



### Pastor's Note

"Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!" Mark 11:9b

Today we are blessed to celebrate Palm Sunday. Aided by the living word of God and the Holy Spirit, we remember how the crowds went out to meet Christ. They were calling out: "Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord." Then, we listened the Passion and death of our Lord. This means that this week, we are set out to meet Christ in his passion, in those days of his suffering.

### **Note From Father Mike**

### Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord – Covenant personified

Brothers and sisters, while we still have a couple of days before the celebration of the Sacred Paschal Triduum – Thursday of the Lord's Supper, the Passion of the Lord (Good Friday), and the Easter Vigil in the Holy Night – today we hear about the climax to this covenant journey we've been following for the last five weeks. Yes, we are entering into Holy Week. Palm Sunday remains one of the most populated days in churches around the globe. It also remains a mystery to most deacons, priests, and bishops as to just what is it that brings people to the Church in droves on Ash Wednesday and Palm Sunday, yet Christmas and Easter attendance have tended to drop over the years. But that is a subject for another day.

Jesus makes His way into the "Holy City" – Jerusalem, knowing full well what awaits Him. It's the right time for His arrival as Passover is at hand, a night to remember. As Abraham journeyed to a mount to sacrifice his beloved son Isaac, here comes THE Son of God in preparation for the self-sacrifice of His own life riding on a donkey (the same beast of burden that took He and His family to Egypt when He was born in order to escape the wrath of King Herod). This time, Jesus is welcomed into the city by myriads of people who still were hoping that He was the warrior/Messiah that would free Israel from the rule of Rome.

Yes, he celebrates the Passover with the Apostles. It's a joyful celebration that changes direction very quickly – almost without warning – at Gethsemane. All of the prescriptions and prophecies have come to fruition, to this moment. We hear in another place in Scripture Jesus telling us "Just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the desert, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, so that everyone who believes in him may have eternal life" (John 3:14-15). He plainly references the scene in the book of Numbers when Moses was told to make a staff with a bronze serpent that anyone who had been bitten by one of the seraph serpents would be healed when they looked upon it. Jesus IS the Lamb of sacrifice (atonement for our sins) AND the bronze serpent who heals our "sin-bitten" souls. Now that's a sign! The sacrifice of His own flesh AND His divine ability to heal the soul – all in one person, in one act of love. What could say "You will be my people and I will be your God" any clearer than that? What could say "I love you" any more perfectly?

I hope and pray that Lent has been fruitful up to now. I also hope that you will be able to celebrate any or all of the Sacred Paschal Triduum with us. And most of all, I hope you will come to St. Cletus to celebrate Easter morning joy with this fabulous community!



### **Eucharistic Revival Car Caravan Pilgrimage**



As Eucharistic People, Are You Ready for a Local Real Presence Road Trip?

Following the National Eucharistic Revival commissioning at the parish level, as One Body in Christ, and led by the Holy Spirt to center on The Eucharist, the Vicariate V, Deanery Parishes: Our Lady of the Woods, St. Damian, St. Elizabeth Seton, St. Francis of Assisi, St. George, St. Julie Billiart, St. Michael and St. Stephen Deacon and Martyr Parishes, collaborated to bring our faith communities together to worship and adore the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity, of Christ that will culminate with a Eucharistic Celebration.

On Sunday, April 14, 2024, as the loaves and the fish multiplied, do the same in your vehicle with family, friends, and neighbors, of all generations as we embark on our inaugural Eucharistic Revival Car Caravan Pilgrimage. Our pilgrimage

will take us to our local holy sites and parishes. In addition, we will enjoy an afternoon of spiritual enrichment focusing on the True Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist.

Depart in a car caravan procession from St. Michael at 4:30 PM to St. Francis of Assisi (15050 Wolf Rd., Orland Park, IL. 60467), Arrive at St. Francis of Assisi at 4:45 PM,

Depart in a car caravan procession from St. Francis of Assisi at 5:25 PM to Our Lady of the Woods (10731 West 131st. Street, Orland Park, IL. 60462), Arrive at Our Lady of the Woods at 5:40 PM for 6:00 PM, Mass.

\*Upon arrival at each parish, we will exit our vehicles and go into the Church to adore the Real Presence of Christ.

- Clergy: priests, and deacons, from the grouping parishes and the Knights of Columbus Honor Guard will
  participate in the Mass.
- A fellowship gathering with light refreshments will take place following the Our Lady of the Woods Mass.
   Water and Soda will be provided.
- Donations of snacks and desserts are greatly appreciated. Please consider gluten free. Please drop them off at Our Lady of the Woods Parish Office on Friday, April 12<sup>th</sup> or Sunday, April 14<sup>th</sup> between 8:00am -Noon. Please label it Car Caravan Pilgrimage. Or you can bring it with you on the Car Caravan Pilgrimage and drop it off before Mass in the Our Lady of the Woods narthex.

In addition to our local parish support, we have authorization from the Archdiocese of Chicago Legal Department and Insurance Company, as well as the Orland Park and Cook County local law enforcement agencies. We are very excited to offer this one-of-a-kind opportunity to share our faith and celebrate the True Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist.

### Lenten Reflection

From my perspective, Holy Week is the ultimate roller coaster ride. During Lent, we climb and climb and climb to the top, and then starting on Palm Sunday it roars we do the Chrism Mass at the Cathedral on Tuesday. It's down the big steep hill at top speed, and then on Easter Sunday we glide in to the calm joy of the Easter Season.

This year I've had the joy of walking with our adult catechumen and candidate, who are just delightful people who will be a wonderful part of our community. They are ready to be received and I am proud of the journey they've undertaken. They will be joined by one of our Teen Seekers, who will also be receiving all her sacraments, and by at least one confirmand who will be receiving the sacrathem! (And if you will be joining them at the Easter Vigil, please come to the reception afterward and make them feel welcome!)

This week we begin our Holy Week celebrations with Palm Sunday, of course. Many Palm Sunday masses begin with what is called the "Solemn Entrance," where a separate gospel is read, the palms are blessed, and then a procession with palms goes through the church. This, of course, commemorates Jesus's entry into Jerusalem. I once had a RCIA candidate ask me why the "readings were out of order" on Palm Sunday. Actually, it's not that they're "out of order," but if the community uses the Solthat rite. Once the procession goes to the altar, the mass is the same and the readings are "in order." The Solemn Entrance and procession is not required, but we will be

doing it at least at some of our masses this weekend.

Holy Week is our big week of the year. In Chicago customarily done on the morning of Holy Thursday in other places, but it's been done on the Tuesday of Holy Week in Chicago for many years. The important point is that the Holy Oils (our Oil of the Sick, the Oil of Catechumens and the Sacred Chrism) for the year are blessed by the Cardinal at this mass, and we will take home our box of new oils to use for the year. The Oils are presented to the community as part of the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday.

Holy Thursday, of course, is the beginning of the ment of Confirmation at the vigil. We welcome all of Paschal Triduum, the holiest three days of our calendar, and one liturgy stretching over three nights through the Easter Vigil. It commemorates the Last Supper and the institution of the Eucharist. The Good Friday liturgy takes up where the Mass of the Lord's Supper leaves off. It is the only day of the year where there is no mass held anywhere in the church. We venerate the cross and we hear the long gospel from the book of John. The Easter Vigil begins in the darkness of sunset and finishes in the bright lights of the church. It is on this night when our catechumens and candidates become part of the Catholic Church, and we would love for you to join us and them.

After the Easter Vigil, the roller coaster rolls in to emn Entrance, there is an extra gospel reading as part of the Easter Sunday masses. We celebrate the Resurrection of the Lord and we go forward renewed in our faith.

### **Eucharistic Revival Reflection**

#### The Eucharist is everywhere

As much as we humans like to assume we are eminently reasonable and in control of our decisions, it's undeniable that we rely on biases and mental shortcuts that are often unnoticed. Biases usually have a bad reputation. Confirmation bias, for example, can lead us to dismiss important details and focus only on what we want to hear. But we can also use biases—let's call them primers—to help us think in new ways.

Whatever you focus on, you'll tend to find more of. That's the crux of what psychologists call the "frequency illusion." You have probably experienced this when you learn about a new product and then begin seeing it everywhere, or when you learn a new word and then begin to see it in print more than ever. Once you have been exposed to something, your brain starts flagging it. It's not actually more frequent than before you learned it, you just notice it more.

In this year of focusing on the Eucharist, I have found myself noticing Eucharistic images everywhere I look in scripture. By priming myself to recognize the themes of sacrifice, spiritual banquet, and atonement, it becomes easier to grasp just how central the Eucharist is to our faith and Christian life. It's not a compartmentalized sacrament or a one-off story in the Gospels. Rather, it encompasses the core of what we believe about God and our relationship with him.

As we enter Holy Week, challenge yourself to find the Eucharist in every liturgy. You'll hear the words of institution during Palm Sunday's Gospel, and see Jesus humbly serving his disciples during Holy Thursday's Mass of the Lord's Supper. You'll notice parallels between the Hebrew Passover lamb that is slaughtered and eaten and our Eucharistic feast tied to Jesus' self-sacrifice. You'll know that Jesus did not leave us in his death, but continues to be present with us—and not just in spirit, but in his resurrected body we receive every time we celebrate Mass.

There's so much to find. "For everyone who asks receives, and everyone who searches finds, and for everyone who knocks, the door will be opened" (Mt 7:8).
