A Note from the Associate Pastor's Desk

Many of Jesus' disciples who were listening said, "This saying is hard; who can accept it?"

Here we are at the end of the Bread of Life discourse. Jesus has just poured out His whole being in words, teaching us about what we know to be the Eucharist, after having fed thousands of people with 5 loaves of bread and two fish. He relates this amazing event to his followers so that they could understand maybe a little better by bringing up a story from the time of Moses. His people in the desert were starving and he prayed, and God provided manna. The people with Jesus of His time were hungry and it was getting late. God provided – His very self. "I am the Bread of Life... whoever eats this bread will live forever." And now they tell Jesus "This is difficult?"

Of course, it is.

Yet, I come back to the question, why is this difficult even for today's Catholics? It's because we still only what we want to see, what we are able to observe. I come back to the topic I touched on last week. Space.

We hear from physicists and astronomers unfathomable statistics about the solar system, the planets, how old the sun is, how black holes form, the distance of light years, that our own Milky Way and the Andromeda galaxy are going to collide in 5,000,000,000 years, and SO much more. I am sure that the given mathematical calculations, it's all true. Yet, human beings – the most intelligent life forms in Creation being made in God's image and likeness – are so quick to say yes to something none of us will be around to see in our lifetime light years away from Earth, but they can't say yes to Jesus not only being able to give us His very own Body and Blood as food and drink, but also doing it. And the Eucharist isn't the only mystery Catholics have a hard time with. The Immaculate Conception of the

Blessed Virgin Mary is a big one. Many Catholics don't believe she remained a virgin her whole life either, and that at the end of her earthly life, she was assumed into heaven body and soul.

There are the Annunciation, The Nativity, The Resurrection, The Ascension, Pentecost, the teaching on the Holy Trinity, and, miracles that have been witnessed; yet, since the sciences can't prove these, who can accept it all? Why are we so quick to dismiss faith? Many of the followers left Jesus and returned to their former ways of life. Will we?

I'm sure you've heard us tell you at some point about one of our professors at the seminary who would tell us discipleship is not for the faint of heart. It's hard. Jesus never promised it would be easy. In fact, if we are going to be true followers, then we need to be willing to take up our own cross and walk the lonely road with him.

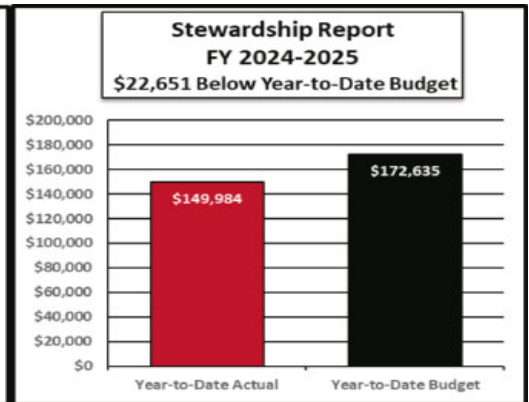
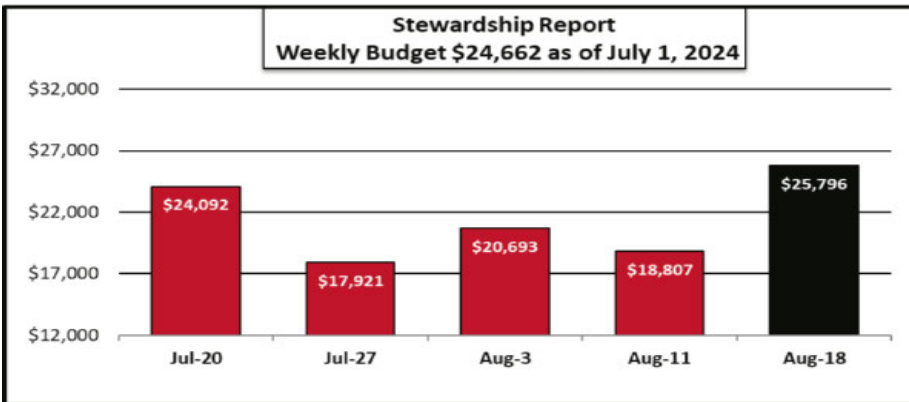
XXI Sunday in Ordinary Time, cycle B.

How ironic! The gift of living bread had become the reason why many broke away and severed ties with Jesus. Even those most readily disposed to Jesus chose to leave him. No less surprising is the fact that Jesus offered no easy remedy to the doubts and disillusionment of his disciples. He worked no further sign; he offered no further explanation. He simply challenged them to open themselves to the gift of faith.

Revelation has no “optional parts.” The gift of living bread is no less credible than the resurrection and

ascension of Jesus. The “bad news” was that some did not accept the gift of faith and refused to believe. The “good news” is that others, by faith, confirmed Jesus’ teaching as *good news*, as gospel and the way of salvation.

At every Eucharistic encounter, believers in the gathered assembly are invited to contemplate all Jesus, the Bread of Life, means. This is a transformative act. We are asked to make it part of our lives and help others to do the same, spreading hope and inspiration.

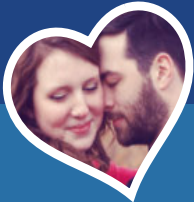
