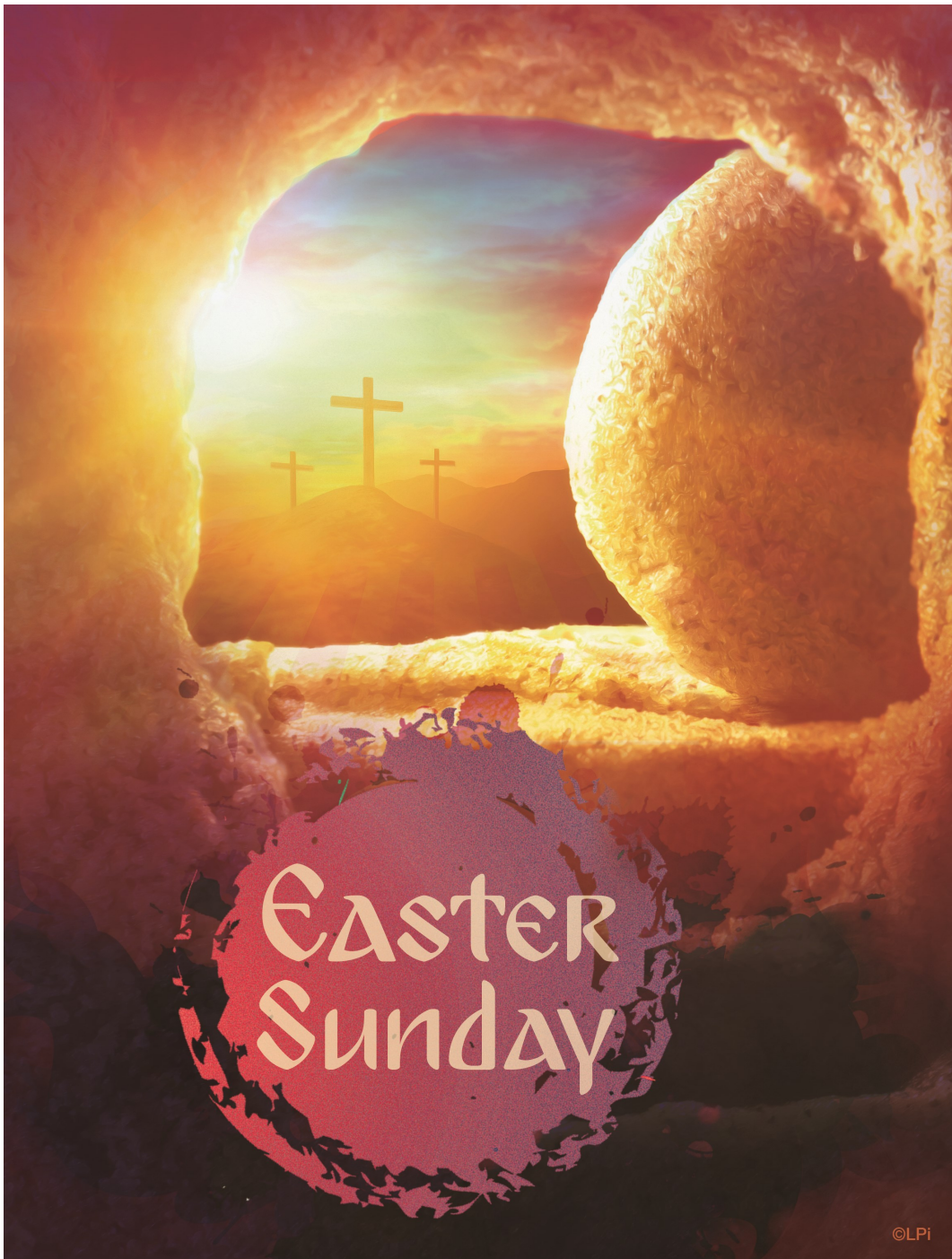

Note From Father Mike

Divine Mercy

The Church celebrates Divine Mercy Sunday on the Second Sunday of Easter each year. It's a "newer" devotion for the Church, as the Lord Jesus revealed himself to St. Maria Faustina Kowalska in the 1930s. However, the devotion didn't seem to catch on with the same fire and energy as devotions like praying the Rosary. Still, of the 14 messages that Jesus gave to St. Maria Faustina the first is quite powerful. Here it is:

"My daughter, tell the whole world about My inconceivable mercy. I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and a shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners. On that day the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the fount of My mercy. The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment. On that day are opened all the divine floodgates through which graces flow. Let no soul fear to draw near to Me, even though its sins be as scarlet. My mercy is so great that no mind, be it of man or of angel, will be able to fathom it throughout all eternity. Everything that exists has come from the very depths of My most tender mercy. Every soul in its relation to Me will contemplate My love and mercy throughout eternity. The Feast of Mercy emerged from My very depths of tenderness. It is My desire that it be solemnly celebrated on the first Sunday after Easter. Mankind will not have peace until it turns to the Fount of My mercy."

It's no wonder Jesus was more specific with when the devotion should be celebrated. It's a great thought that we spend a week of listening to the stories in the Acts of the Apostles, including several healings through God's mercy.

God's mercy (as the opening sentence reminds us) is inconceivable. It's unfathomable. It will never run out. Sadly, there are many people who simply do not believe that God could nor would ever be merciful toward them. I know that my whole world would come crashing down if I ever began to truly believe that God would never be merciful toward me again. I know of my wrong-doings. I'd be in a ton of trouble if God "flipped the script" on the world.

"For the sake of His sorrowful Passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world." We can find out more about praying the Chaplet of Divine Mercy online, of course, (I used <https://www.thedivinemercy.org/message/devotions/pray-the-chaplet> in the above quotation) Still, of any of the prayers used in the chaplet, this quote speaks volumes to my soul.

Some people know the most difficult thing to forgive is being betrayed, especially by someone you trusted whether for a short amount of time or a longer period. I have said before that anyone who has been betrayed is in the same grouping as Jesus. Judas' betrayal likely would have been forgiven by Jesus – and I believe it was. Judas couldn't forgive himself and he turned to despair. But that doesn't mean God didn't show mercy to Judas' soul. That would be very presumptuous of us. The same ought to be true of anyone who hurts us in any way. We need to forgive as God forgives us. No one would ever claim forgiveness is easy to give. Only with God's grace and His extra-deep wellspring can we learn from Jesus. "Have mercy on us, and upon the whole world." **Fr. Mike**

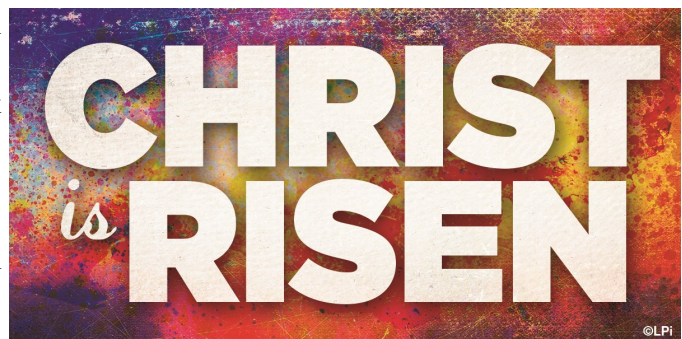

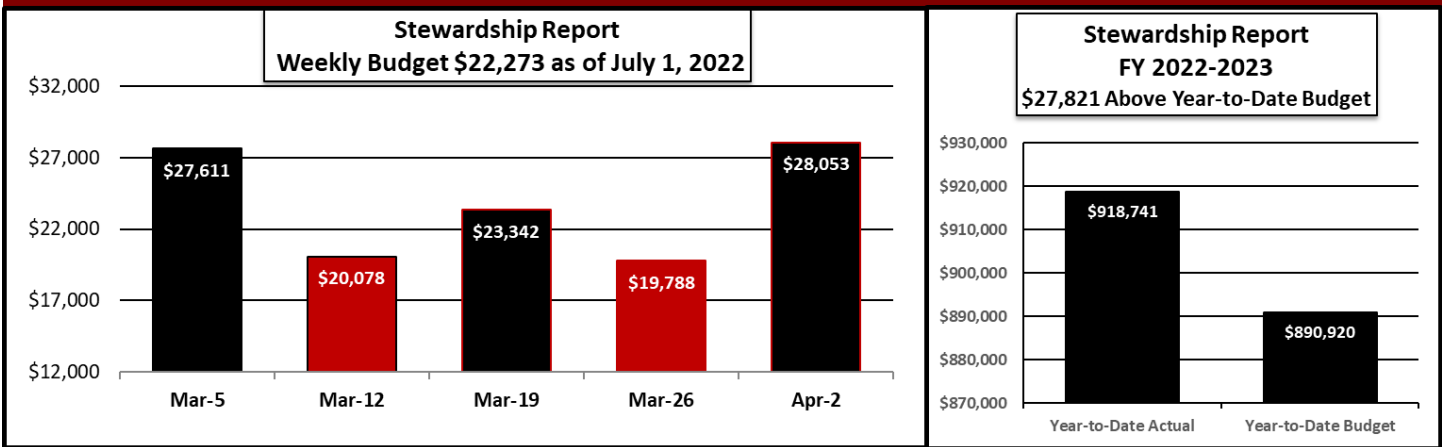
