



THE MESSAGE OF CHRIST'S LOVE

From the proclamation of the Gospel at the beginning of the liturgy, we know that today is different, not only because we hear two Gospel passages, or because we hold palms and move in procession. Today begins Holy Week, a time set apart, a week in which to listen, pray, reflect, and take to heart the truth of Christ's passion, crucifixion, death, and ultimately, resurrection. It takes a week, and a lifetime, to truly hear the message of Christ's love. It is difficult for us to comprehend that Jesus willingly sacrificed himself, so we must hear the story again and again. Let this week be for us a new moment of faith in which we, together with the criminal who was crucified with Christ, cry out, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom." Copyright © J. S. A Note from Tina Norton, Pastoral Associate

For me, Palm Sunday marks the beginning of the busiest week of my working year. We take delivery of and hand out palms, we organize the procession, we receive even more deliveries, I organize ministers and get ready for the Triduum that takes place at the end of the week. I become the Logistics Queen. Palm Sunday is really its own observance, but it gets lumped in with the rest of the week by people like me who are really just trying to keep our heads above water. I am very grateful that we can gather with palms again this year and reflect on the meaning of the Easter story, the basis of our faith.

This year, as we come out of the pandemic, we are again allowed to bless palms and process with them in church. Of course, the Palm Sunday story recalls Jesus's entry into Jerusalem. Our long and detailed gospel tells entire story of Jesus's resurrection fully, to get us ready for the stories we will hear as part of the Triduum liturgies at the end of the week.

While I am making sure everything is working properly, I try to take a little time on what Palm Sunday and the Triduum mean to me. As we hear the readings this week, maybe we should take a little time to reflect on where we would be in the story. Would we be waving the palms as Jesus came into Jerusalem, welcoming him as we welcomed victorious Roman soldiers? Would we then scream for him to be crucified? Will we deny him three times? On the other hand, would we be like Simon or Veronica, who stepped in to help where they could?

As we go through Palm Sunday and into the Triduum, let's think about what kind of followers of Jesus we would like to be, and put that into practice as we are on our way to celebrating the Resurrection.

Happy Easter and we'll see you later this week!

ST. CLETUS COUNCIL OF CATHOLIC WOMEN - HELP FOR THE UKRAINE



The St. Cletus Council of Catholic Women invites all members of the parish to join with us locally to help the people suffering in the Ukraine. The people of Ukraine need our

prayers, but they also need tangible humanitarian aid. On the weekends of April 16-17 (Easter) and April 23-24 (Divine Mercy Sunday) there will be collection boxes in the narthex of the church for those wishing to donate much needed medical supplies or money to help ship them.

Sts. Peter and Paul Ukrainian Orthodox Church in Palos Park is accepting items like first aid kits, bandages, gauze, pain killers (Tylenol, Aspirin, etc.), Neosporin, tourniquets and cold/flu medicine, as well as hygiene items. They coordinate the shipment of these items via truck and plane to Poland and from there to the Ukraine. As items cost approximately \$2.00 per pound to ship, they are also gratefully accepting financial aid. Checks should be made payable to: "Sts. Peter and Paul Church". 



HYMNS TO BE REMEMBERED

One of the best ways to remember something truly important is to set it to music. It can be easily recalled and sung by heart and passed on. As you focus on the scriptures for Palm Sunday, it might be helpful to think of them as past, present, and future versions of the same story. In Isaiah, we hear one of four hymns referring to the "Suffering Servant" that paints a poignant picture prefiguring Jesus' crucifixion. "I gave my back to those who beat me, my cheeks to those who plucked my beard; my face I did not shield from buffets and spitting." Psalm 22's refrain is some of the last words spoken by Jesus on the cross. The Philippians hymn is one of the most beloved and poignant passages ever, "Christ . . . becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross." All of these are songs, hymns to be remembered.

DO YOU KNOW THE STORY?

We might assume that we know the scriptures and tend to tune out something as difficult to comprehend as the Passion of Christ. What we often end up doing is taking all four of the Gospels and sort of mixing the accounts into one story. The theologian Gerhard Lohfink called this "making Gospel Soup." Today's Passion is from the Gospel of Luke, and there are some elements that are very different from Matthew and Mark (the other synoptic Gospels read in Lectionary years A and B), and John's Gospel text which is always proclaimed on Good Friday. Let's look at the elements that are specific to Luke as we break the Passion into five sections.

THE LUKAN PASSION

Lord's Supper (22:14–38) Luke portrays Jesus as fiery and working for justice, both in his passion and in his ministry. The Passover feast is a very special time for the disciples, and while they are being commissoned, it is clear that they do not understand yet how they will carry on; Jesus warns them to protect them from evil.

Mount of Olives (22:39–53) Luke's Jesus doesn't seem as desolate as in other accounts about his imminent death, and goes to pray in regular fashion. He calls out his betrayer by name, hinting at foreshadowing of knowledge.

Peter's Denial – Sanhedrin (22:54–71) One can see the special care Jesus takes for Peter, and the scene takes place in the courtyard where Jesus was earlier abused as prophet.

Trials before Pilate and Herod (23:1–25) In this account Pilate and Herod both proclaim Jesus to be innocent, and this heals a "rift" between them. Jesus is good even to those who maltreat him.

Crucifixion, Death, and Burial (23:26-56)

There are no soldiers; it is the chief priests who take Jesus to Pilate. Jesus' words on the Cross are kind: "Father forgive them." In Mark' Gospel both criminals mocked Jesus, but here one of them begs forgiveness, and Jesus grants him salvation. Jesus' last words show a sign of trust: "Father, into your hands . . ." May we also place our trust in God as we enter into Holy Week.


