Pastor's Note

Dear Friends,

I am delighted to share with you that our Sharing Our Hopes and Dreams on September 13th, 2021, was fantastic! We were blessed to be joined by over 150 people. From the beginning of our gathering, I noticed that everyone who came was ready to engage the process, which gave me much joy and peace.

As we gathered, we praised God with a song and prayed with a Scripture passage (Romans 15:13) which was followed by a brief reflection by Fr. Dan Costello. Then, we spent 15 minutes talking about our Hopes and Dreams for our parish at each table. After that, we were given two minutes per table to share our Hopes and Dreams with all present in the room. We concluded our gathering praising God with a song and receiving a blessing.

Witnessing and listening to Our Hopes and Dreams shared I truly felt the presence of God among us. It was His spirit that brought us together. It was He who inspired us to voice Our Hopes and Dreams for our Parish. It is Him that want us to stay together. It is He who strengthens our faith. It is He who wants us to keep our parish alive and vibrant. It is He who invites us to continue to share our faith and joy in the Lord with everyone we meet and spend time with. And this is something that you parishioners do so beautifully. I am so happy to be part of your life in the Lord.

Please know that at our next Parish Staff meeting (October 13), we will diligently process, study, and pray with all information that was gathered at Sharing Our Hopes and Dreams night. I am going to ask each Pastoral Staff member to integrate in their ministry what was shared on September 13. As I mentioned to you earlier, I will also share with you the highlights through the bulletin immediately after our next Staff meeting.

Today, I am pleased to announce that there is already one initiative that has germinated from the Sharing Our Hopes and Dreams night. It is called "Sharing Our Blessings." We will have our first Sharing Our Blessings on Monday, October 18, 2021, at 7:00 PM in the Church. We will pray, sing together, listen a Scripture passage, hear blessings shared by two parishioners, and spend time with one another. Please come and join us.

Bellow you will see some reflections that I have received from those who attended the Sharing Our Hopes and Dreams night. Enjoy reading them.

"It was encouraging to see so many people take the time to come to the meeting on Monday night. No pastor in our memory has ever asked for whole parish input. Everyone put thought into their ideas and discussion was lively at our table. It was hard limiting our suggestions/hopes to just three. However, other tables mentioned the ideas that we had to leave out. The main concern was the need to reach out to our young people, and the fear that we are losing them. It was significant that no young people were at the meeting. Maybe there should be another meeting just for them? The next step will be the need to prioritize the wide range of hopes and dreams into what can and should be done. We can then create concrete action plans for turning the dreams into reality. We need to take these ideas/suggestions/hopes and start working on them, and not wait for someone to do it for us."

"The parishioners of St. Cletus rose to the occasion to offer their hopes for the future at our recent parish encounter. It was positive and uplifting to see the parish gym filled with so many people and ideas! Working together as a unified parish with a central vision of spreading the Good News, we will be able to work toward accomplishing the hopes and wishes of all. Thank you to the attendees for making it such a productive evening."

"I was excited to be with our parishioners as they brainstormed their hopes and dreams for our parish. The ideas and hopes that were generated were insightful and will help the parish staff to begin to discern ways that we can begin to incorporate the hopes into our parish ministries. I look forward to the inclusion of our parishioners in moving forward to begin to bring these hopes and dreams alive within the parish and our many ministries. As the Body of Christ, every person has their individual charisms and gifts, and we will need each person to contribute those gifts as we move forward as a parish family to reinvigorate our parish."

"Many parishioners filled the gym to share their hopes and dreams for our parish, including our church, school, ministries, prayer, and more. The ideas were flowing and the energy in the room was inspiring. I thought it was a great first step in moving forward with our new pastor. The next steps will be to turn the ideas into action, and I look forward to being part of the process. Our table talked about the ultimate goal of forming disciples. I hope that many of the next steps will help us to deepen our relationship with God, offer opportunities to serve God and others, and also strengthen and build the community of St. Cletus."

“On Monday 9/13, I had the opportunity to attend Fr. Elmer's "Hopes for the Parish" meeting and it was an amazing encounter. It was one of the first times I witnessed the parish and school work toward the same goals in an organized fashion. Dan, we received clear instructions from Fr. Elmer for 24 tables' discussions. After the top three ideas from each table were shared with the entire group. Each idea was transcribed and visible on the 2 overhead screens. Major talking points were inclusivity focusing on all age groups and the Hispanic members of our parish, school enhancements, and evangelization. The program ended with prayer and song. Thanks to the planning by Father Elmer and others, the meeting kept on schedule. He expressed appreciation for every idea which made speaking in public much easier for some of us. 
