Note From Father Mike

Good Shepherd Sunday

The Fourth Sunday of Easter is known as Good Shepherd Sunday because of the gospel reading we just heard. That should be obvious. But what does that mean in the context of Easter, for the implications provided to us in the gift of the Resurrection?

How can someone who has died lead us?

We are so ingrained in thinking in merely human terms. We have an image of a shepherd in our minds who gathers lambs into a fold (a pen, that has a gate) so that the sheep are protected from predators. The shepherd attends to the physical needs of the sheep, finding food and water for them. When the resources in the fold are used up, it's time to move to another area so that the lambs can continue to be nourished and protected, the shepherd has to take up all of the equipment to create a new fold.

We also can picture Jesus in the role of a shepherd, gathering us, protecting us, feeding us, and nurturing us. Yet, how does that happen after Jesus dies? He rises from the grave, in his flesh and blood. We take to heart that He IS the Son of God. If we don't have this belief, then why do we come to Mass at all?

Here is where the role gets "reversed." It's precisely because we are lambs that we come to Mass – for food, drink, and because many people think that there is the best of protection from those who want to harm us. I've heard many people joke about "well if I have to die, I should want to die during the Mass. What better place?" Then again, there are also interesting stories in the world when a tornado or other strong storm has devastated a community but a church was spared. Divine intervention? You bet.

The point is that we NEED shepherding from the Good Shepherd. When we had Cardinal Cupich here two Sundays ago, we had OUR local shepherd on site; but even the local shepherd knows that the Church needs THE Shepherd. That goes for Pope Francis too. I don't know if there has ever been a pope that claimed to BE THE Shepherd. He is the Vicar for Christ, but he knows and fully admits he is NOT THE Shepherd. I think the sooner we all admit and realize that none of us IS the Christ, the world would be a better place as would the Church. You know as well as I do that there is WAY too much division in the Church. That has been the case for a *long* time. Why?

Why Register in a Parish?

Each baptized Catholic has the right to a pastor, who is their contact point for sacraments, formation, and pastoral care. By default, the pastor of the parish where you live is your pastor. However, in the United States, you can be registered in a parish where you do not live and be entitled to receive pastoral care and sacraments there.

Nowadays, in the United States, it is better for parishioners to register in their parish, whether they live within its geographic boundaries or not. A parishioner is entitled to a funeral in their parish, to have their children baptized in their parish, and to receive pastoral care from the pastor of their parish.

Parishes use registration information to administer the parish itself. The registration list provides an easy way to communicate with community members, whether by mail or electronic means. Contribution envelopes are mailed to registered parishioners. A registration system allows a parish to allocate resources more precisely since we have an idea of how many people count us as "home." (At St. Cletus, in addition to the October counts required by the Archdiocese, we take a headcount at every weekend Mass. This allows us to spot trends and make informed decisions about resources in the long term.)

Registering gives a parishioner a community to "officially" belong to—a place to share our gifts and talents with our neighbors and worship with them. Parish activities benefit our community and allow us to get to know our fellow parishioners better. Registration is a reciprocal process. It makes it easy for our parishioners to get the pastoral services to which they are entitled and efficient for the parish to provide those services. You may either register online through our website or simply by calling our Parish Office at 708-352-6209. Please, feel free to contact us with any questions.

New Choir Chairs!

Happy Spring, Saint Cletus!

Firstly, I'd like to take the opportunity on behalf of everyone here at the Ministry of Music (kind-of a... magical...way of saying it, don't you think?) to offer a heartfelt "Thank You!" for all your love and support. The number of truly kind and lovely comments so many of you have offered to so many of *us* over the past few weeks has been really moving and affirming.

As the not-yet-mutinied "captain" of the ship over here, I'd also like to offer my personal thanks to everyone up here making it happen... the amount of work and dedication our singers put into enhancing our liturgies is inspiring and I could -not- be more proud of them and what they're doing!

If you haven't noticed... Music Ministry has been expanding. Over the past year we've grown to (if everyone is present) 35 (!) kiddos in the kids' choir and 46(!!!) in chancel choir, and even added 2 to Contempo... so we have the happy problem of figuring out how to expand the house as well. Sadly, the furniture in the house is really old and actually falling apart. (Literally, screws have come out, legs are uneven, some are broken, the metal edges catch peoples' clothing and little rough bits poke unsuspecting choristers in the backside...)

The solution I've come up with to both difficulties is to look into buying new chairs! However, not cheapo utilitarian chairs that we stack up and hide after we use them; chairs that actually look beautiful and intentional in the space that will serve as seating for the choirs when the choirs need them, and as seating for the congregation when the choir doesn't- which will allow us to move some pews around and expand the area where the choir sits as well (and also gives us an appropriate amount of

space for when we have the kids and adults present at the same mass!)

Before you brace yourselves for "the pitch" you know is coming: I've done a ton of digging... actual wood chairs are not inexpensive. However!! I found chairs that fit the aesthetic of the church; the essential shape of the pews, the same stain, etc, that are even stackable if needed... and at a reasonable price! (trust me, in the realm of what's out there, these are exceptionally reasonable...)

Pitch time!

You have the !!once-in-a-lifetime!! opportunity to honor or memorialize a loved one by sponsoring a choir chair! Should you choose to, I will personally (and I mean that!) affix an engraved brass tag to the chair you've sponsored. Fiacre Society Spring 2024 Update



As we all made it through the end of the Lenten season, the celebration of the Easter season, St. Fiacre (the patron saint of gardeners, and taxi drivers!) begins to whisper in our ears about the planting season.

This write-up will summarize the plans for the planting season of 2024. We continue with our usual planting of annuals in front of Church, in front of the Rectory and around the flagpole bed. These flowers will get installed sometime around Mother's Day, May 12, to protect against any late -season freeze. Exact dates for delivery and planting, with back-up rain dates will be published later

The location of these annuals is in accordance with a professionally designed garden plan developed Oct. 7, 2021. This plan was designed with the request from St. Cletus and the Fiacre Society to take advantage of many of the current plants and topography, emphasizing wherever possible to transplant existing plants. The plan also was developed to plant as many hearty perennials to reduce the need for constant maintenance and planting.

This year the Fiacre Society would like to begin working on the beds along the south side of the Parish Center. We so far have nearly completed beds around the Rectory, beds in front of Church, the flagpole bed, the bed surrounding the St. Francis Statue and the beds along the east side of the Parish Center.

Finally, the main reason to communicate the Fiacre Society plans is to continue to seek your help to assist. Planting is only one of the necessary jobs to enhance these gardening efforts. We rely on volunteers to assist in addition to planting with watering, weeding, clean-up and after the fall season, removal of annuals. We cannot do this vocation without our current, dedicated volunteers. They are invaluable and we share many laughs, stories and a shared commitment to our wonderful parish. However, as the saying goes, "many hands make light work." We always seek extra helpers; green thumbs are not required. Our beautiful campus which includes our plantings continue to broadcast to others a welcoming and friendly community. Please join us!


