## Notes from Fr. Bob...

#### **27<sup>TH</sup> SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME**

Imagine a world in which no one had faith in anything. What would it be like? Could such a world function? We seldom reflect on the fact that so much that happens in our lives depends upon our having faith in a whole host of institutions and individuals. If no one had faith in governments, in doctors, in air-line pilots, in spouses, in parents, in friends, in employers, in football teams, and so on, life would simply grind to a halt. Our lives would be characterized by cynicism, despair and anarchy. A world in which no one had faith in anything would be a hell on earth.


But suppose we narrow the question down a bit and ask: what would a world be like in which no one had religious faith? The answer to that question might seem more Would it really make all that much problematic. difference if no one had any religious faith? Life would still go on, surely? It's just that there'd be no churches, no mosques, no synagogues. But a moment's thought will make us realize that much more would be There would be no prayer, no worship, no religious ceremonies, no believing communities. There would be no holy books like the Bible, no holy people, no notion of holiness at all. There would be no appreciation of life as a journey, or a search, or a quest; no appreciation of life as a gift. These things are so much part of what we are that a world without religious faith would be a world we would hardly recognize as human.

Strangely we don't often think of faith like that. We think of it as a very private thing: something I have as an individual; something I must preserve; something going on inside me. We also tend to think of it as something a bit precarious, something we could lose if we're not too careful. And so we have a lot of sympathy with the apostles in today's gospel when they make that appeal to Jesus: "Increase our faith".

The Lord's reply seems very odd. We almost get the impression that he thinks faith can be tested by working unlikely wonders. But perhaps we can get a better idea of what Jesus is saying if we take the liberty of inserting one extra word into the first paragraph of the gospel. See what happens when we put in that additional word: "The apostles said to the Lord, 'Increase our faith.' The Lord laughed and replied, 'Were your faith the size of a mustard seed you could say to this mulberry tree, 'Be uprooted and planted in the sea,' and it would obey you."

If we put it like that we see immediately that Jesus is not making a profound pronouncement. Still less is he challenging his followers to pepper the sea with trees. He is using exaggeration to make a point and to make the apostles think.

What is the point? Surely that faith is not the kind of



As followers of Christ everything we do is informed by faith. Faith surrounds us; faith carries us; faith is our way of being. And we manifest our faith in simple and obvious ways: by coming together for Mass, by praying, by celebrating the sacraments, by reaching out to one another in gospel love. It might not seem very spectacular to us. It's certainly got nothing to do with performing amazing feats. But faith really does change the world. A world without religious faith would be an impoverished world, for it would be a world in which the deepest aspirations of the human heart could have no place.

# PARISH CAMPUS UNFORSEEN AND NOT BUDGETED MAINTENANCE AND REPAIR PROJECTS IN SEPTEMBER 2019

Dear St. Cletus Parish Families,

I will be speaking at all weekend liturgies on October 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> regarding the unforeseen and unbudgeted repairs totaling almost \$73,000 that needed to be completed during this past month. Please see below the specific items that needed immediate attention and their costs.

# EMERGENCY CHURCH PLUMBING REPAIRS and EMERCENGY SCHOOL STORM DRAIN REPAIRS:

Unique Plumbing provided multiple sewer repairs. There were drainage issues which were due to the failure of aging sewer systems. The completed work will be done by Oct. 3<sup>rd</sup>.

ESTIMATED TOTAL COST: \$51,500.00

#### **UNEXPECTED PARKING LOT REPAIRS:**

1) Much needed repair of deteriorated asphalt areas
Cost: \$8,742.44


2) Crack seal and seal coating of the entire parking lot of 85,790 square feet
Cost: \$10,092.43

3) Seal and striping of lot is normally scheduled every two years but due to the needed repairs of deteriorated asphalt we had to seal and restripe this year
Cost: \$2,531.32

**TOTAL COST:** \$21,366.19

We will be having a second collection on the weekends of Oct.  $5^{th}$  &  $6^{th}$  and Oct.  $12^{th}$  &  $13^{th}$ . Any help you can give the parish to offset these unexpected expenses would be greatly appreciated.




Church League basketball allows high school students to play competitive basketball against other area churches.

#### A LITTLE FAITH

Today our readings are about faith, frustration, and how much is enough. Habakkuk is a complainer having an argument with God. Timothy is encouraging a community challenged by cowardice and the apostles want more faith than they have. Things aren't happening fast enough for any of them or for us. All of them and we want God to do something sooner rather than later and we want God to give us a reason to believe that it will all work out. What does God do? God puts it back on them—and us—telling Habakkuk to describe the world he wants; telling the apostles to do more than the expected. Doing more with less is a familiar phrase today and a reminder that a little faith may be enough even for the most difficult times. Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co.

#### TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Sometimes human relationships go awry, but Christ's choice for us is irrevocable. In marriage celebrations, the Church always recalls God's faithfulness to help prepare married couples for enduring the inevitable rough spots. The Byzantine liturgy does this by adorning the couple with crowns that remind them of the martyr's crown. The couple therefore takes on a vocation of witnessing to the sacredness of life in all of its suffering and joy, and of keeping their eyes fixed on the banquet of heaven.

In Eastern theology, people have a liturgical vocation to give God praise, and marriage fits within that plan. It is not so much saying prayers that counts, but becoming prayer. Interestingly, in this liturgy the couple never utters a word other than joining in the community's chants; there are no marriage vows as such. There is therefore not a hint of our Western Christian sense that marriage is a legal contract. Rather, it is all about living out one's baptismal vocation, embracing the cross, pouring oneself out in love, and opening to the grace of the Holy Spirit.




