During this time of uncertainty and anxiety, I pray that you and your loved ones are safe and healthy. 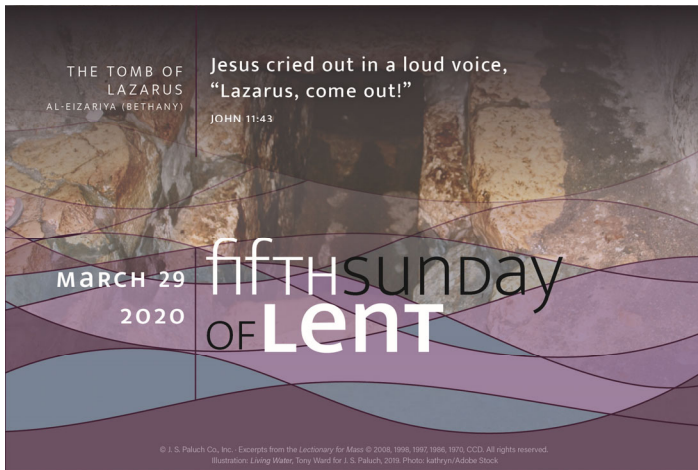

GIVE GLORY TO GOD

On the Fifth Sunday of Lent, just before we begin to enter Holy Week, we are summoned to Bethany. If we had been friends of Mary, Lazarus, and Martha, and found out that Lazarus was gravely ill, we probably would have dropped everything to be with them. This was what was so surprising about the behavior of Jesus. Although he was their close friend, he chose to stay away, that God's glory would be manifested. This is a persistent theme in John's Gospel. Right to the very end, Jesus' works were meant to give glory to the Father. As our Lenten journey reaches a crescendo, let us be mindful that, as people who have "put on Christ" in baptism, we are also called, by our attitudes and actions, to give glory to God.

SAINT POLYCARP (DIED 155)

February 23 -"Eighty-six years I have served Christ, and he never did me any wrong. How can I blaspheme my King and Savior?" Boldly answering the official who demanded he worship pagan gods, Polycarp, today's "Senior Citizen Saint," demonstrates that courage, far from being the preserve of the young, is a virtue cultivated through lifelong fidelity and crowned by final perseverance. A disciple of Saint John, who is said to have consecrated him bishop of Smyrna in modern-day Turkey, Polycarp witnesses to the truth that, whatever time and space may separate us, Jesus' gift of the Eucharist unites us. Polycarp's final words, preserved by the Church of Smyrna, sound like a Eucharistic Prayer in which the saint offers himself: "Lord, almighty God, Father of your beloved and blessed Son Jesus Christ, through whom we have come to the knowledge of yourself . . . may I be received among the martyrs as a rich and pleasing sacrifice . . . through the eternal priest of heaven, Jesus Christ . . . through him be glory to you, together with him and the Holy Spirit, now and forever. DAILY REFLECTION ST. JOHNS ABBEY

*Psalm 62: "In you alone is my soul at rest.
 My help comes from you."*

What a change! From being an oft-persecuted sect, Christianity had become by 380 CE a state religion. It became fashionable to be a Christian; it was a way to advancement. Laws were made to promote the faith. It all sounded good to many Christians and such an arrangement continued in many places till modern times. Unfortunately this often meant that Christians did not feel personal responsibility for their faith. Being a Christian was more a matter of where you were born than of genuine personal commitment. Believers depended on laws to enforce Christian belief and morals. The temptation to do that is still with us. When people aren't convinced of the Christian stand on a moral issue there are always some who think making it into law would help.

The brief parable of Jesus about how a small amount of yeast is able to permeate and transform a large amount of flour suggests a better way to influence our society than by laws (Matthew 13:31-35). People who believe in God's love can spread that by quiet lives of faithfulness, joy, and genuine love. Observation tells us again and again how powerful individual example can be, how people are led to Christ not by argument, force and talk but by good example. The life of Christ in his members, nourished at the Eucharist, makes this example possible.

Food Pantry Update

We are adapting quickly to the changes that continue to come our way, while still continuing to meet the increasing need of our neighbors. Our first week of food pantry distribution during “shelter in place” went very well. **We saw a 22% increase** in households receiving food, from just the week before. We only expect this number to increase as more and more people are out of work, get sick, lose health insurance, etc.

In order to keep everyone safer we have made a number of changes:

- Switched to prepacked bags of food
- Only offering curbside pickup, like a drive thru
- Cut back the number of volunteers at each shift
- Encouraged our “at-risk” volunteers to remain at home
- We are only releasing our volunteer sign up one week at a time. We want to make sure when you sign up you are in good health and not trying to sign up weeks from now.

We have been in regular contact with the Greater Chicago Food Depository. We are so grateful for their strong leadership during this crisis.

We also want to express our gratitude to all of you. Your support has been overwhelming! Thank you!

- Funds allow us to purchase necessary safety and sanitation items, such as wipes and gloves.
