

Notes from Fr. Bob...

SIXTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Jesus trained his disciples to be good shepherds, to go out to the villages and to preach and teach and cure people. When they returned he advised them to take a rest in a quiet place - someone must take care of the careers - and so they set off for a lakeside holiday. Only, when they arrive, they find that the hungry crowds are there before them, waiting for some spiritual food. So this time, the Lord himself sets to work. His disciples can take a back seat and rest awhile. Jesus himself will preach and teach. In this way the prophecy of Jeremiah is fulfilled, which said that God would raise up a virtuous branch for David, a man who will be wise, who will practice honesty and integrity in the land. Jesus is the integrity of God.

Saint Paul takes up the theme today and shows how our Lord appeals to people across all religious and political divides. He isn't on any one side against another. The Lord will break down all the bad feelings between people. No enemies, no strangers, only friends. In himself Jesus makes a single New Man out of people, who want to be enemies. He restores peace in his own body on the cross. He reconciles us to God.

So you cannot follow Our Lord or be part of Our Lord and still have enemies. It cannot be. It has to be peace: peace with people who are far away, peace with people who are near. Political slogans often say, 'This is the last chance for peace', but this cannot be true. The work of peace is too important for last chances. Every day the call goes out to gather the scattered sheep. Every day people meet with fear and with terror. In response to this, the Good Shepherd sends out his disciples with orders to gather the scattered sheep, to care for them and to help them to grow and increase.

In every generation the Lord has been our Good Shepherd. In every country in the world you will find his image, his picture, and his people. Through all the ages, in every way, the Good Shepherd cares for his flock. Now he speaks to us today and asks us to see the large crowds of our own world, sheep without a shepherd. He asks us to have compassion for people who are lost and confused.

exhorts us to take responsibility in their regard, to set ourselves to teach them at some length.



VOLUNTEERS NEEDED



The Religious Education Office currently has openings in a few key volunteer ministries. Please read about them below, and prayerfully consider joining this awesome team!

Catechist: The classroom teacher who actively shares their faith and love of Jesus with the children. You do not need previous experience – we provide training, all

materials and resources, even written lesson plans! Catechists receive a \$100 tuition credit or stipend at the end of the year. We currently have openings in Grades 1-8 on Sunday mornings and Monday evenings, as well as openings in our Early Childhood Religious Education classes. Co-teaching or Partner teaching is also an option here!

Aide: The classroom helper who assists the Catechist and students in the classroom as needed. You do not need previous experience – just a desire to help and share your faith with the kids! Adult Aides receive a \$50 tuition credit or stipend at the end of the year. We currently have openings in Grades 1-5 on Sunday mornings or Monday evenings, as well as openings in our Early Childhood Religious Education classes.

Religious Education Board: We are looking to create a new Religious Education Board who will serve in an advisory capacity for the Director of Religious Education and the Pastor. This board will meet once six times a year and assist with projects to improve our RE program, offer more programs for parents, work to find ways to recognize and affirm our volunteer staff, and provide important feedback to the RE staff pertaining to the RE program and sacramental preparation. Board members receive a \$100 tuition credit or stipend at the end of the year. Please consider volunteering your time to help to improve our program!

Office Helper: This volunteer will assist us in the office during regularly scheduled RE class times. This person will answer phones, monitor children arriving late/leaving early, assist in maintaining a safe environment for our students in the building, and assist with attendance. Office Helpers will receive a \$100 tuition credit or stipend at the end of the year. We currently have additional openings on Sunday mornings or Monday evenings.

Substitute Catechist: Occasionally, a Catechist may be absent or need to miss a class. We need people who are willing to serve in this capacity. Volunteers can stipulate a preference for subbing on Sunday morning or Monday evening.

Attendance at a Protecting God's Children session is required of all volunteers 18+ who work with children. This is mandated by the Archdiocese of Chicago. Trainings will take place here at St. Cletus at the end of the summer.

REST IN THE LORD

For several weeks we have listened to readings that have recounted just how arduous the work of prophets and disciples can be. In today's Gospel, the Lord Jesus listens to the reports of those he had sent out "two by two" to minister to the people. After the apostles reported what they had done, Jesus, recognizing their fatigue, says, "Come away by yourselves to a deserted place and rest awhile" (Mark 6:31). Perhaps this is what the Lord is telling his disciples in the year 2018 as well. We need to pause on our journey of discipleship and simply rest in the Lord. Sunday Mass provides many opportunities for quiet times, particularly during the periods of silence following the readings. Why not take the time today to allow the saving word of the Lord to penetrate your heart during those silent times? TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

The American Revolution cleared the way for freedom of religion in the former colonies, since the colonies had always been a more religiously tolerant place than the old country. Even so, colonial laws restricted the practice of the Catholic faith, and just as in England, Americans who desired to be priests or nuns had to go to the Netherlands or France.

As political storm clouds gathered in France, an American woman, Mother Bernardina Matthews, the prioress of the Hoogstraeten Carmel in Holland, made a brave move. With two other American nuns, her nieces, and a Dutch sister, she came to Port Tobacco, Maryland, in 1790. Within twenty years the community had grown to twenty, although by 1823 their farm failed and they had to move to Baltimore and open a school. The Carmelite order requires contemplation and cloister, so in time the school was closed. The Port Tobacco land had long since been sold, but in 1976 a community of nuns was able to return thanks to loyal neighbors who had worked for forty years for their restoration. Today, our original American convent is fully alive in prayer, hard work, and strong community.

Youth Ministry - Mission Trip News

Our nine teens and two adult chaperones had a phenomenal week serving in Chicago last week during our Mission Trip! They spent the week living in Mt. Carmel High School on the south side of Chicago, and serving the clients of St. Leonard's Ministries on the west side of Chicago. St. Leonard's Ministries provides a community-based setting in which formerly incarcerated men and women can achieve a productive and whole life. During the week our group learned about and lived various social justice issues, understanding the importance of second chances, respect and dignity of each person, and how to resist judging others based on race, creed or reputation.

Our teens did many things to assist the ministry including organizing and cleaning storage basements full of clothing and freezers of food, cleaning up litter and landscaping gardens, and even hosted a lemonade giveaway to help spread awareness of St. Leonard's in the west side community. Each day they dined with the clients and residents of St. Leonards, and learned firsthand how they are working to rebuild their lives and reenter society, many after long periods of incarceration. Everyone agreed that they grew emotionally and intellectually over the week. We are so proud of them and how well they represented St. Cletus parish. We are so blessed to have these amazing teens who are willing to sacrifice in order to make a difference! God bless Robbie O'Shea and Deacon Stuart who gave of themselves to lead these teens all week. Look for more stories of their amazing trip over the next few weeks!




