

## Pastor's Note

"I give thanks to my God always on your account for the grace of God bestowed on you in Christ Jesus, that in him you were enriched in every way, with all discourse and all knowledge." I Corinthians 1:4-5.

Dear Friends,

By the grace, mercy, and love of God today we celebrate First Sunday of Advent. It is the beginning of a new Liturgical Year. Recalling my early faith formation which I received at home, Advent prepares us for the birth of Jesus, the Son of God. The living Word of God that will be proclaimed to us during the upcoming Four Sundays of Advent will aid us in our desire to have our minds and hearts ready for Christmas. This is an exciting adventure.

Since Advent prepares us for the birth of Jesus, I kindly invite you to join me welcoming and embracing it with gratitude. I received this invitation during the celebration of Mass on Thanksgiving Day (Nov 23). To see our Gushers (Greeters and Ushers) welcoming all with a big smile, the altar of our church beautifully decorated, the number of people (children and adults) leading us in prayer and worship, and the pews taken by grateful and joyful people, was simply amazing. It was very special. It filled my heart with gratitude. It is with this sense of gratitude that I intend to prepare myself for the birth of Jesus. If you were out of town, I encourage you to watch it by visiting the parish website. I would like to offer my sincere gratitude to all for their prayer, participation, and contribution with Mass on Thanksgiving Day.

My heart was also filled with gratitude on November 18, 2023, when we hosted an Afternoon of Sharing of our Holy Moments in our parish. At 3:00 PM we unpacked and shared with each other highlights from the book we read: "This Is My Body," by Bishop Robert Barron. There were 42 people (English and Spanish) that took part in this adventure. At 4:00 PM we had Exposition and Benediction in Church. Over 50 people spent almost an hour in adoration. Since confession was available during adoration, many had the privilege of celebrating the Sacrament of Reconciliation. We had four confessors available. Then, we all attended the 5:00 PM Mass, which was beautifully celebrated by Fr. Ron Kalas. After Mass, we were invited to join the Eucharistic Revival Committee for dinner in the Parish Center. We were joined by over sixty people. There was one person who attended the entire afternoon who said to me, "Father you have such a friendly, warm, and welcoming parish community." I thanked him for his positive feedback and encouraged him to come back. Notice, this was his first time at our parish. I would like to offer my heartfelt gratitude to the members of the Eucharistic Revival Committee for their ministry, leadership, and special love they have for the Eucharist. Please hold them in prayer.

This coming Wednesday, December 6, 2023, we will be hosting the last Evening of Prayer and Reflection of this year, 2023, at 7:00 PM in Church. We will have Fr. Brendan Lupton as our special guest speaker. His theme is: "The Season of Advent: A New Beginning with Jesus." He is a professor of Patristics at Mundelein Seminary. He is a man of deep faith. He loves serving the Lord and leading others to him. He, through his reflection and witness, will offer us practical suggestions in our efforts to prepare ourselves for the birth of Jesus. I encourage you to seriously consider attending this privileged moment which the Lord himself is offering us.

On Saturday, December 9, 2023, we have two wonderful opportunities. The first one is the Mass with the Holy Anointing that we will be hosting at 10:00 AM in our beautiful Church. Please extend an invitation to your family and anyone else that you think would like to receive a special grace through the celebration of the sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. The principal celebrant and Homilist of this Mass will be Fr. Ron Kalas. As we know, he is a man of God and celebrates Mass with joy and love. Fr. Novick and I will concelebrate with Fr. Kalas. After Mass, we will have a lunch (Soup, salad, bread) in the Parish Center. I would like to thank Frank Foti, Operations Director, for his assistance and leadership with this celebration.

The second opportunity is that we are all are invited to attend an Advent Reconciliation Service, which will be hosted at St. John of the Cross Church on Saturday, December 9, 2023, at 1:30 PM. All the priests from St. Francis Xavier, St. John of the Cross, and St. Cletus will be serving as confessors at this special celebration of mercy and love. Hope to see you there.

St. Paul in today's second reading invites us to always give thanks to God for those who pray and worship God with us every weekend. It is truly a blessing and joy to pray and worship God as a community. Perhaps being aware and more intentional of those praying with us can also assist us in our preparation for the birth of Jesus.

May our sense of gratitude aid us in our preparation for Christmas!

## **Note From Father Mike**

#### Welcome to Liturgical Year 2024

Every year, the Church begins its calendar with the First Sunday of Advent and ends with the Saturday of the Final week of Ordinary Time (or the 34<sup>th</sup> week, or the Saturday after the Solemnity of Jesus Christ, King of the Universe). So as my tradition has been, I say to you "Happy New Year."

Advent poses to us an interesting way to start the Church calendar. So many days in the Church calendar are static feasts that we celebrate, days like the Immaculate Conception on December 8<sup>th</sup>. Of course, Christmas is always on December 25<sup>th</sup>. However, while we celebrate four Sundays in Advent, it's not always a full 28 days. That is because most of the Church calendar depends on which Sunday Easter falls, and that depends on (of all things) the moon. With figuring out Easter, we work backward to get the date of Ash Wednesday. It's a strange explanation. Some other time (no pun intended). It's the only time the Church has to think in reverse for time. Otherwise, She adapts/fuses with the Gregorian calendar to find the dates of other special feasts. The solemnity of the Assumption is always on August 15<sup>th</sup>, but if it falls on a Sunday, that Sunday's Ordinary Time readings are used at Mass, not the solemnity. I know. Why make it so confusing?

The bottom line is that Sunday, the Lord's day, is paramount. And as many days as it takes Earth to go around the Sun, there are 52 weeks in that revolution. Look up some of this stuff. It's absolutely fascinating to me.

Back to Advent? This year IS an anomaly. We get the SHORT version in the number of days. It begins on Sunday, December 3<sup>rd</sup>. The Fourth Sunday is on December 24<sup>th</sup> – a mere 21 days. Sure it means there are less shopping days, but there are also less days to prepare our souls for Jesus' SECOND coming at the end of time. Most people do not consider the second coming during Advent. They focus on remembering Jesus' nativity – His birthday, if you will. But if we are listening to the readings and gospels, there are great and even terrible images which make us think about our mortality. Hence, we ready our homes and give nice gifts to people, but our souls are supposed to be learning how to be as charitable as Jesus, transcending space and time to become a human being.

A couple of weeks ago, I had the chance to visit a neighboring parish for Mass. The priest told a story of a long-time friend of his whose daughter was having some emotional troubles and was looking for help from her father. They lived a few states apart. The father decided to wait to go see his daughter, claiming he was too busy to leave immediately. Unfortunately, she committed suicide a day or two later. We can hope that no one has this same sort of story to tell, but it's about preparing our own souls and helping other souls to be at peace, preferably not finding despair.

How do we prepare ourselves for the coming/return of Jesus? One way is to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Of course, we at St. Cletus have confessions offered every Saturday morning at 8:30am. However, on December 9<sup>th</sup> at 1pm, St. John of the Cross is hosting our three-parish Advent Reconciliation service as they traditionally do. When Lent comes, both St. Cletus and St Francis Xavier each host a Reconciliation Service. Nevertheless, no matter where you do so, get right with God and with your brothers and sisters before Jesus comes.

The Church uses darker violet vestments, and the décor of the church is stark and simple. The Advent wreath is supposed to be in a prominent spot in the church, yet, hopefully not "competing" with the altar. I once heard it referred to as the original Advent calendar, only it was weeks, not days. It is within the décor of Advent that helps to prepare us for getting the decorations for Christmas put up as efficiently as possible too, especially in this shortened season.

I don't know what our Arts and Environment team has in store for us this year for Christmas, but I hope that if they put out an ask for help, at least a few will come forward. Remember, we still have TWO spaces to make ready (the church AND the Parish Center gymnasium.







