

Dear Parishioners,

As we conclude a liturgical year that started last year with Advent, today we gather together to acknowledge and celebrate the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. It was Pope Pius XI who instituted this celebration in 1925. Since then, Catholics throughout the world have been intentionally acknowledging and sharing with others the meaning and influence of Jesus Christ in our own lives.

Next weekend, November 26-27, 2022, we start a new liturgical year which we call Advent. As per our own experience, Advent is a unique season that prepares us for Christmas. The holy Catholic Church gives us four weeks to prepare ourselves and be ready to celebrate the birth of Jesus. How shall we get ready for Christmas at St. Cletus Parish?

I have three invitations for us. First, I believe it would be amazing if we could read Matthew Kelly's *Holy Moments: A Handbook for the Rest of Your Life*, together as a parish community during Advent. I have been praying and asking (Parish Pastoral Council and Parish Staff) about this since September. If you would like to join me in this journey, I kindly ask you to receive a copy (one per family) of *Holy Moments* next weekend after each Mass. There will be no cost. My prayer and hope are that throughout Advent, we can joyfully share our own holy moments (one paragraph) with each other through our parish bulletin. Something tells me that this exercise can truly bring us together and prepare us in a unique way for Christmas.



May Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, continue to strengthen our faith and help us to become aware of the many holy moments he gives us each day.

For many years, I have tried to keep this weekend's celebration for the Solemnity of Jesus Christ, King of the Universe (formerly known as Christ the King) quite a bit on the lighter side, using a famous quote from a Mel Brooks film History of the World, Part One "It's good to be the king." While I know it's a comedy film (some feel it was crude), I watch movies for their ability to entertain me, and Mel Brooks has never let me down. But as I've also said before, try telling Jesus and His disciples how good it is to be the king. Would you want to be a king if you knew it meant you would be crucified? I know very few people that would actually say 'yes' to that question. I mean, a king in most stories demands that his subjects love and re- This Thursday is Thanksgiving. spect him. Obviously, that's not what Jesus was about. He offers us love to us – his subjects – and we have a choice to love Him or not. All He asks of us is to follow His lead in Advent begins Saturday evening. loving one another, and thereby loving the Father. And where did that get Him? Well, at least one of the criminals hanging there beside Jesus showed respect and asked for forgiveness.

But there is another example of kingship in our recent months – King Charles III of England. Actually, his monarchy extends beyond England to the whole United Kingdom and 14 other commonwealths around the world. While a king doesn't mean what it once did before the American Revolution, there is a great love and respect shown to England's royalty in general. Obviously, much Fr. Mike

of that respect has been given because of the example of Queen Elizabeth II, who passed away a couple of months ago after being a symbol of constancy for the people of England, and really for many more people worldwide. She simply smiled and people loved her. I cannot fathom the weight that King Charles felt the moment the Queen passed away. I reckon he felt the sorrow like any son should feel about his mother's death, but to carry on the monarchy as one that serves the people has to be heavier than he might have anticipated. The Queen set a high standard. Lots of prayers for the King, his family, and for the people he

WELCOMING THE CENTER FOR INDEPENDENCE TO OUR SCHOOL

"When you do not teach the child to be independent, you teach the child to be dependent." — Dr. Maria Hari, Peto Institute

The Center for Independence (CFI) is an local organization that will be part of the St. Cletus community for the next few months. CFI is a program committed to children with Cerebral Palsy and other motor disabilities. The goal of this organization is to teach skills and self determination to children with physical disabilities. It is a warm and loving group of therapists, families and children that are blazing examples of what one can do with goals and determination. The Center specifically uses a method of therapy called Conductive Education. Conductive Education breaks down physical skills like walking, sitting and eating into achievable tasks and requires every participant to take some responsibility for their own learning. Participants initiate tasks, take a risk, cope, persevere, adapt - and learn! It is through this continuous cycle of trial and error that children and adults with physical disabilities develop a strong "I Can!" Attitude; where they believe in their own ability and recognize there is no limit to learning on their journey towards independence!

We are so excited to welcome the Center, its amazing staff of therapists and the children and families to St. Cletus. They will be using part of the space in Morrissey Hall as their home base for the next few months as their location (just \overline{\chi} blocks away) is being renovated. We are so lucky to have a community at St. Cletus that opened their arms to the Center staff and families. Likewise, St. Cletus is blessed to be part of the amazing feats that each child accomplishes every day. We look forward to interacting with CFI staff and children during the next few months. We look forward to serving and being inspired.
