Dear Parishioners,

Today, we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity.

For two thousand years we have been making an attempt to understand and interpret the central Christian mystery of one God in three distinct persons, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. This is something that we will continue to pray and reflect on as we grow in our relationship with the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

On the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, I have some encouraging news that I am delighted to share with you.

First, the new sound and video streaming system for our church has been ordered. I am extremely grateful to each one of you for your prayers, perseverance, and financial support. I believe, after the completion of this needed project, our worship, music, and everything else we do in church will be enhanced drastically. We will be able to hear more clearly when the Word of God is being proclaimed to us. We will be able to hear and pray when the prayer of consecration is being said. We will be able to hear and join the members of the music ministries who continue to lead us in song prayerfully. Once again, thank you.

Second, thanks to the very generous donor, the matching of donations will continue until the end of June 2022. Any additional funds over and above what is needed for the sound system will be invested in other projects in the church such as repairing the flat roofs.

Third, on Friday, June 3rd, 2022, at 9:30 AM we held the End of the Year School Mass. As always, it was a joy to celebrate Mass and pray with our children, teachers, staff, and administrators as we did every week. Since the beginning of the school year, I have noticed that our children were are very engaged in Mass. FOOD PANTRY UPDATE

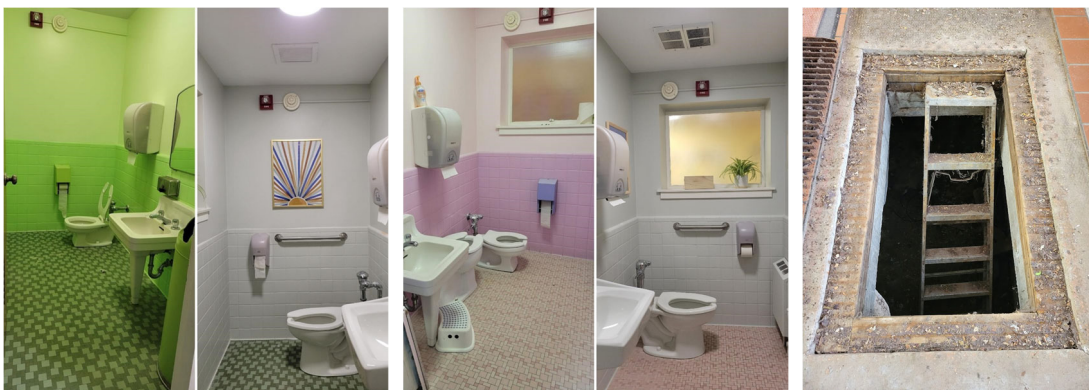
Recently Home Care Solutions donated 250 lbs of food to the pantry! They also provided fliers with information on the services they provide and job openings they have available.

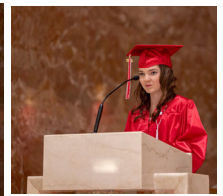
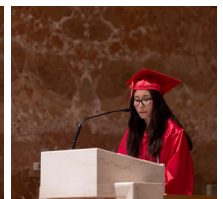

SIGN UP NOW!

Summer is coming, and if you haven't already signed your children up for Religious Education Classes for the 2022-23 academic year, please do it now!

Registration forms can be found online at stcletusparish.com under the Religious Education tab, or in the RE Office or Parish Center.

We currently offer classes for children in Grades 1-8, as well as for children in Preschool (3 yrs) – Kindergarten. We also offer a Special Needs Adaptive Curriculum program for children in Grades 1-8.

Please keep in mind that Sacramental Preparation is a two year process. This applies to the Sacraments of Reconciliation and Eucharist (1st and 2nd Grades) as well as Confirmation (7th and 8th Grades).

We offer classes on Sunday mornings 10:00-11:30 a.m. for Grades 1-8 and Monday evenings 6-7:30 for Grades 1-8. Early childhood classes meet on Sundays from 10:30-11:30 a.m. Special Needs Classes meet from 9:30-10:30 on two Sundays a month.

If you are new to our program, please bring a copy of your child's baptismal certificate. Please contact the RE Office at (708) 352-2383 with any questions you may have.

VOLUNTEERS NEEDED



The Religious Education Office currently has openings in a few key volunteer ministries. Please read about them below, and prayerfully consider joining this awesome team!

Catechist: The classroom teacher who actively shares their faith and love of Jesus with the children. You do not need previous experience – we provide training, all materials and resources, even written lesson plans! Catechists receive a \$100 tuition credit or stipend at the end of the year. We currently have openings in Grades 1-

8 on Sunday mornings and Monday evenings, as well as openings in our Early Childhood Religious Education classes. Co-teaching or Partner teaching is also an option here!

Aide: The classroom helper who assists the Catechist and students in the classroom as needed. You do not need previous experience – just a desire to help and share your faith with the kids! Adult Aides receive a \$50 tuition credit or stipend at the end of the year. We currently have openings in Grades 1-5 on Sunday mornings or Monday evenings, as well as openings in our Early Childhood Religious Education classes.

Religious Education Board: We are looking to create a new Religious Education Board who will serve in an advisory capacity for the Director of Religious Education and the Pastor. This board will meet once six times a year and assist with projects to improve our RE program, offer more programs for parents, work to find ways to recognize and affirm our volunteer staff, and provide important feedback to the RE staff pertaining to the RE program and sacramental preparation. Board members receive a \$100 tuition credit or stipend at the end of the year. Please consider volunteering your time to help to improve our program!

Office Helper: This volunteer will assist us in the office during regularly scheduled RE class times. This person will answer phones, monitor children arriving late/leaving early, assist in maintaining a safe environment for our students in the building, and assist with attendance. Office Helpers will receive a \$100 tuition credit or stipend at the end of the year. We currently have additional openings on Sunday mornings or Monday evenings.

Substitute Catechist: Occasionally, a Catechist may be absent or need to miss a class. We need people who are willing to serve in this capacity. Volunteers can stipulate a preference for subbing on Sunday morning or Monday evening.

Attendance at a Protecting God's Children session is required of all volunteers 18+ who work with children. This is mandated by the Archdiocese of Chicago. Trainings will take place here at St. Cletus at the end of the summer or online.

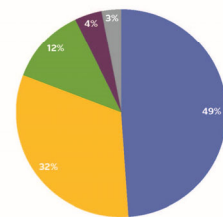

RAÍCES BÍBLICAS DE LA TRINIDAD

Las lecturas de hoy muestran algunas raíces bíblicas de lo que los cristianos llamarían más adelante la Trinidad. El libro de los Proverbios muestra el papel de la Sabiduría en la obra de la creación, descrita como una realidad ajena a Dios, pero integrada en la obra de Dios de formar los cielos y la tierra. Nos unimos al salmista para compartir el deleite de la Sabiduría en la obra de Dios: “Oh Señor, nuestro Dios, qué maravilloso es tu nombre en toda la tierra” (Salmo 8:2). En su carta a los romanos, Pablo escribe sobre la paz con Dios por medio de Jesús, y el amor de Dios que se recibe por medio del Espíritu Santo, lo que distingue a Dios, a Jesús y al Espíritu Santo, aunque también muestran su permanente unidad. Por último, en el discurso de despedida del Evangelio de Juan, Jesús -que antes había hablado de sí mismo como el Hijo del Padre- promete a sus amigos que recibirán el Espíritu de la verdad que les enseñará y guiará después de que él se vaya.

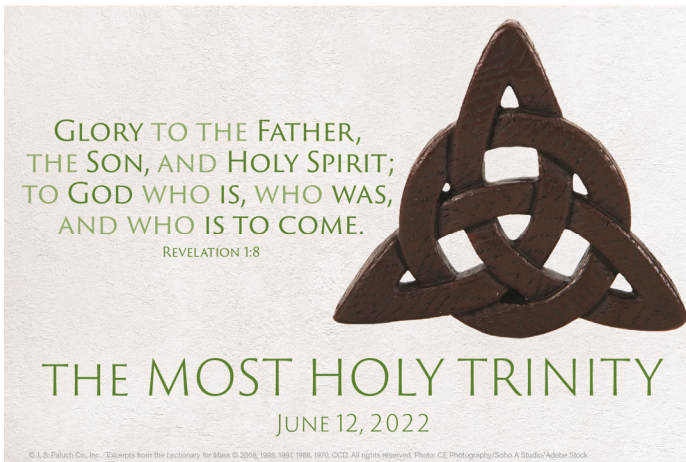

Today's readings show some biblical roots of what Christians would later call the Trinity. Proverbs showcases the role of Wisdom in the work of creation, portrayed as a reality outside of God but integrated into God's work of forming the heavens and the earth. We join the psalmist in sharing Wisdom's delight in God's handiwork: "O Lord, our God, how wonderful your name in all the earth" (Psalm 8:2). In his letter to the Romans, Paul writes of peace with God through Jesus, and the love of God received through the Holy Spirit, distinguishing God, Jesus, and the Holy Spirit while also displaying their abiding unity. Finally, in the farewell discourse from John's Gospel, Jesus—who had earlier spoken of himself as Son of the Father—promises his friends that they will receive the Spirit of truth that will teach and guide them after his departure.

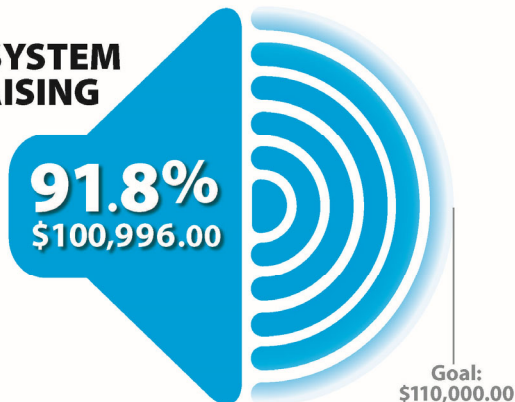

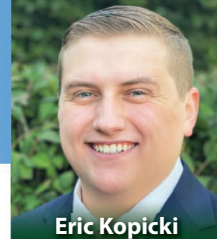
