

Pastor's Note

Dear Parishioners,

The Lord is kind to us. Each day He blesses us with the gifts of life, family, work, friends, and faith. He fills our hearts with His kindness and generosity. He gives us the courage and joy to share our blessings and time with others. He inspires us to be attentive not only to our needs but also to the needs of others.

Our parish is very good at sharing bread with the hungry. We share bread with our sisters and brothers every week. This is something that we do through the Food Pantry ministry that our parish is blessed to have. Everyone that comes to our Food Pantry is welcomed and served with compassion, kindness, and love. As I thank you for your continued support to our Food Pantry, I would like to acknowledge and thank Kendall Grant and all the volunteers for making feel welcomed and at home all those who allow us to share our bread with them.

With gratitude, appreciation, and wonder, I proceed to share with you some news and events. In each of them we can notice the presence and work of the Holy Spirit.

First, on Wednesday, February 1st, 2023, at 10:30 AM, we had a funeral Mass for Fr. Charles Watkins. Most Rev. Joseph Perry was the principal celebrant. Fr. Michael Novick, Associate Pastor, was the homilist. Fr. Watkins served at our parish as an Associate Pastor for five years (2006-2011). I met him at Mundelein Seminary in 2000. We both were ordained priests for the Archdiocese of Chicago by Francis Cardinal George on May 24, 2003. Four days before he passed, I was able to visit him. We were able to exchange a few words. May the Lord welcome him into His kingdom!

Second, our celebration and sharing of Holy Moments which was held on Wednesday, January 25th, 2023, went well. As a community of faith and moved by our desire to grow in our relationship with God, we came together to pray and thank Him for all the many holy moments He gives us daily. I was encouraged and uplifted by the holy moments that were shared by five members of our parish. It is my prayer and hope that the Lord will continue to share His grace with us so that our awareness of holy moments in our daily lives continues to grow.

Third, on Friday morning, January 27, 2023, accompanied by Greg Porod, principal, I was able to visit and pray with our students. As always, I was moved by their warm hospitality. They are eager to share with you their love for learning and the projects that they are working on. After praying with them, I blessed them with holy water. At the end of my visit, I was able to join our pre-school children in their Lunar New year celebration. It was a holy moment to be with them. Please keep them and their teachers in prayer.

Fourth, last Sunday, January 29, 2023, I attended the St. Cletus Open House. I was happy to see many families visiting our school. Each of them had a chance to meet our wonderful teachers, talk with students and parents, explore the class-rooms, and learn more about our school. I would like to acknowledge and thank our Principal, Assistant Principal, teachers, students, and parents who offered such a warm and successful St. Cletus School Open House to our guests. It was such a wonderful experience for all.

Fifth, with the support and leadership of our Parish Pastoral Council (PPC) and some other volunteers, our parish is hosting a Super Bowl Party on Sunday, February 12, 2023, at the Parish Center. I am happy to let you know that the members of the PPC are excited and joyfully preparing everything so that we all can have a marvelous time together on February 12. This is another way of us being together and growing in friendship with all those who consider St. Cletus Parish as their spiritual home. If you could, please bring a friend along.

Sixth, currently, I am doing my yearly retreat. I started on Saturday, February 4, 2023. I will return to the parish on Friday evening, February 10th, 2023. Every priest that serves in the Archdiocese of Chicago is expected to do a yearly eightday retreat. A retreat is always a special moment for prayer, reflection, silence, solitude, and especially for growth in friendship with the Lord. Please keep me in prayer as I will keep you in mine.

Seventh, next Saturday, February 11th, 2023, at 1:00 PM, 93 of our children will receive the sacrament of Confirmation at a special Mass celebrated by Most Rev. Robert Casey, Auxiliary Bishop of Chicago. Please keep the children, their parents, sponsors, and catechists in your prayer. If you are able, please join us.

Note From Father Mike

Change of plans

I had to postpone my surgery as the world lost one of the shining lights of the priesthood and certainly one of my own lights, Fr. Charles Watkins, a former Associate Pastor of St. Cletus from 2006-2008. Fr. Charles and I had been friends since even before he was officially a student at Mundelein. I was ordained in 2001, Fr. Charles in 2003 – a classmate to Fr. Elmer too. Charles was a gifted man with an amazing life with about 4 or 5 different careers, and none was less important than another. He passed away on January 27th. RIP, my brother and dearest of friends. There will be another time. One day.

I know this is around the time that the Annual Catholic Appeal begins. The theme for this year is "Walking on the Road With Jesus." I find this theme to be very providential at this time in the Church. With Lent not too far away, you may remember a song from Church with a line from the first verse that says "Lord, let me walk that lonely road with you UNDER THE WEIGHT OF THE WOOD." The reality of the Christian life is that "Walking on the Road With Jesus" is a daily task. Jesus didn't simply take up the Cross at the time of His condemnation. Jesus carried wood plenty of times in being a carpenter, learning the trade from Joseph, His earthly father. I'm sure there were plenty of days Jesus had to carry some pretty heavy pieces of handcrafted furniture. If you've ever bought solid furniture like a dining room table and chairs, you know how heavy it is by comparison to "pressed wood" (what basically appears to be compacted sawdust with a vinyl cover of some sort). So He was no stranger to a heavy load, but probably not carrying it by himself. So when we say we hope to become disciples of Jesus, we are pleading with Him too carry the Cross with Him, or more so, to carry it for Him. We should also so willing to carry our own cross, which He gladly helps us to carry.

I found an article online the other day called "Do Christians Really Need to Attend Church?" I am pretty sure I've tried to tackle this question in many articles and homilies before, but here came this article across my computer screen. The simple answer to the question is "yes." Yet, there are so many people that have said over time "I don't need to go to church to have a relationship with God." While in essence that is true, being a disciple of Jesus means following His words and actions. Something we know Jesus did was to go to the temple to pray with the community. That is noted in the gospel of St. Luke early on when He reads from the scroll of the prophet Isaiah. We cannot simply say "well, that was Jesus. That's not me." It may not be our charism (strength) to read in front of people, and for most people, having a specific liturgical ministry to be involved with isn't always possible. Or maybe some people still think Mass is boring and "I get nothing out of going." Whenever we attend Mass, we are not supposed to be looking for something from God, but we are there because we love Him and we are thankful for the love He has shown us by calling us to new life through our call to be His children by adoption through baptism.

Now, of course, that comes with trying to have an open mind and heart to receive whatever the Holy Spirit offers, whenever He reveals it to us. Is He going to reveal something every week to every person in attendance? Actually, He does. The question is whether or not we are actually paying attention to what He is offering at that time. It's not foolproof to say we are going to understand every week, but we ought to be praying for the grace to understand whenever He chooses. It's really not a lot for God to ask us for one hour of our time each week, is it? Or is it just me?

What: Watch the game, commercials and half-time show on a Jumbotron (240 inch) screen TV


