Dear Friends,

This weekend Catholics all over the world celebrate the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. Consider this special celebration as an opportunity to learn more about the identity of Jesus. Who is he? Where did he come from? Why did he come? What was his mission? How did he fulfill the will of his Father? What aspect of his life shocks you and why? How do you see him in your life? What difference does he make in your life and the lives of the people that you love?

A good place to start would be today's readings. They have precious information about who Jesus. For instance, in the Book of the prophet Daniel we hear about a vision of Christ, the Son of Man, receiving from the Father total, universal, and everlasting kingship, Lordship over all people and nations. The Psalm verse, which is also a prophecy, also announces the Lord is King, from of old and from everlasting to everlasting, forever. The prophecy from the book of Revelation calls Jesus "the ruler of kings of the earth." He is the "king of kings:" not only the greatest of all kings, but the ruler over all kings.

Nowadays, there are countless resources available that talk or teach about Jesus. The Gospels continue to be my favorite ones. Then, I turn to "Simply Jesus," a book written by N.T. Wright, and "Jesus of Nazareth," written by Pope Benedict XVI. When it comes to podcasts, I turn to the "Word on Fire" ministry led by Bishop Robert Barron. Most recently The Chosen (TV series) has given us a new look at the life of Jesus Christ. From my conversation with those who have already watched all the series, they tell me that they feel closer to Jesus Christ. How about you? Jesus wants to be close to us. He delights being part of our lives. He offers us his friendship, life, and love for free. Sometimes all we need to do is to give him a chance. After that, you will notice yourself being more open, flexible, generous, and kind. It is also possible that he might invite you to join him on the best adventure of your life. Can you imagine that? Look around and you will see many who are enjoying that beautiful adventure with Jesus Christ.

I consider our upcoming Thanksgiving Day Mass as one of the most beautiful adventures to which Jesus is inviting us. He is the reason why we are having a special Mass on Thanksgiving Day at 9:00 AM. He is the principal host. He wants us coming together as one community to give thanks for all the blessings he has bestowed upon us since last year. He delights seeing us growing in friendship, community, and fraternity.

Careful preparations have been taking place for this special Mass. A special worship aid has been prepared for this moment of prayer in order to help those who speak English or Spanish. We will have a choir that will help us in singing praises to the Lord. The Art and Environment Committee will have the sanctuary of our church arranged beautifully. All ministers will fulfill their mission with care, reverence, and joy. Fr. Michael, Fr. Alex, and I are excited and looking forward to praying with you on this special occasion.

What has Jesus brought to the world? "The answer is very simple: God. He has brough us God," says Pope Benedict XVI.

May the God of Jesus continue to be acknowledged, worshiped, and loved by us all at St. Cletus Parish, a parish community that we love.

A Letter from the Associate Pastor's Desk

As Thanksgiving approaches, I have so much to be grateful for. First and foremost, I thank God for sending not only to be a priest, but more specifically, for sending me to this great parish of St. Cletus. I am very blessed to know so many great people, some of whom were parishioners back in the days of Fr. Charles Watkins, who was an associate pastor here around 2006 or so, and my best friend. Serving here even with so many years in between his tenure and mine is still very nostalgic. And I love hearing about the stories from people whose lives he touched. It's a real gift.

As we all should be, I am very grateful for inspiring my parents to have me baptized just weeks after welcoming me into the world. That day, like most Catholics, is not memorable for them personally because we were infants. However, the effects of that day and the faith that was given was nurtured at home. My parents sent me to Catholic schools throughout my education – elementary, high school, and college. And when I was considering going to the seminary, I wanted to be sure I could handle the classwork. I had been out of college for 6+ years. So, I took one class at another Catholic university not far from home and felt good enough to go on with my studies at Mundelein. All of the priests that I came to know because my parents cared proved to

be very helpful. Plus, all of the sacraments received over time made a difference as I grew.

I have never been short of having great friends. After Fr. Charles passed away in January 2023, there was a period of time that I felt so lost and alone. I had to make a conscious effort to make new friends. While that started with friends from here at St. Cletus, the world is much larger. So, I found a support system at which I have found a great deal of new friends. And that group continues to grow.

I am also very grateful for the knowledge within my that I would have never thought of as being useful. I know that sounds strange, but growing up as a bit of a runt in my schooling days, I wasn't a great student. What I have learned (thankfully over time) is that even if I don't know the answers to certain questions I get asked, I know HOW to find them. That is also a gift.

I wish I could name every gift I've ever been given. Someday I am sure those memories will come back to the front of my thoughts, but for now, I just say thank you to God for every moment I have been graced with recognizing.




AARP Tax-Aide Needs Volunteers for the 2025 Tax Filing Season

Looking for a rewarding opportunity to make a difference in your community?

The AARP Tax-Aide Program is now seeking volunteers for the upcoming 2025 tax filing season. It's not necessary for you to be an AARP member or to have a tax or an accounting background to volunteer. However, some knowledge of your own personal tax matters is very helpful. All returns are prepared on computers; thus, volunteers should be somewhat computer literate. Training classes will be held in January, 2025. Minimum time commitment during the filing season is 4 to 5 hours one day per week from early February to mid-April.

This income tax preparation and assistance service is offered to low and middle income individuals with special attention to those 60 years and older. Won't you help?
