Recently, Principal Gregory Porod and Jim Dion, business manager, brought to my attention that the main fire alarm panel in our school needed to be upgraded as soon as possible. Today, I am pleased to let you know that the St. Cletus School Fire Panel has been upgraded to a higher state of the art detection system. The total cost was \$13,020.00 which was paid by the repair funds we have (orange envelopes). Thank you for your generosity. Both the additional engineering background and previous parish business experience that he brings to his position is very much appreciated.

Sound System Updates

Dear Friends,

How often have you heard, thought, or said: "What did he say?" or "I didn't understand what was just said or read" when attending Mass?

We gather in church to celebrate the liturgy and to hear the word of God.

But as we all know, for the past couple years it has been increasingly difficult to understand what is being said inside our church at St. Cletus Parish. And it is becoming increasingly worse.

The simple explanation of the current situation is that the sound system that we have relied upon for so long has finally met its expiration date. Our sound equipment has outlived its expected longevity despite all efforts to keep it working. Complete failure could take place at any moment.

Major components have failed. Consequently, we have been limping along with borrowed components that are underperforming relative to our needs, do not have the power and are not capable of the necessary calibration to provide the clear sound that would allow us all to enjoy and hear the Word of God.

After a complete analysis of the needs that the sound and video systems require and after careful vetting of several proposals for a replacement system, we are raising the necessary funds to fulfill those needs.

We have begun to receive donations from members of the St. Cletus community toward achieving our goal. The expected cost of the new sound and video systems is \$110,000. As of this week we have raised \$21,265. Thank you to all those whose generous contributions have gotten us started.

As you can see in the graphic below, we have attained approximately 19% of the funds needed. A good start, but far from enough to acquire the remedy we so desperately need.





THEOPHANIES

Today's readings recount three theophanies, or particular manifestations of God's presence. The prophet Isaiah is caught up in a dramatic scene of heavenly worship, with a royal throne, burning embers, and seraphim singing, "Holy, holy, holy." Isaiah is overwhelmed. In the responsorial psalm, the assembly adds its own worship to that of the seraphim: "In the sight of the angels, I will sing your praises, Lord" (Psalm 138:1).

Paul reminds the Corinthians of his own experience of a post-Resurrection appearance of the Lord, making him an apostle, but one "born abnormally" (1 Corinthians 15:8), since he had no acquaintance with the earthly Jesus. The first of those who did know the earthly Jesus were surprised by fishing advice from the teacher who had commandeered Simon's boat, resulting in an extraordinary catch. Although less colorful than those of Isaiah or Paul, this theophany was just as overwhelming.

TODAY'S READINGS

First Reading — In a vision Isaiah is called to be a messenger for the LORD of hosts. Isaiah responds, "Send me!" (Isaiah 6:1-2a, 3-8)

Psalm — In the sight of the angels I will sing your praises, Lord (Psalm 138).

Second Reading — Paul reminds us of the gospel he preached through which we are saved, if we believe it (1 Corinthians 15:1-11 [3-8, 11]).

Gospel — Jesus directs Simon to take his boat into deep water for a miraculous catch of fish. Simon and his partners leave all to follow Jesus (Luke 5:1-11).

REFLECTION FROM THE USCCB SECRETARIAT OF PRO-LIFE ACTIVITIES

Fatherhood has its origins in God, who chose to reveal Himself to us as Our Father, sending his only Son for the sake of our salvation. Fathers therefore have a special role "in revealing and in reliving on earth the very fatherhood of God" (Familiaris consortio 25). Fathers



are called to exhibit "generous responsibility for the life conceived under the heart of the mother" (FC 25). They are uniquely entrusted with the protection and defense of both mother and child and, in this way, in safeguarding the sanctity of human life.

As evidenced in our world today, the role of the father "is of unique and irreplaceable importance" (FC 25). Often women choose abortion because they do not have the support of the child's father, or—even worse—the father of the child pressures her to make the decision to abort. At the same time, it is important to acknowledge with compassion that men can also be overwhelmed by an unexpected pregnancy and that society increasingly tells them that they should have no say in their children's lives. In the face of these false messages, we pray that expectant fathers will find courage in the example of Saint Joseph—who embraced the role of father amid difficult circumstances—and offer loving, life-affirming support to the mothers of their children.




