



Dear Parishioners,

Trusting that the Lord continues to share his grace and blesses our efforts to grow in relationship with His Son Jesus Christ and each other, I share with you a few important updates.

"We had friends over at our house--a friend, his fiancé, and the friend's parents. During their visit, we had talked a little bit about their engagement. Before they left, God inspired me to give them some advice, since I had experience of more than 40 years of very happy marriage. I told them three things. The first was that to avoid divorce, they had to both decide that divorce is not acceptable. With that agreement, they would instead learn how to work things out. The second was that as a married couple, they needed to make all decisions jointly--they had to choose what was best for the team. The third was to always save time for dating--having fun together, just the two of them, so that the things that brought them together would continue to strengthen their marriage. I was not sure what they thought of my advice. When I finished, they surprised me by both hugging me and thanking me for the advice."

Finally, let us continue to keep each other in prayer and allow the Lord to make us a light to all those to whom He wants to reach out.
