A letter from the Associate Pastor's Desk

AUTUMN IS UPON US

Change is in the air. That's what we begin to see once the autumnal equinox rolls around.

It's also time when the Church begins to think forward. There are a mere 9 weeks of Ordinary Time to go before a new liturgical year will be upon us. Yet there are still plenty of activities going on at St. Cletus. October will bring the Pet Blessing, Mass with the Anointing of the Sick, the Parish Potluck, and an Evening of Rosary. Then November always begins with two major days in the Church calendar – the Solemnity of All Saints (a holy day of obligation) and the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed. All of the above is to say that everyone is invited to attend and pray and celebrate.

Two Sundays ago, I spoke in my homily about how my dream for the Catholic Church would be that all of the Catholics who had stopped practicing their faith would all wake up on the same day and realize that just maybe they were wrong in leaving the faith – that maybe they thought "I was wrong to simply stereotype all priests and religious." Or, "they don't really always talk about money." There are plenty of other examples that COULD be used. Maybe even, "I've really missed the Eucharist." But what if I told you that it truly COULD happen?

There are a couple of things that would need to happen to make that vision a reality. One of those things would be a full societal return to family values. While society has seen a sort of re-defining of what constitutes a "family" in terms of who or how many people are living in a home, the basic feeling of being a family is less than it once was. There once existed parents and children who would say good morning, good night, and I love you. Now, parents and children barely have time to say not only those three phrases, but it is more take the children to athletics or events, with barely enough time for children to finish homework before 10:30pm. Does that work? Current societal norms might say yes, but invariably over time, the core of family doesn't last. And even more frequently, it becomes more of an issue when end of life issues occur. Children and grandchildren have less connection with their parents, grandparents, and guardians, and don't have good family time to process death and grief, especially being so far apart when children are old enough and move away. I've seen it all too often. And then the result is that children/grown-ups lose the ability to cope.

My own family upbringing, I realize, was much more traditional especially when it came to death. My brother and my cousins were always at wakes and funerals. Our parents wanted more for us. They didn't want us to struggle with death and end of life issues; instead, they helped us to navigate difficult situations and the importance of being able to process as a family.

End of life issues is merely one example of how family life can take a turn in a direction of improvement. They will never be easy, no matter how old we get, but becoming cold to such issues is not a good way to handle things. Real family support goes a long way.

Message from the Parish Finance Council

Dear Fellow St. Cletus Parishioners,

The Finance Council is a consultative body whose purpose is to advise the pastor and assist him with his financial responsibilities. The Council members are committed to understanding the state of the Parish's finances so that we can work with Fr. Elmer Romero and the Parish staff to understand the needs of the Parish and help form long-range plans to ensure that the Parish can meet its responsibilities.

Please take a look at the Balance Sheets, Statement of Revenue and Expenses, and Summary of the Parish Financial Report for the last fiscal year. We are pleased to note that both the Parish and the School had positive net operating incomes for the year. Just as importantly, we are pleased that the Parish has been able to do so while continuing and even expanding the important work of its ministries.

Starting with our 2022 message, the Finance Council has regularly addressed the Parish's debt to the Archdiocese stemming from the 2013 "To Teach Who Christ Is" fundraising campaign. In 2021 that debt stood at \$675,000. In the past three years the Parish has made payments of nearly \$160,000, including a \$60,000 payment during the past year. Although the debt remains substantial, it does not accrue any interest or penalties. The Finance Council continues to be cognizant of this obligation, and is committed to assisting the Parish to fully satisfy it.

2023 saw the return of the Fall Fest, which was a great success. That success was repeated last month, thanks to the efforts of the Parish staff and the many, many volunteers. Particular thanks go out to Sara and John Hodak, who have chaired the effort for more than two years. In addition to being a focal point for the Parish and the community, the Fall Fest raises important funds for the Parish and the school.

The members of the Finance Council are grateful for the efforts of Deacon Franco Foti (Parish Operations Director) and Jim Dion (Business Manager) for their efforts in compiling and preparing the financial statements. We would also like to acknowledge their tireless efforts to reduce Parish expenses while attending to necessary repairs and increased maintenance operations across the Parish campus.

As always, we ask for your continued support and prayers.

Summary of the Parish Annual Report for fiscal year 2024

- <u>Collections.</u> Sunday, Holy Day, and Christmas and Easter collections totaled \$1,514,679.34. While post-COVID Mass attendance is down by about 12.26% compared to pre-COVID attendance, our weekly collections are only down about 3.15% from pre-COVID levels. Of course, this is not just an issue with our Parish; this is an issue with all parishes. Thank you for your continued generosity.
- <u>"To Teach Who Christ Is" Debt.</u> The Parish reduced this debt by \$60,000, leaving a balance of \$515,109.74. This debt is explained in more detail in messages from the Finance Council in the preceding two fiscal years.
- <u>School Funding.</u> In previous years the Parish has provided financial support to the School. This past fiscal year, however, the School was financially self-sufficient. Due to the profit from the Fall Fest, cost savings in payroll and books and supplies, and fantastic fundraising efforts by students, parents, and supporters, the School had a net operating income of \$82,569.69.
- <u>Net Operating Income</u>. The Parish finished the June 30, 2024, fiscal year with a net operating income of \$214,598.13 (includes Food Pantry net income of \$71,445.16).
- <u>Investment Gains.</u> The Parish's investment accounts had a net unrealized gain of \$38,423.40. The school's investment account had a net unrealized gain of \$59,628.30. Because investment gains and losses are not part of the Parish's/School's normal operations, they are not considered in determining the parish's/school's operating income but rather considered Other Revenue.

CCW installs new Board Members, presents Camy Award and celebrates Fr. Mike's Birthday with live entertainment.


