



Notes from Fr. Bob...

THIRTIETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

During the gospel readings of the last few weeks we have seen the disciples of Jesus failing to understand the true nature of discipleship. There was the young man who could not let go of his possessions, then the apostles' failure to understand Jesus' third prophecy of his Passion, and finally the sons of Zebedee eager to claim positions of power at Jesus' right hand. At the end of this catalogue of misunderstandings, Mark gives us an outstanding example of true discipleship. It is Bartimaeus, the blind beggar. Bartimaeus recognizes Jesus for who he is, the Son of David, and despite the crowd's attempt to put him off, he shouts out to him for mercy. Jesus stops and calls him to come forward. Bartimaeus throws off his beggar's cloak, his means of livelihood, the only thing he has in the world, and jumps up to go to Jesus. Jesus asks him the same question he has just asked James and John: "What do you want me to do for you?" The sons of Zebedee had asked him for positions of power. Bartimaeus asks for the restoration of his sight. The true disciple asks to see clearly and knows that he needs the power of the master to be able to do this. Jesus acknowledges this plea as the sign of his faith, the faith he has been preaching as the essential prerequisite for healing and insight into the truth. With his sight restored Bartimaeus completes the pattern of discipleship. He follows Jesus along the road to Jerusalem. In other words, he takes up the way of life revealed by Jesus which will lead him to suffering and death. The chapter ends, and in the very first line of the next chapter Jesus begins his approach to Jerusalem.

One of the heresies the Church has always resisted is that of Gnosticism, the claim that closeness to Christ depends on being a member of an elite group with special knowledge. The first step in discipleship is that of not knowing, the simplicity expressed by Bartimaeus, the blind beggar, or the homelessness of the wanderer. True disciples lay no claim to being special. But something special happens to them through their encounter with Jesus. The next step is that we place ourselves under his healing power. Sometimes, like Bartimaeus, we have to fling off even the little we have, our cloaks, our means of livelihood, what offers us fame and fortune in the world. But in the act of healing the great gift we receive is that of freedom. We are no longer bound by the burden of such worldly expectations. Rather we are freed to follow Jesus in his dance along the road, a road of constant challenges. The question Jesus continues to ask on the journey is the one he put to Bartimaeus: "What do you want me to do

clearly.

Flu season is already upon us. We ask that all of us take extra precautions to help prevent the spread of colds and flu viruses during this time of the year. The Health Department reminds us of the need to wash our hands as frequently as possible to prevent the spreading of germs. If we know we might have the flu, we should first go see the doctor then stay home and take care of ourselves while getting much needed rest and drinking plenty of fluids.

The sign of Peace at Mass is an important part of our expression of unity and oneness with Christ. Please remember that proper Church Rubrics do NOT REQUIRE the shaking of hands. Any appropriate gesture of offering Christ's peace to one another is acceptable, such as a hand gesture of acknowledgement, a word offered in peace, or a nod of the head. If you have concerns about receiving from the sacred cup just refrain from taking from the cup. If you normally receive the Body of Christ on the tongue you may want to consider receiving in the hand during this flu season.



The money we collect will be given to Women's Care Center of LaGrange [47 South 6th Ave, Suite 1, LaGrange 60525, (708) 352-5000, e-mail womenscarecenter@core.com]. This center is available to help women and families in our neighborhood. It is dedicated to serving the community with care and compassion—reaching clients with heart-to-heart counseling, free pregnancy tests and ultrasound referrals, fertility awareness and abstinence education plus material assistance and medical and housing referrals. This allows parents in our area who are struggling, to better be able to accept their baby as a gift, rather than a burden.

If you are blessed with abundance, some of the costs that you could help the center pay are: \$10.00 for a clinic quality pregnancy test; \$25.00 for a large package of diapers; \$35.00 for a supply of baby formula; \$50.00 for a baby layette for a newborn; \$70.00 for an ultrasound; \$100.00 to offset some of the cost of the Google ad campaign that we use to reach women who need help. If you cannot give much, give what you can!

If you never got a bottle, any donation is welcome—even without the bottle. Please make checks payable to *Women's Care Center of La Grange*. If you forget your bottle next weekend, you may bring it to the rectory. The more money we collect, the more mothers and families we can help.

The LaGrange Center has been endorsed by and is a Preferred provider of the Archdiocese of Chicago. The center receives no governmental assistance nor are they supported with church money. Literally, you give them the money they need to operate and help these women and their families.



Your generosity allows us to be faithful to our parish mission and the message of the Gospel, as we bring the Good News to all within our community.

We welcomed 37 new families to our parish community, totaling 2,667 registered families. Our school continues to strive for academic excellence and received The National Blue Ribbon Award. Enrollment remains strong at 409 students in full day preschool through eighth grade. Our Religious Education Program is increasing in enrollment and formed 376 young people in the faith in pre-school through eighth grade. Within our parish community, we baptized 92 new young Catholics during the year. The Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist was received by 123 young people for the first time. Our Confirmation Program provided formation for 77 eighth grade students. Six adults received sacraments through the R.C.I.A program. While many other adults joined the various adult faith formation programs offered through CREDO. Thirty couples received the Sacrament of Marriage. We celebrated the Rite of Christian Burial for 64 members of



the community as they enter their eternal reward. Communion visits to the homebound and Holy Anointing of the Sick visits were made to hospitals and homes. Our Youth Ministry program, Compassionate Care, Holy Name Society, Social Concerns outreach services, Parish Pastoral Council and a variety of other ministries continue to grow. All of this has been made possible because of your extremely generous support of the mission of our parish.

Great news, Parish to break ground in Spring of 2016! Our capital campaign, Living our Faith, Building our Future is an extraordinary effort to raise funds needed for the expansion of Saint Cletus and for the construction of a new multi-purpose Parish Center. Since the start of the campaign, pledges of approximately \$3,000,000 have been received and \$2,456,000 has already been collected. We still need your help. We have reached this level of success with generous pledged amounts fulfilled with one-time, weekly, monthly, quarterly and annual donations. I sincerely want to thank everyone for all donations regardless of the amount. Also, let us remember our founding parishioners, those who have come before us and those here today. Their sacrifices and dedication over the past 64 years have provided us our present day facilities. I want to thank you for your sacrifice and dedication you have made to the future of our parish and hope this effort will match that of our brothers and sisters from the past. This extraordinary effort calls for extraordinary commitment!

As you continue to read the Stewardship Report, you will find the balance sheets and statements of revenue and expenses for this past year. You should be proud of all you have been able to accomplish to spread the Good News of the Gospel within this vibrant faith community.

I would like to thank all the members of our parish finance committee for their dedication and commitment to the sound financial health of our parish. The current members of this important advisory committee are: Marie Usher (Chairperson), Don McMahon, Dave Sipek, Doug Rausch, Lauren Geist and John Adolf. I would also like to thank our previous members, Dave Smith (Chairman), Anne Babirak, Mike Magee, Roman Szabelski and Carol Walters for their years of service.

I would also like to lovingly invite all those who have drifted away, to come to church, find healing, answers, and support... experience Christ and stay.






Sources and Uses of Parish Operating Funds






Sources and Uses of School Operating Funds

Summary of the Parish Financial Report

- The parish finished the June 30, 2015 fiscal year with an operating income (the shaded line of the Statement of Revenue and Expense) of \$163,415.
- The parish's Sunday, Christmas and Easter collections for the year ended June 30, 2015 increased by a total of \$20,563 from the prior year ended June 30, 2014.
- Combined parish and school salaries and benefits decreased by \$48,795 in 2015.
- Ordinary maintenance and repairs for the church, school and rectory decreased by \$65,000 in 2015 due primarily to reduced heating and snow removal costs and continued benefits of a refurbished school boiler.
- Increased parish and school family participation led to \$202,235 in school fundraising revenue in 2015.
- The first annual Fall Fest/Carnival was a huge success netting a profit of over \$87,000 which was allocated between the school and the Building Campaign Fund for the new parish center.
- During 2015, the school distributed \$25,000 from the school endowment fund for tuition assistance.
- The required parish support to the school in 2015 was \$203,148 a decrease of \$45,138 from 2014.
- Building Campaign Fund revenue received during 2015 was \$493,140. Because building fund activity is not part of the parish's normal operations, it is not considered in determining the parish's operating income, but rather considered Other Revenue.
- During the year ended June 30, 2015, the parish's investment accounts produced net unrealized gains of \$12,309. Because investment gains are not part of the parish's normal operations, they are not considered in determining the parish's operating income but rather considered Other Revenue.
- In 2015, generous parishioners' left bequests of \$96,753 to the parish.
- An \$805,540 donation was received representing a bequest that a generous parishioner left to the school endowment. During the fiscal year ending June 30, 2015 the donation funded school building capital improvements amounting to \$276,925, which included major projects such as new windows, doors, a/c units, and classroom renovations.






