Notes from Fr. Bob...

23RD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME


Matthew's gospel gives very practical sound advice for dealing with conflict and division. Jesus teaches the danger of failure to address wrongdoing and the way in which the spiral of violence can develop. The spirit of the peacemaker has been praised in the Beatitudes in Jesus' Sermon on the Mount. Like any group of people, the Church will have to deal with conflict and division between members. The Christian community now has to live out the practical details of the meaning of the Sermon and the commandment of love of neighbor. Only in heaven will we be freed from such tasks. The process of reconciliation is developed. Honesty and respect call for naming the wrongdoing between the persons involved. If conflict can be resolved in the early stages, it can be contained and does not grow. Realistically it may be impossible for the two parties to meet and resolve their difficulty. It may not be safe to meet. Emotions are high and tensions are deep. The meeting may need to be facilitated by a mediator. If the person refuses to listen, then those in authority in the community must decide what is to be done.

One of the important features of this process is the need for listening to the case of each party. Conflict and division usually results from an inability to see the other's point of view or recognize the depth of the feelings of hurt and anger, which are involved. A process of listening can begin to name the feelings and the perceived injustice as well as begin to clarify the facts and the situation and foster understanding between the parties. Listening is the primary starting point of the process of reconciliation.

Finally the gospel speaks of the need for prayer about peacemaking. Perhaps the first prayer is a desire to be reconciled. If this desire is missing because of hurt, perhaps it is a prayer to pray for the desire to be reconciled.

Conflict and division is part of the human condition. For Christians, the gospel teaches that one is not to be limited or satisfied by the situation. Maybe there are questions I need to ask? What are the areas of division in my life? Which are the areas that need reconciliation? Who are the people with whom I have tensions?

In the celebration of the Eucharist, we recognize that God has reconciled the world to himself and given us the ministry of reconciliation. In the Eucharistic prayer we thank God for this gift and pray for the transformation of the community through receiving the body and blood of Christ. We name our division in the penitential rite. We commit ourselves to be bridge-builders and peacemakers when we leave the church. In joy we celebrate the hope



that
God promises,
pray deeply for peace in
our world and ask God's blessing on those
who are peacemakers.

STATEMENT OF CARDINAL CUPICH ON THE RESCISSION OF DACA SEPTEMBER 5, 2017

Today President Trump ended the Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) program and the dreams of nearly a million young people covered by the executive order and applying for inclusion. In the past the president stated that the Dreamer story "is about the heart," yet today's decision is nothing short of heartless. The Dreamers are now left in a 6 month limbo, during which Congress is supposed to pass comprehensive immigration reform, a feat they have been unable to achieve for a decade. In fact, this inability to agree on a just immigration system led President Obama to sign the executive order protecting minor children brought to this country by their parents. As the considerations of the "heart" seemed to be insufficient to keep protection in place, Congress must now act decisively and swiftly. An immediate first step is for our leaders to pass legislation that will protect those previously covered by the DACA program, while they deal with the long-overdue comprehensive reform of our immigration system. They must be guided by compassion and respect for human dignity, and honestly consider the substantial evidence that deporting these young Americans would do great economic harm to the states where they reside. With the bishops in this country, we remain committed to upholding the dignity of all persons and the fundamental right of all to live free from fear in the nation founded on that promise.

GOD'S WATCHERS

In the ancient world watchmen were extremely important people. They kept communities safe, and were there to alert them to any impending danger or attack. Before locks, alarms, and security systems, watchmen were the protectors, the safety measure. So when the Lord charges Ezekiel as a watchman today, it is a weighty charge. So weighty, we learn, that if Ezekiel fails to sound the alarm for those around him and they perish in a state of wickedness, Ezekiel will be held responsible! This profound connection between God's will on earth and in heaven is repeated in today's Gospel, where Jesus instructs us that we are to be the security force, the watchers placed on alert that nowhere in the Body of Christ, the church, will there be any two members of the one Body who are not reconciled. Scripture tells us that Jesus reconciled all things in heaven and on earth through the blood of his cross. But we are given the mission to continue that reconciliation on earth as in heaven through our ceaseless efforts to be, as Paul would write, ambassadors of reconciliation. Let us not get too comfortable thinking that we are responsible only for keeping our own lives from the path of wickedness and disagreement. We are also held accountable for the lives of the members of Christ's body around us.

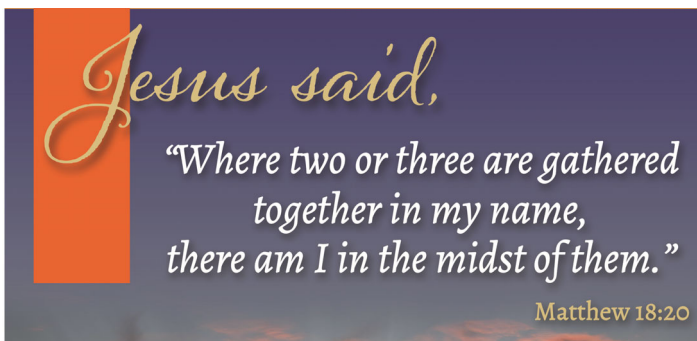

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

On Good Friday, at the heart of the Triduum, the commemoration of the Lord's Passion is colored by sobriety and decorum, but this Thursday the mystery comes in a luminous celebration of Christ's victory. In its deepest origins, the Exaltation of the Holy Cross is the feast of a dedication of a church, since in the year 335 the Church of the Holy Sepulchre was dedicated on September 13, and on the following day the "true cross" discovered by St. Helena was brought outside to the faithful for veneration. It is a great feast of the Eastern Church, which often marks it by having the whole assembly prostrate themselves on the floor honoring the life-giving cross.

At the core of the tradition is the quest of Helena, mother of the Emperor Constantine, to acquire the cross and the nails of the Crucifixion from the ruins of Jerusalem. When she was satisfied that she had found them, thanks to the healing of a sick man whose body was placed on the cross, she had her son fund the building of the great basilica. The history of the relic is complicated, especially because it was carried off by invading Persians in the year 614 and "went missing" for fifteen years. Thursday's feast does not celebrate the relic, but rather the life-giving cross from which salvation flows. It's a good day to look around your house or office: Don't those walls look bare without a cross? What better day to remedy that?

CHURCH LEAGUE COACHES NEEDED:



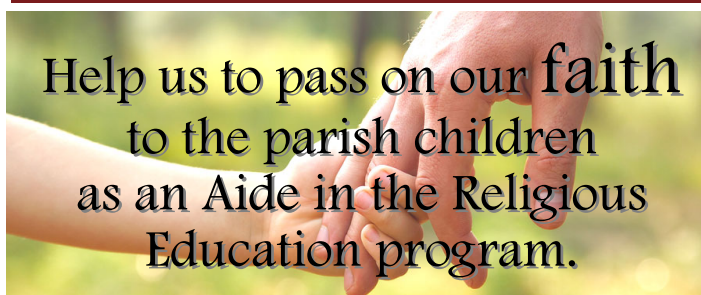

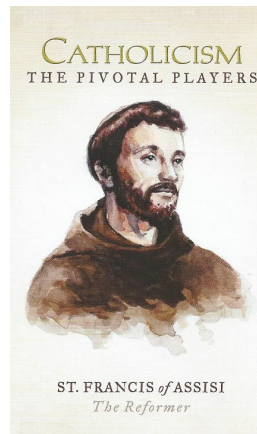

COME SING WITH US!

The St. Cletus Music Ministry is so blessed to offer so many opportunities to those who enjoy using their God-given musical talents! We invite you to join one of our choirs; no previous experience or music-reading skill required – only a desire to sing praise to the Lord!

Our Chancel Choir sings regularly at the 9:30 a.m. mass; rehearsals are from 7:30 p.m. to 9:15 p.m. each Thursday. This group focuses more on traditional hymns and classic choral pieces; our first rehearsal will be Thursday, September 14th.

Our Contemporary Choir sings approximately two times per month at the Saturday, 5:00 p.m. mass; rehearsals are held immediately prior to the mass at 4:00 p.m. with occasional additional rehearsals as needed. This group, with singers, drums and flute, focuses on a more contemporary sound. First Mass/rehearsal will be on Saturday, September 16th.

Our Teen Choir sings approximately twice per month at the Saturday, 5:00 p.m. mass with an occasional appearance at the 11:00 a.m. mass on Sunday morning. Rehearsals are at 4:00 p.m. on Saturday; a schedule with additional rehearsal times will be published shortly. High school students will enjoy singing more contemporary music; additional instrumentalists would also be welcomed. First mass will be Saturday, September 23rd.

Our Youth Choirs....are open to all boys and girls, grades 3rd through 8th, attending either a public school or St. Cletus School. These choirs generally sing at the Sunday, 11:00 a.m. mass approximately one-two times per month and also participate with the other adult choirs in several special masses throughout the year. Parents are requested to schedule other

activities around choir rehearsals times/masses however registration/participation is open throughout the year to accommodate other seasonal teams. Registration forms for the two Youth Choirs will be distributed through St. Cletus School and Religious Education Ministry; registration forms and schedules will also be posted on the parish website. All registrations should be returned to the Rectory or School no later than Tuesday, September 12th.

Junior Choir is open to students in grades 5 through 8. Rehearsals are held on Monday, from 4:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. Our first rehearsal will be on Monday, September 18th; our first mass will be on Sunday, October 1st.

Children's Choir is open to students in grades 3 and 4. Rehearsals are held on Thursday, from 5:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. Our first rehearsal will be on Thursday, September 14th; our first mass will be on Sunday, October 1st.

Our Good Shepherd Choir is part of the St. Cletus Compassionate Care Ministry. This choir provides music for funerals, memorial services and the annual evening mass in November for those families, who have within the past year, experienced the loss of a loved one. This choir sings on an "as needed" basis, frequently on fairly short notice. Participants are asked to arrive 30 minutes prior to the mass; additional rehearsals (2-3 per year) are on an as needed basis. Funerals are typically scheduled for either 10:00 a.m. or 11:30 a.m., Monday through Saturday. Volunteers do NOT have to be available every day of the week.

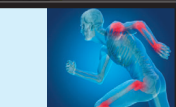
