Notes from Fr. Bob...

5TH SUNDAY OF LENT 2016

For the Jews in Jesus' time, the Mosaic Law was very clear. For example, a woman caught committing adultery was to be stoned to death. Judgment and punishment dominated over forgiveness and mercy. Due to the patriarchal nature of the society, the same punishment did not apply to the man because the woman was seen as inferior and treated as the possession of the man. This understanding of relationships between men and women is scandalous to us today but sadly still reflects the attitudes of some men towards women. Jesus' action towards the woman is dramatic and turns the custom of the Law upside-down.

Jesus forgives the sin of the woman and tells those who surround her not to judge her in the old way. She is to be given a new start and told not to sin again. In his action towards her, Jesus affirms and restores her dignity. He makes a statement about the equality of woman and man in this action. He also places the focus on forgiveness and mercy, not judgment. If we combine this story with the answer to the question, "How many times must I forgive my brother"; we hear Jesus saying, "not seven times but seventy-seven times". This is an infinite number and shows that forgiveness is always waiting as a gift from God. The newness of life offered to the repentant sinner is a cause for celebration and for this reason we have the sacrament of reconciliation.

The Church has always recognized that we cannot judge other persons; that is to be left to God. For this reason, while we can name certain actions as wrong, no one, not even the priest, can judge the fault or culpability of the person who does the wrong. The Church has always taught that mortal sin or being totally cut off from God can only occur when a person freely and with knowledge commits a seriously wrong action. The mystery of the other person means that no-one, except God, can see the freedom or knowledge of the other person. We cannot say that any particular person does not enjoy God's love and is totally alienated from God, in hell. This choice is a possibility because we are free, but God can judge that inner freedom.

Newspaper reports constantly detail the most horrific crimes, including child abuse, murder and violence of various kinds. There are many crimes which cause outrage and provoke angry reactions. While we must name these actions as wrong and protect people and especially children from harm, at the same time we



with God. They may be ill, mad, inadequate in human development or not acting freely. It is for God to judge. In justice and to protect others we may send some people to prison or to a hospital, but there is still a duty for the Christian community to care and pray for them.

Judgment is rife in society today — especially of those with criminal convictions. The gospel is a reminder that we must be careful about labeling people or deciding how they stand before God. Wrong and bad actions must be condemned but people are complex. The Christian is called to remember that repentance and conversion are possible through God's grace..

GETTING TO KNOW YOU

Our parish registration database is old and has not been updated for several years. It is time that we reaffirm our parishioner base as we go forth with planning for the future role of St. Cletus in our community. It is not only important that we identify you, but also set up ways that we can connect with you as well. In today's world, the exchange of information is truly facilitated with

modern technology. Throughout our parish family, sharing thoughts and ideas are necessary for the vibrant culture that we wish to attain here at St. Cletus. We have a lot to share at St. Cletus! The ministries, the school, the events, the people!



- •We will begin with the easy contacts. Beginning this Palm Sunday, we will ask all of our active parishioners to fill out a simple identification notecard that will furnish us with basis contact information. This notecard will be available in the church and can be completed in pencil. Then the notecard can be placed in a collection box located in the narthex. Parishioners who take advantage of this method will complete their part of the Re-registration process.
- •After a couple months of collecting the notecards from the parish masses, we will compare the info from the newly submitted notecards to the parish's existing "old" records. To the extent that a parishioner has not prepared



with a newly submitted notecards, we will proceed mail the notecards to those remaining parishioners at the address we have on file. This will determine if they are still in the community or assess whether they are still seeking to be registered with the parish. Hopefully this second step should furnish us with identifying the bulk of our remaining parish community.

•If there are still some parishioners that are non-responsive we will actively seek to contact them by phone (again using phone# that we have on file) or other personal means. This final step would complete the process of identifying all the members of our St. Cletus Community.



God created every plant, every mountaintop, every animal—everything. And God said that these things are good. We find God in these good things he made, and so we must take care of creation, both for ourselves and for all of our human family.
