In a special way, I would like to acknowledge and thank the members of CCW Ministry, Holy Name, Chancel Choir, Parish Staff, and everyone else who helped with the gathering and refreshment after each Mass last weekend. Fr. Dan and I are grateful for your kindness.

I would like to share some blessings with you.

Fr. Ken Baker has been extremely helpful and attentive since our arrival to the Parish. He has taken the time to show us the Rectory and our beautiful church. He has helped us to become familiar with some important aspects for each Mass at our Parish. Our first weekend Mass experience went smoothly thanks to his guidance. Thank you, Fr. DOMESTIC VIOLENCE OUTREACH

Domestic Violence – WHY?¹

A STATEMENT OF THE U.S. CATHOLIC BISHOPS

AN OVERVIEW OF DOMESTIC VIOLENCE

- Domestic Violence is any kind of behavior that a person uses to control a partner through fear and intimidation.
- It includes physical, sexual, psychological, verbal and economic abuse.
- Examples include battering, name calling and insults, threats to kill or harm one's partner or children, marital rape, or forced abortion.

WHY MEN BATTER

- Men who abuse generally share some common characteristics:
 - They tend to be jealous, possessive and easily angered.
 - > They hold a view of women as inferior
 - Many believe that men are meant to dominate and control women.
 - Many try to isolate their partners by limiting their contact with family and friends.
 - Alcohol and Drugs are often associated with domestic violence, but they do not cause it.
 - Men who batter learn to abuse through observation, experience, and reinforcement. They believe that they have a right to use violence. Their behavior gives them power and control over their partner.
- Typically, abusive men deny that the abuse is happening, or they minimize it. They often blame their abusive behavior on someone or something other than themselves. They tell their partner, "You made me do this."

WHY WOMEN STAY

- **Fear:** Fear for themselves, fear for their children, fear that they cannot support themselves
- **Disbelief:** Women often are incredulous when a violent act first occurs. She many believe her abuser when he apologizes and promises that it will not happen again. When the abuse happens again many women believe that if they just act differently they can stop the abuse.
- **Shame:** Women may be ashamed to admit that the man they love is terrorizing them. Some cannot admit or realize that they are battered women.

REMEMBER: Some battered women run a risk of facing more violence when they leave their abuser or seek help from the legal system. It is important to be honest with women about the risks involved. If a woman decides to leave, she needs to have a safety plan, including the names and phone numbers of shelters and programs. Some victims may choose to stay at this time because it seems safer. Ultimately, abused women must make their own decisions about staying or leaving.

Prayer For Those Affected By Domestic Violence

God of peace, there are many places and many people who do not experience Your peace. Right now there are many women and children who live under the dark weight of the fear of violence right in their own homes. We pray for Your protection, and for wisdom for friends and officials to help bring the right protection to them. We pray for the many men who themselves feel powerless and confused about their relationships. We ask that You help them find healthy ways to work out their frustrations and to find hope without resorting to destructive impulses. God, we ask for your perfect peace.





Sunday Notes





GOD CHOSE US

Who chose first, God or you? That is the question explored in today's three readings. The second reading, from Paul's Letter to the Ephesians, reads almost like a hymn. It praises God for choosing us, for calling us to serve, and for blessing us in our service. Paul makes it clear how honored we are and how special is the call to live as children of God. This is through no doing of our own.

The first reading and the Gospel use prose rather than poetry to describe the same truth: God did the choosing, not us. When the prophet Amos was berated for being a prophet, he retorted that the whole thing wasn't his idea in the first place. Neither did the twelve apostles in today's Gospel ask for their calling. Jesus sent them forth, two by two, to do the work of his kingdom.

FEAST OF FAITH

Invitation to the Eucharistic Prayer

After the presider washes his hands, he turns to the people and says, "Pray that our sacrifice may be acceptable to God the almighty Father." We have brought forward bread and wine, and now we are asked to see in these simple gifts upon the altar a sacrifice offered to God. Our response is rich in theological meaning. "May the Lord accept the sacrifice at your hands." The words point to the unique role of the priest, whose hands, at his ordination, were anointed for just this purpose: that he might "sanctify the Christian people and offer sacrifice to God" (Rite of Ordination). We ask God to accept our sacrifice not because it is worthy of God, but simply "for the praise and glory of his name." God does not need our offering, but allows us to give it so that we might grow in holiness. And God, never to be outdone in generosity, gives all that we have given back to us, "for our good and the good of all his Church." This Mass benefits not just those who have gathered, but, in the mysterious economy of grace, the whole Church. In the words of Saint Paul, when one part rejoices, the whole body "share[s] its joy" (1 Corinthians 12:26). -Corinna Laughlin, Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co.

DAILY REFLECTION

Psalm 62: "In you alone is my soul at rest. My help comes from you."

"Living is what we do with God's time, what we do with God's world." That line is typical of the thought of the eloquent Jewish rabbi, Abraham Heschel, now deceased. How far from our tendency to think that living is something entirely up to us, entirely, as we say, "my own business." We so quickly get used to living, taking it for granted.

The hallmark of Rabbi Heschel's thought was this constant recognition of life as a gift and not our own creation. This extended for him to all that makes up what we call life and living: not simply what we do, but what we have and are. Another typical phrase of his was: "What we own, we owe."

The Gospel puts this in terms of stewardship; we have been placed in charge of what belongs to Another. This other, God, loves us and trusts us to use these gifts well, generously and with all our ability. Science and technology are especially clear examples of what we can do with these gifts, of how much potential they have for good – and, of course, for evil.

But more individually, each of us has a set of gifts present in everything from chromosomes to cranium. The Gospel and Rabbi Heschel, reflecting the Jewish tradition, remind us to appreciate the gifts and to use them well, with at least the imagination and preparation we put into golf or managing our finances. "Living is what we do with God's time, what we do with God's world."




