Pastor's Note

"... he breathed on them and said to them, 'Receive the Holy Spirit," John 20:22

Dear Parishioners,

As we celebrate Pentecost Sunday, we have an opportunity to intentionally spend time and grow in relationship with the Holy Spirit. A good place to start can be today's readings. Each of them speaks to us so beautifully about the Holy Spirit. Another place can be the Catholic Church. Reflect carefully how the Holy Spirit has sustained, guided, and animated the Catholic Church since its foundation. Another good place can be your own life. As you look carefully to your life, you will notice the footprint of the Holy Spirit in it since the moment you were conceived.

Noticing the presence and the work of the Holy Spirit in our Church and our lives today is critical. I am pleased to share with you two experiences where I have felt the power of the Holy Spirit.



First, the process of Renew My Church. As a parish we attended five meetings. Then, we were asked to write a document highlighting the blessings/strengths of our parish and some opportunities for growth. We successfully prepared and submitted the document to the Archdiocese for approval. On Monday, May 23rd, 2022, at 7:00 PM we joyfully received the news that our parish will continue to serve as we have been doing since 1951. I received the news as an affirmation of your witness, generosity, and kindness.

We will continue to collaborate with the Archdiocese as we engage the next phase of Renew My Church, which is the art of Making Disciples, Building Communities, and Inspiring Witness. To learn more about this, please visit www.renewmychurch.org

Second, on Saturday, May 28th, 2022, at 9:00 AM, Deacon Joel Pius was ordained priest by Bishop Mar Jacob Angadiath in Loganville, GA. The Liturgy was joyful and inspiring. There were no pews left in church. The music was engaging and vibrant. Art and environment were thoughtfully arranged. Parish leaders exercised their ministry with care and love. There were over 30 priests who attended the ordination. Throughout the whole liturgy, I could not help but to sense the warm presence of the Holy Spirit among us.

During his first three years at Mundelein Seminary, I was blessed to know and accompany him as his Spiritual Director. It was such a blessing and a joy to be present at his priesthood ordination. I am confident that he will eagerly share his energy, enthusiasm, and the joy of the Gospel with all.

Finally, it is amazing and encouraging to notice in our daily lives and activities how Jesus Christ continues to pour the Holy Spirit upon us.

Summer is coming fast

Don't forget to register for Religious Education Classes!

The St. Cletus Religious Education Program has programs to fit the needs of each parish family. Our Early Childhood Program provides beginning religious instruction to children ages 3-5. Songs, crafts and stories are used to instill a sense of community and introduce these young members of our parish to Jesus' word. For families with children in public schools, we have Religious Education Traditional Classes and sacramental preparation for children in $1^{st} - 8^{th}$ Grade, where the children have an encounter with Jesus through scripture, service experiences, interactive activities and games, and classroom experiences. These classes occur on Sunday mornings from 10:00-11:30 a.m. or on Monday evenings from 6-7:30 p.m. throughout the academic year.

Please take the time to complete the registration forms to register your children for RE classes for the 2022-2023 academic year! **Registrations are due by July 6, 2022. Please be sure to register asap to get the class date/ time that is best for your family.** Registration forms can be found online at stcletusparish.com/re, or in the Parish Center and Religious Education Office. *Please take the time to register today!*

To get priority placement, please consider volunteering your time and talents in one of the following ways:

- As a Catechist Catechists receive weekly lesson plans and all resource materials to conduct an interactive lesson.
- As a Classroom Aide Aides assist the Catechist weekly in the classroom
- As an Office Volunteer during class time Office Volunteers assume responsibility weekly for assisting with the operations during RE classes
- As a member of our Religious Education Advisory Board – Board Members meet monthly with the Director of Religious Education and the Pastor to provide input and feedback on the Religious Education program, and to assist in the implementation of various programs.

• As a Substitute Teacher – subs are sometimes needed to cover for a Catechist who cannot attend one of our scheduled classes.

Why Be a Catechist?

The best way to learn is to teach.

The resources and materials you will be exposed to will refresh and expand your knowledge of the Church. More than likely, you will discover that you learn more than you ever expected.

Your faith will come alive.

Spending time helping others "fix their gaze on Jesus" means your gaze is turned on Him as well. You will see how being a catechist brings you joy!

You become an active participant in one of the essential areas of a Church community.

The laity are uniquely entrusted with the role of working in union with their priests to bring the message of faith to full bloom among diverse parish environments and beyond.

You assist in bringing Christ to others. A catechist meets a person in their faith journey and walks with them.

You practice stewardship.

By donating your time and services on behalf of others, you demonstrate, in a concrete way, the importance of Christ in your life.

You show your own family that you value the faith. Taking time out of your life to teach the faith shows your children, grandchildren, siblings and family members that you put a high priority on religious education.

You become a role model. As a catechist, you get to be a model and trusted adult to young people in your community.

The St. Cletus Religious Education Office is still looking for volunteers as Catechists and Aides in Grades 1-8 on Sunday Mornings and Monday evenings, and for our Early Childhood Program on Sunday mornings. Catechists must be adults 18 years or older, and Aides can be Adults, High School students, or Jr. High students. 

THE SPIRIT'S ACTIVE POWER

The mystery of the Trinity refers to one God in three persons. We frequently acknowledge Jesus as "the second person of the Trinity," but referring also to the Spirit as a 'person' comes less naturally. In religious art, the Holy Spirit often appears as a dove or, as in today's reading from the Acts of the Apostles, tongues of fire. Much rarer are images of the Spirit as a "person" in recognizable human form. Today's readings do not settle the issue of how to picture the Spirit, but they certainly give shape to the Spirit's active power in the world and in each human heart. In Acts, the Spirit enables people to speak and understand a variety of languages. Paul's letter to the Corinthians praises the Spirit for all kinds of spiritual gifts, services, and "workings." Finally, in John's Gospel, Jesus calls the Spirit our Advocate and our divine teacher. Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co.
