


I am delighted to let you know that our St. Cletus School has an amazing, dedicated, and vibrant board. They are committed in helping us to keep our school staying strong, inspiring, and stable. With the leadership of Bob, we really had an amazing conversation. I was touched by their passion and enthusiasm. Please keep each of them in your daily prayers.

Below I share with you a message prepared by Bob Wasik to all parents that was shared via email on Monday, September 13, 2021.

Hello St. Cletus families,

I know it has been a while since the last Board Meeting Minutes, but I wanted to send out a quick note to discuss some of the topics we are working on with the Administration and Fr. Elmer. Last night, Fr. Elmer shared with us his spiritual path to the priesthood and information about his most recent experiences as an Associate Pastor, Pastor, and most recently his role at the University of St. Mary of the Lake guiding students on their discernment to the Priesthood. He also shared with us his commitment to education and his utmost joy in working with students, parents, and staff. He wants to play an active role as he brings a renewed energy to our school environment. We look forward to working with Father Elmer in the completion of some very important school projects.

The first key takeaway from our meeting is that the school is on an extremely positive trajectory from an enrollment standpoint...we added \sim 130 students this summer and we expect the trend to continue. The second key takeaway is that we are extremely lucky to have such a wonderful school and staff. It is our job (everyone on this email) to spread the good word of the school and the positive actions that are taking place.

For starters, Fr. Elmer wants to make sure our school building is getting the love and attention it needs. We are currently upgrading the fire alarm system and are in the market for an architect to come onsite to provide ideas of how we can make the front entrance as warm and inviting as possible (if you are an architect and wish to donate your services, we won't turn you down). Fr. Elmer and the administration believe the more we can welcome others and make them feel at home, the more everyone can experience and spread the positive news of the school. Additionally, we are considering ways we can fund an onsite playground for the kids to enjoy...more to come on this at a later date.

With the positive trend in enrollment, we want to capitalize and invest more resources into making this sustainable. Fr. Elmer and the administration are open to the possibility of hiring a Marketing resource to ensure we are getting our message of Faith in God, Passion for Others & What We Do, Commitment to Excellence, Service to God & Others, and the Value of Family - Immediate & Community out to the market. This position will also be responsible for Branding, Recruitment, Alumni Relations and some Fundraising. As we continue to invest in the school and parish, we ask that you spread the news as far and wide as possible to help in the effort.

In addition to these items, we also discussed the key areas of teacher retention and those who are experiencing tuition hardship. Our goal is to strategize on how we can create a "bonus" fund for the teachers to help show appreciation for their efforts as well as a fund to help those in need so they can continue on their Catholic journey here at St. Cletus. *Nothing* is guaranteed, but both are on our radar and we are trying to figure it out.

Whew, that was a lot! I hope this message provides every family with the good news it is seeking in regard to the school and parish. While we are not perfect, we are striving to make this the best parish possible. We have the **leadership** and **stability** necessary to continue making great strides in our **capabilities** and **value**. THE MEANING OF DISCIPLESHIP

The geography of today's Gospel is significant. Jesus is completing his ministry in Galilee and beginning his journey to Jerusalem, where he will meet both death and resurrection. The prediction of his death placed here is the second of three in Mark's Gospel, and as usual it is the occasion for an important teaching on the part of Jesus. Today that lesson is tied to the need for his disciples to embrace a ministry of service. A play on words in Aramaic would have linked the words "child" and "servant," thus turning Jesus' gesture of placing a child in their midst into an illustration of his understanding of himself as the Servant of the Lord. It is that same awareness of the meaning of their ministry that Jesus (and Mark) wishes to instill in the disciples. Theirs must be a ministry of service if they are to follow in the footsteps of Jesus. And that service might even require of them that they be "handed over" to death. What would have been—in the culture of Jesus' day—an ordinary discussion of social status ("who is the greatest") becomes in Mark's context a key insight into the meaning of discipleship for the disciples and for us. FEAST OF FAITH

Doxology and Amen - "Doxology" comes from a Greek word meaning "words of praise." The Eucharistic Prayer ends with a doxology addressed to the triune God: "Through him, with him, in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory and honor is yours, almighty Father, for ever and ever." It is an exclamation of praise, honor, and glory to God, reminding us that we receive everything from God through the Son, in the power of the Spirit. At the consecration, the priest held up the host and then the chalice for us to see and adore. During the doxology, the host and chalice are held up again, but this time they are held up and offered to God the Father. With the doxology, the Eucharistic Prayer ends, as it began, with words of praise addressed to the Father: truly, it is right and just to give God praise, and we assent to this in our whole-hearted acclamation, "Amen." Never was more meaning packed into so short a word. This "Amen," sometimes and fittingly called "the great Amen," is our response to the entire Eucharistic Prayer.

Jesus and his disciples left from there and began a journey through Galilee, but he did not wish anyone to know about it. He was teaching his disciples and telling them, "The Son of Man is to be handed over to men and they will kill him, and three days after his death the Son of Man will rise." But they did not understand the saying, and they were afraid to question him.

They came to Capernaum and, once inside the house, he began to ask them, "What were you arguing about on the way?" But they remained silent. They had been discussing among themselves on the way who was the greatest. Then he sat down, called the Twelve, and said to them, "If anyone wishes to be first, he shall be the last of all and the servant of all." Taking a child, he placed it in the their midst, and putting his arms around it, he said to them, "Whoever receives one child such as this in my name, receives me; and whoever receives me, receives not me but the One who sent me."

"Even the smallest act of service, the simplest act of kindness, is a way to honor those we lost, a way to reclaim that spirit of unity that followed 9/11."



Religious Education

CATECHETICAL SUNDAY

As part of a 1935 initiative to recognize and celebrate the gift that catechists give to their parish communities by volunteering their time for the education of children, adults, and families, the Church began what we know today as Catechetical Sunday. The Latin origin of the word Catechist means to "resound" or "echo". Catechists echo the faith to others as they teach and witness to their faith. On Catechetical Sunday, we come together as both a parish and Church community to acknowledge the dedication of those who serve as catechists in our parish family. These catechists are found in our Religious Education ministry, in the Parish School, in our Pre-Cana and Marriage Prep team, in our Baptismal Prep team, in our RCIA teams, in CREDO ministry, and most importantly, in our homes with our parents as the primary Catechists of the faith to their children. It is important to recognize our parents, grandparents and guardians because they are the first true catechists, sharing the Catholic faith with their families. Catechetical Sunday is an opportunity for all Catholics to rededicate themselves to the mission of handing on the faith and being a witness to the Gospel as a community of faith. The day also provides an opportunity for us to consider ways we are witnesses for Jesus Christ ourselves.

The 2021 Catechetical Sunday theme is "Say the Word and My Soul Shall be Healed." Catholics pray these powerful words at Mass which are a reminder of the healing that Jesus offers each one of us in the Eucharist. In a time and in a world in great need of healing, we remember Jesus the Healer. The Church shares Jesus' special concern for all those who are sick or suffering and this year's theme is an invitation to hear Christ's invitation to new life in him.

Take some time today to reflect on how YOU are a Catechist. If you are a parent, remember your awesome role that you agreed to at your child's baptism to be the first and best teacher of the faith. As disciples of Christ, how do you echo the faith to others around you? How do you share your faith story to bring others to Christ? We are all called to be Catechists. Pray and reflect on how God is calling you to resound and echo the faith to those in our community and families.

We are truly grateful for all of our many Catechists here at St. Cletus Parish, especially our parents who model and witness their faith every day within their families. May God bless you always and in all ways.

message from Griselda:



Hello my name is Griselda Rahman. I would like to take a moment to share with you how it is that I came to fill the position of Coordinator of Religious Education. Perhaps for some it will sound familiar. One morning I had a feeling that change was heading my way

as I was praying. I wasn't sure what kind of change, but I knew it was going to be a big spiritual one in my life. I felt unprepared for what it was and prayed that He would provide me with the strength and knowledge to handle what was coming. I didn't know how, when or from where it would come, but certain that it was on its way. Later that evening I received a call from Barb Campbell to touch base about the upcoming R.E. program. As soon as I hung up, I laughed and said "Wow Lord, that was fast". I met with her and the plan began to unfold. My training is in healthcare and to do something completely different made me feel unsure to be honest. I prayed about the decision to take this position and each time He spoke to me through small signs (words said in passing, something read, a song), small things that sometimes we say "hmmm.... that was some coincidence. "However, we all know that there aren't any coincidences when it comes to God. We listen and then we know that He is calling. We know that this is the moment we answer and be where he needs us to be. I hope to help make our program one in which our children will grow in faith and one our parents will choose to grow stronger and be grounded with beside their children. I hope it will be a place to revisit if we've left our faith wanting and return to learn and ignite that fire that burns in each of us for God and the world. I am excited to meet all the wonderful families and their children and look forward to working with some wonderful and talented people in our parish.



Making a gift from your IRA can have benefits for you and for our parish. An IRA charitable rollover, also known as a qualified charitable distribution (QCD), allows individuals age 70¹/₂ or older to authorize their IRA administrator to make a direct transfer of funds from their IRA to qualified charities, tax-free.

There are three main benefits of giving with a QCD:

- 1) If you are 72 years old or older, the amount you transfer can satisfy all or part of your required minimum distribution.
- The amount transferred directly to charity does not generate taxable income, which may reduce your annual income 2) level. This may help lower your Medicare premiums and decrease the amount of Social Security that is subject to tax.
- 3) Your gift will be immediately used, allowing you to see the impact of your gift now.
