LENTEN REGULATIONS

(from Ash Wednesday, to the Paschal Triduum)

Abstinence from meats is to be observed by all Catholics 14-years-old and older on Ash Wednesday and on all Fridays of Lent.

Fasting is to be observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday and encouraged for Holy Saturday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age but not yet 59. Those who are bound by this may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.

Health concerns and "doctor's orders" should always take precedence over the practices of fast and abstinence. Fast and abstinence should never jeopardize one's physical health.

Pastor's Note

Dear Parishioners,

Back in 1995, my Spiritual Director advised me to read a book about the life of St. John Bosco. He was born in 1815, Italy. As I read the book, I remember being animated by the way John Bosco allowed God to shape his life. He let God

be God in his life since he was a child. He understood that God wanted him to help others, especially the youth. Most of them were homeless, poor and orphans. John Bosco became their friends and started to take care of them when he was still a teenager. Then, he went to the seminary and was ordained a priest. As a priest he completely dedicated his life to the poor, to the most forgotten, and to the unwanted, which happened to be mostly young people.

Inspired by the Holy Spirit, for Lent I am rereading that same book. The first time I read it in Spanish. This time I am reading it in English. I am enjoying reading it. I am becoming aware of new details such as the profound influence the mother of John Bosco had in his life, vocation, and priesthood. She (Margaret) was his first mentor and teacher, who helped him to discover and accept his calling to the priesthood. Margaret had a strong faith and believed in God wholeheartedly. She would gently teach and remind John with the following words, "God always sees you. Let us thank God who is good to us. He is truly a father. God sees our most secret thoughts." With these simple and yet profound admonitions Margaret raised her son and helped him to become a saint, St. John Bosco.

I would like to take this opportunity to acknowledge and wholeheartedly thank Olga Montalvo for being part of and then leading our Spanish Choir for the past 30 years. She is a woman of faith. She loves God. She loves St. Cletus Parish and its parishioners. As a good person and as a good leader, she wants someone else to step up and take the leadership role for our Spanish Choir. I admire and respect her insight and her prayers in finding another person that can lead our 12:30 PM Spanish Mass choir.



DOMESTIC VIOLENCE OUTREACH

Pope Francis Denounces Domestic Violence - Pope Francis has spoken on domestic violence multiple times since the beginning of the pandemic. He has repeatedly called on society to protect vulnerable women, singling out victims in his prayers. In February, 2021, he released a video calling attention to DV and its many manifestations. (Pope Francis' video) On Easter Monday 2021, when many countries were imposing lockdowns, Francis spoke in support of victims saying, "Many mothers and sisters and grandmothers who are confined to their homes . . . are at risk of enduring violence." Francis marked the International Day for the Elimination of Violence Against Women on November 25, 2021, by writing, "The various forms of ill-treatment that many women suffer are acts of cowardice and degradation of all humanity. We must not look the other way . . . The number of women who are beaten, abused in their homes, even by their husbands, is very, very high . . . The problem is that . . . it is taking advantage of the weakness of those who cannot defend themselves. It is humiliating, very humiliating." In his Christmas message in 2021, he called on people to be supportive and helpful to "women who have suffered domestic violence during these months of lockdown." In his 2022 New Year's address, Francis stated, "Since mothers bestow life . . . let us all make greater efforts to promote mothers and to protect women. How much violence is directed against women! Enough! To hurt a woman is to insult God, who from a woman took on our humanity. He did not do it through an angel; nor did he come directly; he did it through a woman. At the beginning of the New Year, let us place ourselves under the protection of this woman, the Mother of God, who is also our mother." According to UN Women, the United Nations organization dedicated to empowering women and gender equality, almost one in three women - an estimated 736 million around the world - have been subjected to physical violence from a partner or sexual violence from someone else at least once. Last month, the organization issued a report suggesting that domestic violence had intensified during the pandemic. New York Times, December 20, 2021. Religious Education

RCIA

RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults) is a process of study, exploration, faith-sharing, and faith formation with specific liturgical rites for those who wish to become Catholic or complete the sacraments of initiation. Adults, teens and children who have not been baptized and desire to join the Catholic Church are invited into the ancient celebration of the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. Those to be baptized are called Catechumens. We also welcome adults and older children who were baptized into another Christian faith and wish to be received into the Catholic faith, and those adults and older children who were baptized Catholic, and wish to complete the sacraments of initiation (called Candidates).



We are blessed at St. Cletus to have 29 people on this RCIA journey this year. Ten are Catechumens (those to receive Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist at the Easter Vigil), and nineteen candidates (to be received into the Church, and receive the sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist at the Easter Vigil). The RCIA teams (one for Adults and one for Teens and Children) have been meeting with these Catechumens and Candidates weekly since early October. We have been studying the Scriptures and the teachings of the Church, and we pray about where God is leading all of us.

This past Sunday, at the 10:30 a.m. Mass, we celebrated the Rite of Election with our parish community. This special Rite recognizes all who are on this journey, and the Catechumens formally request baptism, which is received with great joy by the Church. They record their names in the Book of the Elect, and they are now called the Elect. We also recognize with joy the commitment of our Candidates to complete the sacraments of initiation at the Easter Vigil. The photograph depicts our twenty-seven Elect and Candidates, along with their godparents, sponsors and parents.

During Lent, the elect prepare even more intently for the Easter Vigil, where they will receive their sacraments. At various upcoming Sunday masses, there are additional ceremonies our parishioners may experience, such as the scrutinies. If you are at one of these masses, you may notice that the readings differ from the listed readings of the day. Don't worry – that is supposed to happen!

At the Easter Vigil mass, the ten elect are welcomed into the Church through the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist. At this mass we will also include the reception into full communion with the Church two members of other faith traditions. They will make a profession of faith in the Catholic Church, be confirmed and receive the Eucharist for the first time. Our nineteen candidates will also complete the sacraments of initiation, which include Confirmation and Eucharist.

RCIA is a great blessing to all of us, not just to those being initiated and received. It reminds us that we are all called to conversion on a daily basis. It enables us to witness to the faith of our new brothers and sisters in Christ. It calls on us to reaffirm our faith and commitment to Jesus.

What are some blessings you can offer to those in RCIA?

Pray for them! They need to be strengthened and upheld by the prayers of our St. Cletus community.

Introduce yourself to the elect and candidates. We are about to welcome them into the great family of the Catholic Church, and the smaller family of our parish. Make sure they feel the warmth of our genuine joy to have them join us at the table of our Lord.

If you have never done so, plan to attend the Easter Vigil Mass this year. In addition to providing a welcoming presence for those who are coming into the Church, I think you will find it is truly the most beautiful liturgy our Church celebrates. From the lighting of new fire, to the first proclamation of the Gloria since Lent began, to the profound message of our salvation history, it is just like no other mass you will attend.

At masses on March 19 and 20, we will have paper doves hanging from a tree in the narthex. Each dove will have the name of one of our Elect or Candidates. Please take a paper dove from the tree and bring it home and put it in a prominent place in your home (such as your kitchen refrigerator) to remind you to pray for them as they complete their journey to the Easter Vigil mass. Then join us at the Easter Vigil to receive and celebrate our 29 newly initiated and received Catholics!

years, and are excited to celebrate this spirit-filled sacrament with their families, teachers, Sponsors and Bishop. We are so proud of them!

BOOK DISCUSSION





Praying for Peace in Ukraine



Last Friday, the teens in LTHS had a day off from school. Twenty students from St. Cletus Parish and St. John of the Cross Parish chose to spend that day off serving others by volunteering at Feed My Starving Children. We began our day with mass and a continental breakfast, and then headed off with our Adult Volunteers to pack meals for children in Afghanistan. We had a great time, and packed almost 13,000 meals along with three other volunteer groups. That is enough food to feed 35 children in Afghanistan for a year. We are very proud of our teens who so graciously gave of their time and talent to serve others!

Last Sunday, over 50 teens from St. Cletus and St. John of the Cross gathered at our All Teen night. We shared a meal of Chick-Fil-A and then learned about Kolbe House jail ministry in the Archdiocese of Chicago. We watched a short film on Deacon Pablo Perez and his work at this important ministry, and we had a zoom call with one of the directors at Kolbe House. Our teens all worked hard on getting a mailing out to 600 inmates of Cook County jail. This mailing allows them to complete a survey and provide feedback for the upcoming Synod on Synodality. This is a special gathering of the Church leaders that will be guided by the Spirit, and allow our Holy Father to read the signs of the times through direct feedback from Catholics all over the world. We are truly grateful for all of our teens who came and learned more about this important ministry, and who worked hard at this Corporal Work of Mercy to connect with those who are imprisoned.


