Notes from Fr. Bob...


33RD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

The early Christians were anxious to know when the Day of the Lord would be, when the Lord Jesus would return in power and glory. Some of them expected the second coming of Christ to be very soon. We see the effects of all this in the second reading – some Christians are so convinced of the imminent return of the Lord that they stop bothering about the ordinary tasks and responsibilities of life. What's the point in wasting your time working if the end is near? When the Romans destroyed the Jerusalem Temple in 70 AD, many Christians believed this might well be the final great sign that the end was indeed near, that the Day of the Lord was approaching.

Luke is careful to make sure that the Christians of his community do not get carried away. Jesus says that says that anyone who claims to know when the end is, or who cites wars, plagues and natural disasters as evidence that the end is near, is an imposter. Refuse to believe them, he says. The message from Malachi, Paul and Jesus is clear: don't look to the future, but look to the present, to your life here and now. It is in the present moment that your salvation is being worked out. The picture Jesus paints of the present is far from idyllic: betrayal, persecution, even death for the sake of faith in him. Little wonder that some early Christians longed for the imminent return of Christ to put an end to their suffering. But Christ speaks of this present time as a real opportunity -achance to bear witness to their faith, to the reason for their hope. It is that faith which enables the Christian to face the problems which life brings. It is not that Christians are immune to suffering, persecution, disease or death, but rather that their faith means they are able to overcome these disasters. Yes – you may die for your faith, says the Lord, but your endurance will win you your lives – the gift of eternal life.

We can all be tempted to live in the future. Perhaps we long for escape from the boredom or drudgery of our lives, perhaps to escape from violence or oppression in its various forms. The challenge is not to wait for the future for things to be better, but to allow this day – every day – to be the Day of the Lord for us, to be a time when the Lord can come with power into our lives, to bring his healing and salvation.

Seize the day – use the opportunity of the present moment to bear witness to your faith and hope.

LIFE IS HARD, BUT HAVE NO FEAR

Today's readings take a fearless look at reality and reach a conclusion that we all know: life is hard. The prophet Malachi preaches fire and brimstone, warning us that evildoers will perish in flames. Saint Paul offers his own warning to the Thessalonians: keep busy, but never become a busybody. He reminds Christians that the apostles themselves worked in "toil and drudgery" as a model for how we ought to contribute to our community. The Gospel returns to the apocalyptic tone of Malachi, describing the utter chaos of the end-times. We will know the end is near when violence, catastrophe, and hatred dominate the earth. But we must not fear! God's saving plan brings peace to our hearts. Malachi speaks of the sun's "healing rays," and Jesus himself promises to protect every hair on our heads. Copyright © J. S. TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

We are faced with strong and disturbing readings today that hold a certain fascination, since they seem at first glance to be blueprints for future inevitable wars and hardship. A fundamentalist interpretation focuses on this aspect. Yet we hear them at our Sunday celebration of the Eucharist, which infuses them with hope and optimism. Rather than dreading the future, today's liturgy assures us that God is with us in all of life's inevitable trials, and that we have a role in shaping the outcome of human history. Occasionally, some Christians have attempted to decode these readings for an exact measure of the world's end, but they have thus far been disappointed.

"Nothing lasts forever" is a lyric from a Broadway show. Stars fall from the sky, leaves wither and fall, mountains wash into the sea, human projects and governments totter and collapse with great regularity. Today's liturgy opposes this idea as incomplete, reminding us that Christ has made a permanent change in human history, and that life in him is life forever. Rather than inviting us to throw in the towel, today's liturgy strengthens us for acts of goodness and grace in our families, communities, and world.

How old do I have to be to volunteer?

Volunteers need to be 11 years old to volunteer at the Food Depository during regular sessions. Ages 16 and older can volunteer self-supervised. Ages 11-15 need to have one adult supervisor per 10 youths.

What should I wear?

Volunteers must wear long pants and close-toed shoes. You will not be permitted to work in the warehouse if you are wearing sandals or shorts/ short skirt. Depending on the project you are assigned to, you may be asked to remove jewelry above the waist (including piercings, but rings are acceptable).

ST. JOHN'S ABBEY DAILY REFLECTION

"There is great grief and constant pain in my heart." (Romans 9:1)

St. Paul writes of the disappointment he feels that his people have not embraced belief in Christ. We hear the same pain and grief expressed in our time by parents who say: "We raised the kids as good Christians; we tried by good example and without being tyrants to lead them to Christ. But none of them goes to church; they aren't raising their children in the faith." It pains them to see what they regard as so important being rejected by their offspring. Neither Paul nor we can force the wills and choices of others. What we can do is trust in the value of our commitment and not let such disappointments lessen our generosity or good spirit.

We have been blessed with closeness to God and Christ, with life in the body of Christ and with the assurance and strength this brings. Rather than wailing over what isn't and dreaming of some other time, we need to give the

present our best, our gifts, our hope. 
