A Note from the Pastor's Desk

"By their fruits you will know them."

Matthew 7:16

Dear Friends,

In 2000, as I completed my second year of theology at Mundelein Seminary, I was assigned to St. Ita Parish, 5500 North Broadway in Chicago to do my Pastoral Internship. Fr. Laurance Maddock was the pastor. I was lucky to have him as my supervisor. He was kind, welcoming, and passionate about ministry. He allowed me to experience his joy, witness, and commitment to his community. There were over 26 languages that were spoken by the members of his community. They got along with one another, worked well together, and loved one another. They kept their parish alive and vibrant, an oasis of fraternity, friendship, and love. Worshipping on weekends at his parish

was a feast, a celebration of life and friendship with the Lord and one another. My weekly one-on-one meeting with him was always a blessing, because there were so many good things and holy moments to share and become aware of. I treasure my time at his parish, his leadership, and teaching. I always remember his following teaching: "Elmer, we know anything by its actions."

After completing my Pastoral Internship at St. Ita, I returned to Mundelein Seminary to complete my priestly formation and theological studies. From time to time, I would return to St. Ita for some parish events and for Fr. Maddock's mentoring, which I enjoyed until 2014 when he passed away. He always radiated joy, peace, and unity. His heart and actions were always filled with the love of God. He gave everything he had to his people and the Lord like the widow in today's first reading. He found peace and joy living and sharing his life as a



priest and pastor. Is it possible that the Lord might be calling you to consider priesthood or serve him in another capacity?

Last week we had the blessing of celebrating All Saints and All Souls Day at our parish. Praying with you in those moments filled my heart with gratitude and peace. God is always in the business of gathering us together. Your response to his action is always encouraging. For example, the members of our 12:30 PM Mass built a beautiful altar on the sanctuary of our church to remember, honor, and pray for our loved ones. In addition, Fr. Alex Garcia and Fr. Michael Novick created a candle memorial in the shape of a cross. As the names of our loved ones

were spoken, family members were invited to come forward and light a candle for their loved ones. It was a good way to pray and celebrate the life of their loved ones with a parish community praying with them. I felt encouraged.

Next Wednesday, November 13th, 2024, at 7:00 PM we will have our monthly Solemn Exposition and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament in church. Following the request and recommendation of the Eucharistic Revival Committee, and after consulting with Fr. Michael Novick and Fr. Alex Garcia, I am happy to let you know that during the Holy Hour the Sacrament of Reconciliation will be available. We anticipate keeping this practice at our upcoming monthly Holy Hours. Consider joining us.

May our actions help and lead others to come to know Jesus and to love him.

A Letter from the Associate Pastor's Desk

Many parishes offer Bible Studies for adults. Many parishes have other faith formation opportunities for adults. It's probably one of the most popular "complaints" I have heard from adults over my 23 years of ministry "Why didn't anyone teach us that?" I think that is one of the blessings that we have here at St. Cletus. We have offered "Evenings of Prayer and Reflection" with many visiting priests and other professionals. Last Lent, there was a four-week biblical walk through the Mass. Last night (November 4th), we embarked on another formation opportunity for adults entitled "When You Pray."

So many people have mentioned to me in recent years that they don't know how to pray or how to come back to God if they have recently felt distant from Him. Some of those people are educated professionals, but they simply feel like their prayers are inadequate. When I arrived at the first session last night, I was hope-filled to see some new faces who were not at the previous Bible Study last Lent. It filled my heart to know that prayer IS important to people and that they want to learn more.

Something that struck me in the video being used to help the discussion at the tables was that we all need to come to the realization that anything that moves you to say thank you to God, or help me, or whatever the situation, just calling on God with a sincere heart is the beginning of creating a prayer life. It could be the first 5-10 minutes of the day to devote to God, speaking to Him and listening to Him. And it might be that your prayers are anchored by the "formal" prayers like the Our Father, Hail Mary, the Rosary, or other noted devotions. However, something I have certainly experienced is that

when I need to re-ground my own prayer life, I return to those devotional prayers which leads me to concentrate a little more about what I need to tell God AND to listen to his voice – his response.

That is faith. Faith is our response to God's invitation to follow Him.

I didn't actually count the number of attendees last night, but there were approximately 18-22 people from different age groups, ethnicities, and levels of education. Everyone seemed very engaged in the video piece. There was a part of the video that had a religious sister who gave practical recommendations for anyone who is trying to connect or reconnect with God. For me, carving out a specific time to pray every day is one of the most important recommendations she made. When we were in the seminary, as you might expect, the daily time we were to be attending and praying Morning Prayer from the Liturgy of the Hours (some say it is the church's prayer book) was 7:30am. At most it was about 20 minutes officially to start with and it took time to learn, but it became a part of my everyday existence. Then breakfast and off to classes. Evening Prayer was at 5pm, then off to dinner.

Set time aside to concentrate. Use the Bible. Don't just read on and on, but take time to think about what stirs in your heart as you are going along.

The next session is this Monday, the 11th at 7pm in the Gallagher Room. Hope to see you there.

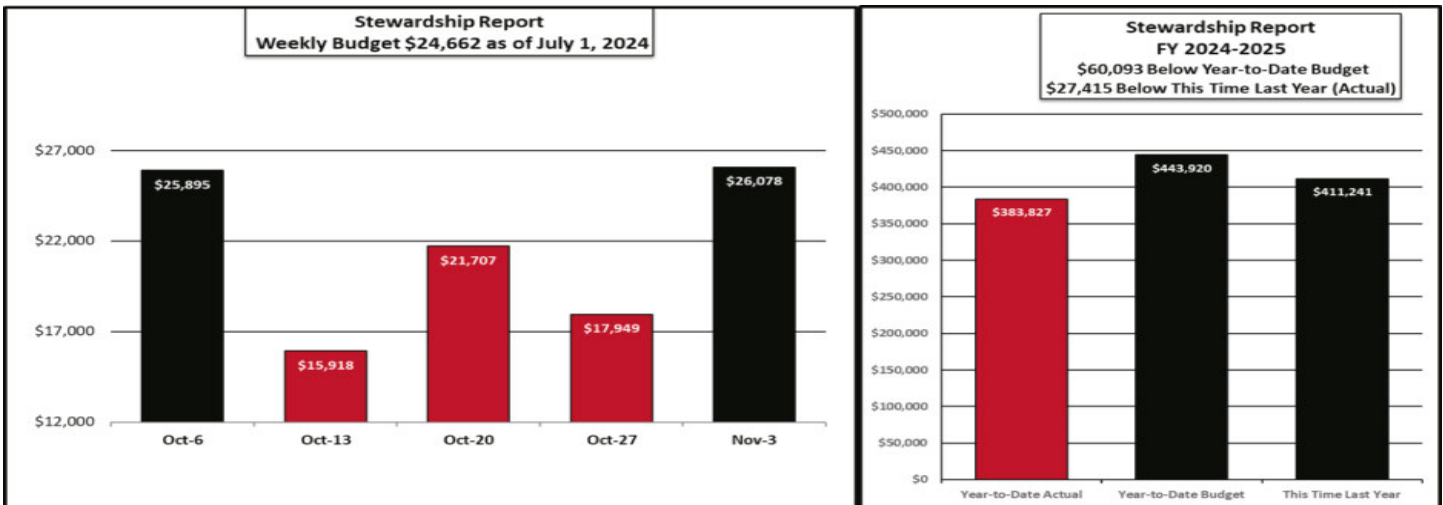

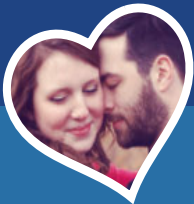
