

## Notes from Fr. Bob...

### 17<sup>TH</sup> SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

the Potter story, the In first Harry PHILOSPHER'S STONE, now about ready to conclude with the final segment of the story, Harry finds himself at one point in a room with a mirror. When he looks into the mirror he sees not just himself but his parents standing behind him. They are smiling at him with great love in their eyes. As he is an orphan, his parents both being killed by the evil wizard at the very beginning of the story, Harry is entranced and keeps on returning to the room at every possible opportunity. Then one day the mirror has gone, and Harry is distraught. Out of the shadows steps his wise and kindly headmaster, who explains to Harry that the mirror shows what a person most deeply desires. Its danger is, as with Harry, that it encourages people to lose themselves in fantasy rather than reality, and so he has arranged for the mirror to be removed to another room where it will not be so easily accessible. He wants Harry to return to reality but not in any way embittered because if his sense of loss or the impossibility of his dreams. It is more that he wants the experience to prepare Harry for the trials ahead, for at the end of this first story the evil wizard will tempt Harry with the offer of his parents' return, if only Harry will hand over the philosopher's stone. Harry must have both the wisdom and the courage to resist the temptation.

God's presence among us is ultimately mysterious. It can certainly not be confined to any one human explanation or idea. Jesus uses the parables in the gospels to offer us hints or illustrations as to some of the important but differing aspects of his presence. In today's parables we learn that this presence is hidden, so we have to look for it, but it is a hidden treasure. This leads on to the thought that his presence is like a pearl of great price. Once encountered or known, we are willing to give up everything for it. But the sea image brings in another idea altogether, that of a net bringing up a haul of fish, some desirable, some not. It is used as an image of the angels sifting through humanity at the end of time. But it can also be seen as the search we make in sifting through our life experiences to try and see which reflect God's presence and which do not. Like Solomon in the first reading, we need the gift of discerning judgment to be able to do this well. But we can also take confidence from Paul's words to the Romans that God turns everything to our good. We are not lost in a maze. We have been specially chosen. In the book of Genesis we are told men and women are created in the image of God. Here we are chosen to be in the image of God's own Son.



Sometimes we would like God's presence to be much more cut and fried. God would appear to us, show us the way through life and make all our problems and anxieties disappear. The difficulty with such a desire is that it does not allow us to grow. It is as though, Like Harry in front of the mirror, we want to step out of life and just hold on to an image of comfort. But God wants us also to win our spurs. We are to live out the unique gift of life given to each one of us, and through that living to come into our special and personal relationship with God. We are to be involved in the maelstrom of life in all its challenging mixture of good and evil. But, despite our occasional fears to contrary, we are not alone. We have the presence of God living in and through us. Even when we lose our way we are reassured that God is there, turning everything to our good. It is as we grow in our awareness of this happening that we too find ourselves like the good scribe who becomes a disciple. We too are able to bring out of our storeroom of experience things both new and old that enlighten our lives but also the lives of all we meet.

#### MISSION TRIP SHARING AUGUST 3RD





#### **DOMESTIC VIOLENCE**

#### How to help a friend in an abusive relationship

Each year countless women and men are physically and emotionally abused by their partners. Chances are you know someone – sister, friend, neighbor, co-worker, etc. – who is a victim of domestic violence. And it can be hard to know what to do. Here are a few things you can do to help someone who is being abused:



**Be willing to listen, without judgment.** If someone tells you they are being abused the most important things are to believe them and to be non-judgmental. A few other tips for how to respond to someone who tells you they are being abused are

- Stay focused on the abusive behavior, not the abusive person
  - "It is never ok to slap someone."
- Empathize and tell them it is not their fault
  - "I'm sorry that happened to you. It's not your fault. You don't deserve it."
  - "This seems hard for you. It takes a lot of courage to admit that someone you love is hurting you"

- Express concern
  - "I'm concerned about you and your safety."
  - "You sound scared. You can always call back here if you need to talk."
- Let them know they aren't alone
  - "If you ever need someone to talk to, you can come here."
  - "There are a lot of people who experience the same thing, you are not alone and this is not your fault."
- Provide information and options
  - "Would you like the number of a domestic violence advocate that has helped others in similar situations?"

Respect their choices. Victim/survivors have been stripped of power in their relationships, so it is important to validate your friend's feelings and let her or him make his or her own choices. Furthermore, victim/survivors know how their partner will react more than anyone else. Do not intervene with the partner until you find out if it is safe for your friend to do so. Let your friend know in advance about people you need to tell so that she or he can take precautions if necessary. Tell only those you need to tell to increase the victim's safety and as required.

Focus on their strengths. Victims of domestic abuse are constantly put down by their partners and told they can't do anything right. Give them the emotional support they need to know that they are a good person. Help them find their strengths and skills. Most importantly, make sure he or she knows that they deserve to live a life free of violence.

Suggest creating a safety plan. Your friend or loved one may decide to remain in the abusive relationship. Let them know that you are concerned for their safety and help them see how dangerous the violence could become. Suggest they create a plan for themselves, and possibly their children, should their partner become violent again. This plan should include a list of people to call and possibly a pre-packed suitcase filled with essentials: clothes, money, etc.

Help them find a safe place and resources for support. Help your friend find a safe place to go in the event of an emergency. This may be a battered women's shelter or the home of a friend or family member. Gather information on domestic violence programs in your area. Make sure he or she knows that relationship abuse is a crime and that there are options and services available to them. If they are not happy with the first person or organization they contact, encourage them to reach out to another organization.

You might think that something as simple as talking to a friend about abuse couldn't possibly make a difference. But it really does. Just knowing that someone cares enough to ask about the abuse can break through the wall of isolation that can exist around victims of relationship abuse.



These classes occur on Sunday mornings from 9:15-10:45 a.m. or on Monday evenings from 6-7:30 p.m. throughout the academic year.
