to walk away from any risk. The challenge of real faith is to follow the Lord and to seek his presence in the needy faces of our neighbor. That is a choice which will lead to the greatest prize of all for us: ETERNAL LIFE.

We currently offer classes for children in Grades 1-8, as well as for children in Preschool (3 yrs) – Kindergarten. This year we are also beginning a *Special Needs* program for children in Grades 1-8.

Please keep in mind that Sacramental Preparation is a two-year process. This applies to the Sacraments of Reconciliation and Eucharist (1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> Grades) as well as Confirmation (7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> Grades).

We offer classes on Sunday mornings (9:15-10:45) and Monday evenings (6-7:30) for children in Grades 1-6. Early childhood classes meet on Sundays from 9:30-10:30 a.m.

Grades 7-8 meet on Sunday mornings from 9:15-10:45.

If you are new to our program, please bring a copy of your child's baptismal certificate. Please contact the RE Office at (708) 352-2383 with any questions you may have. Don't delay – register today!



#### FOOD PANTRY UPDATE

As we approach the fall and winter months, the number of families needing our food assistance increases for many reasons. Among them are higher energy bills, back to school costs, and seasonal jobs coming to an end, leaving less income for food. We are extremely grateful that your support makes this community outreach possible, even as your own families experience the need to "tighten your belts". Be assured that the monthly supplemental food assistance we provide is greatly needed and appreciated. THANK YOU!







- As you can see, our shelves have many empty spots as our volunteers continue to pack bags for our next monthly distribution. Most needed items include cereal, dry pinto beans, rice, canned meat, meals in a can, crackers, powdered/canned milk, pasta, jelly, soup, boxed sides, canned fruit and canned vegetables.

#### **DOMESTIC VIOLENCE OUTREACH MINISTRY** There Is Help!<sup>1</sup>: A Statement of the U.S. Catholic Bishops

#### HELP FOR ABUSED WOMEN

- Begin to believe that you are not alone and that help is available for you and your children.
- Talk in confidence to someone you trust: a relative, friend, parish priest, deacon, religious sister or brother, or lay minister
- If you choose to stay in the situation, at least for now, set up a plan of action to ensure your safety. This includes hiding a car key, personal documents, and some money in a safe place and locating somewhere to go in an emergency.
- Find out about resources in your area that offer help to battered women and their children. The phone book lists numbers to call in your local area. Your diocesan Catholic Charities office or family life office can help. Catholic Charities often has qualified counselors on staff and can provide emergency assistance and other kinds of help. (See the box at the end of article for the Pillars 24 hour Domestic Violence Hotline.)
- The National Domestic Violence Hotline provides crisis intervention and referrals to local service providers. Call 800-799-SAFE (7233) or 800-787-3224 (TTY). E-mail assistance is available at **ndvh@ndvh.org**.

#### **HELP FOR MEN WHO ABUSE**

- Admit that the abuse is your problem, not your partner's, and have the manly courage to seek help. Begin to believe that you can change your behavior if you choose to do so.
- Be willing to reach out for help. Talk to someone you trust who can help you evaluate the situation. Contact Catholic Charities or other church or community agencies for the name of a program for abusers.
- Keep in mind that the Church is available to help you. Part of the mission Jesus entrusted to us is to offer healing when it is needed.
- Find alternative ways to act when you become frustrated or angry. Talk to other men who have overcome abusive behavior. Find out what they did and how they did it.

#### WHEN I CALL FOR HELP: A PRAYER

One source of healing we have in our lives as Christians is prayer. Psalm 55 (Ps 55:2-3, 13-15, 17-18) may be an especially apt prayer for women who are dealing with abusive situations. We pray:

Listen, God, to my prayer: do not hide from my pleading; hear me and give answer.

If an enemy had reviled me, that I could bear;
If my foe had viewed me with contempt, from that I could hide.
But it was you, my other self, my comrade and friend,
You, whose company I enjoyed, at whose side I walked
in procession in the house of God.

But I will call upon God, and the Lord will save me. At dusk, dawn, and noon I will grieve and complain, and my prayer will be heard.

CHOIR SEASON IS ABOUT TO BEGIN...IS THIS THE YEAR THAT YOU WILL JOIN US?

The St. Cletus Music Ministry is a vibrant place filled with wonderful people who desire to share their love for singing and music by putting it to use in service to their church. We welcome singers - from the professionally trained to those who simply enjoy singing along to ising this word. The trained to those who simply enjoy singing along - to join us this year! The opportunities to join are detailed below and all choirs begin their seasons the week of September 21st.

The Chancel Choir is our "traditional" adult choir who lead the congregation in song at the 9:30 a.m. Sunday liturgy. This group of nearly 40 men and women work together each week to sing as an ensemble and foster musical relationships as well as friendships. The Contemporary Ensemble leads song at the 5:00 pm Saturday liturgy approximately twice per month. 
