Finance Council Update

March 20, 2022

Dear Fellow Parishioner,

On behalf of Fr. Romero and the St. Cletus Parish Finance Council, I write this letter to appeal to your continued generosity to replace our outdated, worn and inadequate Church sound system. We are getting close to our stated goal of \$110,000.

Our current system is in dire need of replacing. It was originally installed in 2004 and continues to require constant maintenance and adjustments using "loaner" equipment operating with outdated technology.

A vendor has been chosen after completing a site survey and we await the initialization upon reaching our fundraising goal. This new, modern system will provide up to 15 years of quality audio and video, greatly diminish poor sound locations, provide a better balance between the spoken word and music and updating the system to allow integration of modern technology. Our new system would allow for enhanced reception for hearing impaired parish members and integrating other new technology.

We know that it may appear that your parish is always asking for more money. We understand this but believe this effort is needed. Mass attendees who can hear clearly both the spoken word and music will more likely be filled with the Holy Spirit. An improved experience will allow the words of our Mass to enter hearts and minds, perhaps even evangelizing, answering our long-recited Hail Mary prayer to help fallen away parishioners rejoin us, especially after the pandemic.

As you can see from the above graphic, we are getting close. As of March 13, 2022 we have raised nearly \$63,000, about 58% of the total goal. The total is probably higher as of this printing. We have raised this figure because of your continued generosity, prayer and your vision to enhance the experience in our shared community space.






