Notes from Fr. Bob...

TENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

"Our Old Testament and our gospel reading both seem to be about death but also about life. Both Elias and Jesus have raised someone from the dead; both have brought life but with a difference. The good widow who takes in Elias loses her son and thinks that this man of God is somehow punishing her for her sins. But Elias takes her son and in the privacy of his room prays to God to restore the boy's life breath and God does that. It is interesting that Elias first seems to reproach God even while he trusts God: "O Lord my God, will you even afflict the widow with whom I am staying by killing her son?" Regardless, Elias trusts and is bold enough to ask for the boy's life.

In our gospel reading Jesus just happens to meet a funeral procession and is moved with pity for the widow whose son has died. "Young man, I tell you, arise!" And Jesus returns the young man to his mother. No one says a word to Jesus about this young man or about his mother, but Jesus knows the mother's grief and raises the boy to life with compassion and mercy for the mother. The other and more important difference between Elias and Jesus is that Jesus raised the young man through his own power and the people rightfully say that "God has visited his people."

This miracle of Jesus is amazing, but in one sense it is nothing compared to what he is going to do. This miracle is only a sign. We might even go so far as to say it is only a momentary victory. The true victory will come only when Jesus himself is raised from the dead. That will bring a new and totally glorious life. And it doesn't stop with Jesus because we all will one day share in that glorious new life. That might be hard to imagine now when we feel we are in the fullness of life regardless of our age, but it is true. God has truly visited his people by sending his Son Jesus Christ who brought us salvation.

So what do we do about this today? What is Jesus asking of us today? I believe Jesus is asking us to rise up from whatever is holding us down. It might be anger that we aren't ready to let go of right now. It might be greed that prevents us from helping our brothers and sisters, our neighbors, the needy around us. It might be our desire for position or praise that makes us willing to compromise our values to achieve. It might be just plain selfishness that makes us ignore everyone else and even treat them badly. It might be alcohol or drugs or some other dependency that keeps us from being free or causes us to

act in ways we wouldn't want Jesus to know if we stood before him now. So what is Jesus asking of us today? Could Jesus be asking us to change?

Let us look at Paul for a moment. When he was writing to the Galatians he was under attack and they were in danger of falling into legalism, thinking the law was more important than the saving grace of Jesus Christ. As a result Paul tells them rather strongly his own story and that what he is telling them about Jesus' saving grace isn't something he got from the other disciples but directly through a revelation of Jesus Christ. This has something to say to us too. It can give us hope. If a persecutor of Christians like Paul can be saved, so can we. Further, if we accept the gifts God offers us, those gifts will bear fruit in us as they did in Paul.

God called Paul, who was a persecutor, and Paul answered. Today it is our turn. God is saying to us today through His Son Jesus Christ, "Young man, young woman, older man, older woman, children, I tell you, arise!" What is he asking of us? Are we ready and willing to answer?



Favorite St. Cletus memory: One of the moments that I will always remember was at the end of the year Mass a few years ago. Fr. Bob was asking the students what they had learned that year. A student raised his hand and said that he had learned about the American Civil War. Father Bob jokingly said "and who won the Civil War", to which the student replied "nobody". After seeing the somewhat surprised look on Father Bob's face, the student went on to elaborate that no one was a winner in the American Civil War because every person that died was an American, and the thing that they were fighting over was whether they should treat people like, well, people. Those words were his own, and it was a moment that made me feel like I had accomplished something.

Advice to students: Abraham Lincoln once said "whatever you are, be a good one". The best advice that I can pass on to any student is to embrace the things that they are passionate about. I am very passionate about history, the Chicago Cubs, and especially about my chosen profession as an educator. While obviously I don't expect any student to share the exact same passions as me, the best thing that I can hope for any one of my students is to find the things that you love, and to do them as best as you can.



JUBILEE YEAR OF MERCY REFLECTION: TENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Half the liturgical year 2016 is completed after six months of extraordinary celebrations. The Incarnation mystery: Jesus' advent, nativity, epiphany. The Paschal mystery: Jesus' passion, death, resurrection, Pentecost's Holy Spirit. The solemnities of Holy Trinity and Jesus' Body and Blood. Today the Church resumes Sundays in Ordinary Time, but with a Gospel of extraordinary mercy: Jesus raises a dead man to life. Yet the one who benefits most from his extraordinary mercy is not the dead son but his widowed mother. With her husband and only son deceased, this woman's material support, in that patriarchal society, had vanished. So had her emotional support, leaving her helpless, abandoned, on society's "peripheries." One of Pope Francis' hopes in calling this Extraordinary Jubilee Year of Mercy is to transform us into more extraordinary Christians, by making our caring outreach to just such vulnerable people, and our practical selfsacrificing love for them, our ordinary, daily, Christian way of life!



Summer 2016 *Jubilee of Mercy*

Dear Friends in Christ,

On the weekend of June 11-12, 2016, we will take up a special collection for the **Retired Priests of the Archdiocese.**

Throughout the year, I have had several opportunities to meet many of our 206 retired priests who continue to share their priestly ministry in our parishes. It has come to my attention that many parishes depend upon their service for daily and Sunday Masses and for countless funerals. Without the help of our retired priests many parishes would have to reduce Mass schedules and other sacramental services.

In April, it was my honor to celebrate the funeral Mass for Monsignor Richard O'Donnell, our oldest priest. Monsignor O'Donnell was 105 years old when he died. He was ordained a priest in 1935, which means he served as a priest of Chicago for almost 81 years. He spent his retirement years at Our Lady of Good Counsel Parish where he had been pastor. Parishioners visited him every day and somewhere in that time his ministry was returned to him through their care and love.

Our retired priests rely upon your help now. The Priests' Retirement and Mutual Aid Association (PRMAA) cares for our retired priests. As you know the costs for health care, prescription drugs and nursing home care continues to increase. This special collection in June is different from the December collection for retired men and women religious where the collection goes to those in religious orders; Archdiocesan priests do not receive any funds from that collection.

Many thanks to all of you for your most gracious generosity in this collection last year and I ask that you repeat that kindness this year. Your donations, your prayers, and your good wishes are an affirmation of our retired priests. With this letter, I wish to take this opportunity to share my heartfelt appreciation for the ministry and devotion of our retired priests and I ask you to remember all the faithful priests who have gone to their eternal reward. 
