Notes from Fr. Bob...


21ST SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

The story is told of two elderly priests, both nearing the end of their days, who made a compact. Whichever of them died first, he would return and tell the other what life beyond the grave was like. Eventually Fr. Joe died and was buried. Some months later Fr. Bill was sitting in his room. It was Saturday night; he was busy preparing his homily – or was it watching football? In any event, he suddenly became aware of a presence: Fr. Joe was standing there before him. “Joe,” he gasped “it’s you. Tell me, what it is like in heaven?” “Well,” replied Joe “you’d be surprised who’s there.” There was a pause: “And you’d be surprised who isn’t,” and with that he was gone.

It was hardly the answer Bill had expected. Much the same might be said of the man who questioned Jesus in today’s gospel. He didn’t get the answer he expected. Mind you, his question could hardly have come at a more inappropriate moment. Jesus is on his way to Jerusalem, where suffering and death await him, while all the questioner is concerned about is the speculative issue of how many people will be saved: “Will there be only a few?” he enquires, rather pessimistically.

Jesus’ reply must have brought him down to earth. He says in effect: never mind the numbers game, your task is to work hard – literally, to struggle – so that you’ll be able “to enter by the narrow door” that leads to salvation. You may be a Jew, you may even be Roman Catholic, members of God’s people, but that doesn’t mean you can slip through with the crowd. It’s not enough that you belong to the “in” group. There’s no way through the narrow door without personal struggle.

Then Jesus puts it another way. This time he speaks not of “a narrow door” but of a closed door and God himself is pictured as the owner of the house. When the householder has locked up for the night – a gentle hint that earthly life does not last for ever – it will be no use trying to get in by offering excuses, we ate and drank with you, we heard you preaching in the streets. The householder will not be impressed; he will reply: “I don’t know you”. Jesus goes on to speak of the anguish they will suffer, as Jews, if the great Jewish patriarchs, Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, and the prophets, are all there at the messianic banquet, while they themselves are locked out. It would be more galling still, if they were to see among the insiders, people from the four corners of the globe. That would mean that some of God’s own people had been replaced at the banquet table by non-Jews, by Gentiles. Those always regarded as first would

be last, and

It needs little imagination to translate the message of today’s gospel into a message for ourselves. We have been blessed in the most extraordinary way, even more than the Jewish people of old. We have been baptized, we have been adopted as the children of God, we are members of the Church, God’s chosen people, we have the sacraments to meet our needs at every juncture of life, we have the scriptures to bring us God’s Good News, we have the support of our fellow-believers. Here at Mass we cannot forget that we even eat and drink at the Lord’s Table. Such blessings ought to fill us with gratitude. The one they must not do is lead us to presumption. If we reach heaven it will not be simply because we are Catholics, or even because we receive the Lord himself in the Eucharist. We shall reach heaven because of the gracious goodness of God on the one hand and our own humble efforts on the other.

On that day we may discover that the response Fr. Bill received from his friend had more than a grain of truth in it. Looking round the banquet table of heaven, we may be surprised – by those who are there, and, perhaps, by those who are not. However, as we have been reminded today, our task is not to waste time on pointless speculation. What matters is that, avoiding complacency, we strive to live out our faith in our daily lives while putting all our trust in our God whose love is strong and whose faithfulness endures for ever.

WELCOME THE STRANGER

We have become accustomed to seeing pictures in the media and stories on the news about immigrants from Latin America and refugees from Syria fleeing violence and destruction in their own countries, trying to make their way to a safe place. We have also seen the reactions of people who want to keep them away from their countries, who fail to welcome the stranger and the helpless children. Have we forgotten Jesus' call to comfort the homeless and the stranger? "They shall bring all your brothers and sisters from all the nations . . . to Jerusalem, my holy mountain, says the LORD."

In the three readings for this day, we are told that we are to welcome these strangers, to welcome the discipline of the Lord, which leads to peace, and to "strive to enter through the narrow gate" into the glory of God's own homeland, the reign of God.

ST. JOHNS ABBEY REFLECTION

Young people never read obituaries. How could they ever be of any interest to a twenty-year old or a teenager? The elderly read them so as not to miss the death of a friend or old neighbor. Anyone who reads them must do it with mixed emotions. We read of the death of an eighty-eight-year old. Unless we're eighty-seven, we think that's pretty well up there. The death of a forty-seven-year old mother of three from cancer strikes us as more tragic. A fourteen-year old dead of leukemia is still harder to take. The death of a twenty-six-year old in a car or motorcycle accident seems so unnecessary, so avoidable.

Depending on our age we ask ourselves how or why we should still be alive. Shouldn't we be thankful, more determined to use well the life and vitality we have? At times I think most of the lessons to be learned from observing life and what is around us are all summed up in this: they are invitations, reminders, alarms telling us to use the moments, the days, the years well and from our depths. Generally, these lessons tell us, rule out certain ways of using time as beneath the dignity of ourselves and of time itself.

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is the Catholic Church's adult faith formation program which invites adults and

teens who have never been baptized, who have been baptized Catholic but not completed the sacraments of initiation (Eucharist and Confirmation) or who have been baptized in another faith and wish to become Catholic, to explore their journey of faith in the life of the Catholic Church.

The RCIA gives people on a faith journey an opportunity to "come and see" not only what the Catholic Church and a life of faith in it is all about, but also an opportunity to explore how the Lord may be calling them into his life in a more complete way.

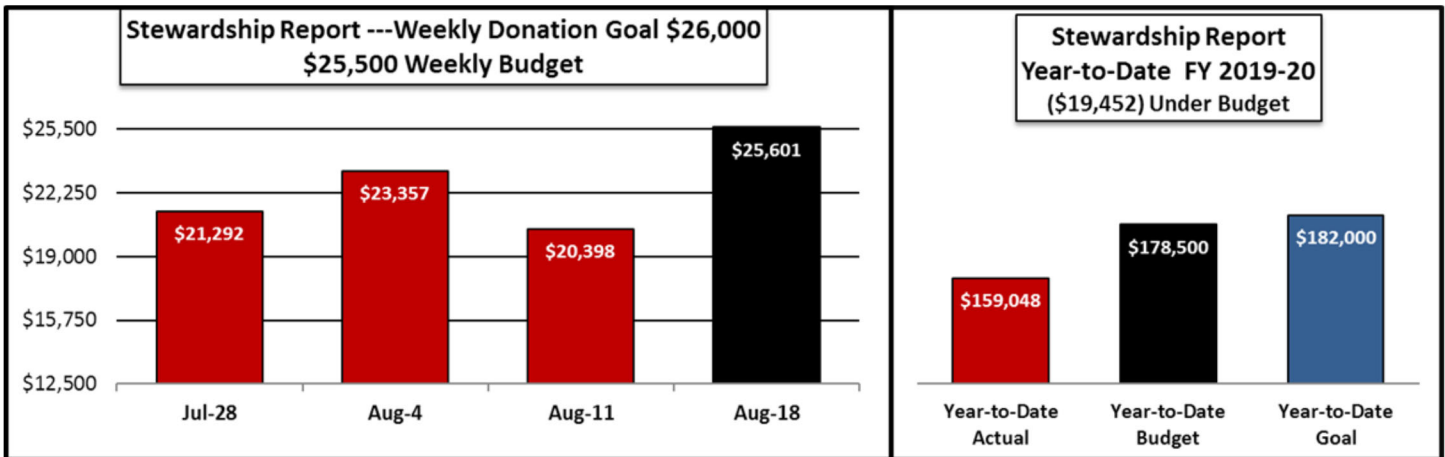
