

### Notes from Fr. Bob...

#### TWENTY-NINTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Jesus has made his third and most detailed prophecy of his Passion. The Son of Man is going to be handed over to the chief priests and the scribes, and eventually he will be condemned to death. We might have thought that by this time the Twelve would be beginning at least to understand if not accept this message. Not a bit of it: James and John approach Jesus and want a special favor. They want positions of power. But the only thing Jesus can offer them is a share in his sufferings, to drink from the cup he will drink from and be baptized in his baptism of suffering. To any other fantasy they may have Jesus responds with stern negatives. To their initial request he replies that they do NOT know what they are asking. Again, to grant the positions they request is NOT within his power. Then, turning to the rest of the Twelve, who are muttering at the brothers' audacity, Jesus insists that the ways of the pagans, which is lording it over others, must NOT happen among them. It is not the way of the true disciples. Rather their aim must be to be of service to others, just as Jesus himself has come to be of service and even give up his life to bring about others' redemption. John and James claim to be able to follow in the footsteps of Jesus, but the events of his Passion, when "all his disciples deserted him and ran away", show that their eyes are still blinded to reality. Later, of course, the disciples will follow the road Jesus has shown them, but it will be a long learning curve for them.

If we are honest, this severe central tenet of Christ's teaching proves a long learning curve for us as well. We live in a world that loves comfort and praises the attainment of material wealth, fame and security. There are still rewards for public service, and latest figures show a remarkable percentage of people claiming to spend regular time in voluntary work in order to help their neighbor and the community in some way. But these latter people are not the ones the media constantly hold before our eyes for admiration and envy. Perhaps their lives are too unexciting and insufficiently lurid. But if we are to follow Jesus along the road to Jerusalem, then our eyes need to be focused on what we can do in service rather than on what is going to make us richer or more highly regarded. Here too there may be the temptation to wish to be seen doing good rather than a genuine concern with doing it. To keep us on the right track we always need the moment of honest reflection when we monitor whether what we are doing really helps those we are aiming to serve or whether our activities are aimed at earning us brownie points on some divine scale of our own devising. We too can be Sons of Zebedee, promising everything but really only for ulterior motives. The desire to sit on the right hand of the master dies hard, but the mixture of the stern negatives from Jesus and his constant support for the

true way forward can remove even the greatest



October 2015 Dear Parishioners,

Our parish family has truly been blessed during this past fiscal year. Thank you for all your contributions of time, talent, and treasure to your parish community. Your generosity allows us to be faithful to our parish mission and the message of the Gospel, as we bring the Good News to all within our community.

We welcomed 37 new families to our parish community, totaling 2,667 registered families. Our school continues to strive for academic excellence and received The National Blue Ribbon Award. Enrollment remains strong at 409 students in full day preschool through eighth grade. Our Religious Education Program is increasing in enrollment and formed 376 young people in the faith in pre-school through eighth grade. Within our parish community, we baptized 92 new young Catholics during the year. The Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist was received by 123 young people for the first time. Our Confirmation Program provided formation for 77 eighth grade students. Six adults received sacraments through the R.C.I.A program. While many other adults joined the various adult faith formation programs offered through CREDO. Thirty couples received the Sacrament of Marriage. We celebrated the Rite of Christian Burial for 64 members of



the community as they enter their eternal reward. Communion visits to the homebound and Holy Anointing of the Sick visits were made to hospitals and homes. Our Youth Ministry program, Compassionate Care, Holy Name Society, Social Concerns outreach services, Parish Pastoral Council and a variety of other ministries continue to grow. All of this has been made possible because of your extremely generous support of the mission of our parish.

Great news, Parish to break ground in Spring of 2016! Our capital campaign, Living our Faith, Building our Future is an extraordinary effort to raise funds needed for the expansion of Saint Cletus and for the construction of a new multi-purpose Parish Center. Since the start of the campaign, pledges of approximately \$3,000,000 have been received and \$2,456,000 has already been collected. We still need your help. We have reached this level of success with generous pledged amounts fulfilled with one-time, weekly, monthly, quarterly and annual donations. I sincerely want to thank everyone for all donations regardless of the amount. Also, let us remember our founding parishioners, those who have come before us and those here today. Their sacrifices and dedication over the past 64 years have provided us our present day facilities. I want to thank you for your sacrifice and dedication you have made to the future of our parish and hope this effort will match that of our brothers and sisters from the past. 





### Sources and Uses of Parish Operating Funds






### Sources and Uses of School Operating Funds

# Stewardship of Treasure

### **Summary of the Parish Financial Report**

- The parish finished the June 30, 2015 fiscal year with an operating income (the shaded line of the Statement of Revenue and Expense) of \$163,415.
- The parish's Sunday, Christmas and Easter collections for the year ended June 30, 2015 increased by a total of \$20,563 from the prior year ended June 30, 2014.
- Combined parish and school salaries and benefits decreased by \$48,795 in 2015.
- Ordinary maintenance and repairs for the church, school and rectory decreased by \$65,000 in 2015 due primarily to reduced heating and snow removal costs and continued benefits of a refurbished school boiler.
- Increased parish and school family participation led to \$202,235 in school fundraising revenue in 2015.
- The first annual Fall Fest/Carnival was a huge success netting a profit of over \$87,000 which was allocated between the school and the Building Campaign Fund for the new parish center.
- During 2015, the school distributed \$25,000 from the school endowment fund for tuition assistance.
- The required parish support to the school in 2015 was \$203,148 a decrease of \$45,138 from 2014.
- Building Campaign Fund revenue received during 2015 was \$493,140. Because building fund activity is not part of the parish's normal operations, it is not considered in determining the parish's operating income, but rather considered Other Revenue.
- During the year ended June 30, 2015, the parish's investment accounts produced net unrealized gains of \$12,309. Because investment gains are not part of the parish's normal operations, they are not considered in determining the parish's operating income but rather considered Other Revenue.
- In 2015, generous parishioners' left bequests of \$96,753 to the parish.
- An \$805,540 donation was received representing a bequest that a generous parishioner left to the school endowment. During the fiscal year ending June 30, 2015 the donation funded school building capital improvements amounting to \$276,925, which included major projects such as new windows, doors, a/c units, and classroom renovations.






