


Notes from Fr. Bob...

21ST SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

The Baltimore Catechism was an absolute "God send" for teachers, students and priests alike for many years. From that book, we could learn, in a very concise way, who and what God is. All we had to do was memorize the appropriate question and answer. So really, it was our memories that enabled us to get in touch with God. It was simple. The Baltimore Catechism was a great tool and was ingeniously constructed; however, it may have had a few drawbacks. Knowing all the answers meant that we didn't have to think too carefully about who God was and what He meant. If we had any doubts, we just had to go through our memorized questions and answers to find the appropriate set, which would quell our doubt. The Baltimore Catechism was a wonderful thing, but it was never meant to be the end of the story.

Jesus asks a fairly innocuous question: "Who do people say the Son of Man is?" The phrasing of the question meant that the answer is out there somewhere, and that in answering it, the person responding did not have to give anything away about their own feelings or ideas. The disciples happily respond with a litany of eminent worthies. However, Jesus is quick to turn the question around and personalize it: "Who do you say I am?" Now the disciples have to show their true colors, and say who they believe Jesus to be. The Gospel tells us that "then Simon Peter spoke up". The word "then" would suggest that there was a pause, whether brief or long, an uncomfortable few moments when the disciples sat looking at each other, praying that someone would say something. It was Simon Peter just blurting these words out, and then wondering where on earth they came from. After all, his declaration is quite stunning, to say to his friend and master, "you are the Christ, the Son of the living God". As Jesus himself tells Simon Peter, this knowledge did not come from another human being, but had been revealed to Peter from the Father in heaven. By being with Jesus and having a personal relationship with him, Peter was open to the working of the Spirit, and thus he was open to the Father in his own life. It was on this openness and this act of faith which Peter had just made, that our Church was founded. It is probable that Peter did not fully understand what he was saying and what his act of faith might cost him in the future, but nonetheless, the faith was there and that was enough for Jesus.

If one of your non-believing work mates asked you tomorrow, "Who is this Jesus that you believe in?" how would you respond? Is Jesus some remote figure in your



Jesus reaches out to us in many ways, not least through the Scriptures, the Mass and the sacraments. Today he is asking us the same question that he asked his disciples many years ago. He is asking you personally, he is not asking you who the Church says he is, or who the media says he is, he asks YOU. How are we going to respond?

The question is obviously a theological one, but it is not an academic one. At the end of the day, we will all have to answer that question for ourselves. Who do you say I am? Do we, like Peter, have the faith that enables us to proclaim Jesus as our Lord, as the Messiah? Many in our world are looking for and talking about a need for a messiah. Our Messiah and savior is already in our midst, as one of us. His kingdom is here now, and we are called to work for the building of that kingdom. Perhaps we could consider ways in which we can continue to build up his kingdom now, in our homes, in our parish and in our local community at large. However, we will only be able to do that if we can answer for ourselves the question Jesus put to his disciples. If our faith enables us to answer, "Yes, Jesus, you are the Christ and I believe", then what happy people we will be. .

BE A ROCK

Peter's history as a follower or friend of Jesus is a bit spotty. It might be natural to wonder if Jesus, in giving him the keys to the kingdom, didn't feel a bit like a parent giving a teenager the keys to the family car. But it was at the moment when God's power and presence broke through everything else to raise up Peter's great profession of faith in Christ as Messiah that Jesus chose to establish the bond between the loving, forgiving mercy of heaven and our vocation to be witnesses of that love, mercy, and forgiveness on earth.

Like any parent, Jesus no doubt foresaw the failings, the irresponsible maneuvers or impaired senses, the collisions that the church would be headed for. But, most importantly, he also saw us at that moment as God prefers to see us: capable of manifesting great faith, with a willingness to remain at the feet of Christ to understand what it truly means to be Messiah and Christ. As the letter to the Romans points out to us today, we have not known the mind or the wisdom of God, but God knows us and still chooses to manifest the reign of justice, joy, beauty, and peace through us. Let this be our vocation. Let us always strive to be solid ground on which the church of Jesus Christ can be founded and on which it can continue to be built.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Eucharistic Prayer II is a popular choice for Mass since it is both simple in structure and short. It is written with a preface, which is the section after the dialogue "The Lord be with you . . . Lift up your hearts . . . Let us give thanks," which introduces all the Eucharistic Prayers. The preface states the reason for the eucharistic assembly on that occasion, and there are dozens of them covering almost every imaginable gathering for prayer, some specific to feasts, others for Masses for the dead or for other needs. The preface attached to the second Eucharistic Prayer may be dropped in favor of a more appropriate choice, especially one of the prefaces for weekdays. The General Instruction of the Roman Missal says that Eucharistic Prayer II is best suited for weekdays or "special circumstances." In practice, however, it has become the common Sunday prayer because of its brevity and its comfortable familiarity. It also includes an optional phrase for adding the name of a deceased person remembered in the Mass, and therefore is often prayed at funerals. Article 50 of the Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy specified that the rites are to be simplified and restored "to the vigor they had in the tradition of the Fathers." The rebirth of this ancient Roman prayer is a worthy response to this call.

FOOD PANTRY UPDATE

Thank you for all your support of the Food Pantry. In addition to food and monetary donations, helping to bag and distribute food, another way to help is by volunteering at the Greater Chicago Food depository. As a member agency of the GCFD we purchase food at a low cost each month to help supplement the food needed in our pantry. We also receive free produce and other perishables each month to distribute.

On the fourth Wednesday of each month, we send a group of 10-15 volunteers to earn credit for us by volunteering/working at the GCFD. At these sessions, we earn \$15.00 worth of food per volunteer. Please check your calendar to see if you might be able to join our volunteer team on one or more of these evenings. A few things you should know:

- •Volunteers need to be 14 years old to volunteer at the Food Depository during regular sessions.
- •GCFD is located at 4100 W. Ann Lurie Place, Chicago, IL 60632, which is a few blocks from I-55 and Pulaski.




