### Pastor's Note

"Jesus Christ loves you; he gave his life to save you; and now is living at your side every day to enlighten, strengthen, and free you." Evangelii Gaudium 164.

#### Dear friends.

I am happy to let you know that our Evenings of Prayer and Reflection (8/16/23 and 8/23/23) went well. The first one was in English and the second in Spanish. We were blessed to have Dr. Peter Newburn as our special guest speaker. He is fluent in English and Spanish. He is a man of prayer and deep faith who loves leading others to the Lord. He not only touched but above all engaged and inspired the hearts and minds of many. I was moved to see many who wanted to personally thank Dr. Peter at the end of his spirit-filled reflection. That was truly another holy moment.

Below I share three holy moments coming from three members of our Parish Staff and another one coming directly from Dr. Peter Newburn.

"We were so blessed to have Dr. Peter Newburn spend the entire day with us at St. Cletus Parish and School. His insights that he shared with us regarding his own life with respect to evangelization were very powerful. He used the Greek word "kerygma" several times to place an emphasis on preaching the importance in sharing the Gospel message with others. Life is about asking God to be part of all aspects of our life especially when we are challenged. "God, I don't understand you; however, I trust in You" was a statement that Dr. Peter shared with us to try and live by each and every day. Finally, in a simple way Dr. Peter had us repeat the following: "God is Good! All of the time. That is His Nature. Wow!" -Principal Gregory Porod

"Dr. Peter's message was that we are all by our Catholic Faith called to be missionary disciples. We are commissioned as Jesus's disciples were to: ... "go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you." (Matthew 28:19-20a). The Holy Moment for me as the Director of Faith Formation was as Dr. Peter described the most important action from the quote is that we are to MAKE disciples. In our Faith Formation Program that is what we strive to do, MAKE our children followers of Jesus. -Larry Manetti, Director of Faith Formation for Children.

"Dr. Peter Newburn is a man of many talents which he attributes to the grace of God. He has devoted his life to ministry, which is commendable as he continues responding affirmatively to the call he received. The part of the presentation I would describe as a "holy moment" pertains to his humanity, and our own humanity. He shared he lost a nephew at a young age. He became emotional when speaking about it. Losing a child is a huge pain. Parents just try to continue living with that reality, but the pain is always there. Dr. Peter did not give up. He continued devoting his life to ministry, despite this sorrow in his heart. That's truly embracing our faith, as the path to the resurrection begins at the cross." -Franco Foti, Operations Director

"It was a great pleasure for me to be with the community of St. Cletus these past two Wednesday evenings (one in English, one in Spanish) as we explored the powerful and transformative truth of the great Story of Salvation. We discussed the Gospel message using four words: Created, Captured, Rescued, Response. There was an undeniable presence of God's Spirit, and so many of you were deeply touched. I feel personally revived and inspired as I continue to pray daily with the simple and transformational truth of the Gospel message:

- 1. God created each one of us and really loves us. He is truly good, and has a good plan for our lives.
- 2. We are sinful, broken, afflicted, harassed, and captured by an Enemy.
- 3. Jesus came to **rescue** us, to set us free, to bring us life, to be our Redeemer.
- 4. We are invited to **respond**, to surrender, to believe and receive the gift of salvation, and to live as missionary disciples.

When I met with the teachers of St. Cletus school, we were brainstorming concrete ways to help students to know and experience God's amazing love for them. One of the preschool teachers suggested standing in front of the mirror, giving yourself a hug, and declaring "God loves me!" I have decided that I need to do that every day. It's nice to see that person smiling back at me, oh-soblessed, created-in-God's-image-and-likeness. No matter what I'm going through, I am loved! May you know and encounter God's amazing love for you every day, and may you share the Good News with others who need to know they are loved." - Dr. Peter Newburn






