A Letter from the Associate Pastor's Desk

Many parishes offer Bible Studies for adults. Many parishes have other faith formation opportunities for adults. It's probably one of the most popular "complaints" I have heard from adults over my 23 years of ministry "Why didn't anyone teach us that?" I think that is one of the blessings that we have here at St. Cletus. We have offered "Evenings of Prayer and Reflection" with many visiting priests and other professionals. Last Lent, there was a four -week biblical walk through the Mass. Last night (November 4th), we embarked on another formation opportunity for adults entitled "When You Pray."

So many people have mentioned to me in recent years that they don't know how to pray or how to come back to God if they have recently felt distant from Him. Some of those people are educated professionals, but they simply feel like their prayers are inadequate. When I arrived at the first session last night, I was hope-filled to see some new faces who were not at the previous Bible Study last Lent. It filled my heart to know that prayer IS important to people and that they want to learn more.

Something that struck me in the video being used to help the discussion at the tables was that we all need to come to the realization that anything that moves you to say thank you to God, or help me, or whatever the situation, just calling on God with a sincere heart is the beginning of creating a prayer life. It could be the first 5-10 minutes of the day to devote to God, speaking to Him and listening to Him. And it might be that your prayers are anchored by the "formal" prayers like the Our Father, Hail Mary, the Rosary, or other noted devotions. However, something I have certainly

experienced is that when I need to re-ground my own prayer life, I return to those devotional prayers which leads me to concentrate a little more about what I need to tell God AND to listen to his voice – his response.

That is faith. Faith is our response to God's invitation to follow Him.

I didn't actually count the number of attendees last night, but there were approximately 18-22 people from different age groups, ethnicities, and levels of education. Everyone seemed very engaged in the video piece. There was a part of the video that had religious sister who gave practical recommendations for anyone who is trying to connect or reconnect with God. For me, carving out a specific time to pray every day is one of the most important recommendations she made. When we were in the seminary, as you might expect, the daily time we were to be attending and praying Morning Prayer from the Liturgy of the Hours (some say it is the church's prayer book) was 7:30am. At most it was about 20 minutes officially to start with and it took time to learn, but it became a part of my everyday existence. Then breakfast and off to classes. Evening Prayer was at 5pm, then off to dinner.

Set time aside to concentrate. Use the Bible. Don't just read on and on, but take time to think about what stirs in your heart as you are going along.

The next session is this Monday, the 11th at 7pm in the Gallagher Room. Hope to see you there.



We continue to be humbled by your generous support of this ministry. All of you have experienced the increased cost of groceries and other necessities. Many of you know the pain, panic and stress of having experienced a personal and/or financial crisis. Our St. Cletus Social Concerns and St. Cletus St. Vincent DePaul Society (SVDP) work collaboratively to help people in our area with financial assistance. Your support makes this happen.

This year, we have experienced an increase in requests for financial assistance. In just one week, we received requests for over \$10,000. We chose to help with about \$8,000 of the requests. Below are a few examples of recent requests. Please note, these are overly simplistic and intentionally brief examples to give an idea of the type or requests we receive:

- 1. Single mom of four with two autistic children. Two months behind on rent. Working part time, and receives disability and child support income. Missed work to stay home with the kids while Strep Throat and the Flu cycled through everyone and had to miss school, therefore her income was less. Owes \$3,053.
- 2. Twenty seven year old single man out of work due to car accident and surgery. Expected to go back in December. Put off surgery for six months to make as much money as he could to save up for expenses but has fallen short. Is a contract worker and wasn't eligible for unemployment or disability. Looking for help with one month rent. Owes \$1,100.
- 3. Senior citizen experienced flooding in her mobile home. The floor rotted all the way through and there was mold throughout the room. Insurance would not cover repairs. Only income is Social Security. \$1,550 for repairs.

In addition to the increase in requests for financial assistance, we have seen an increase in those attending the food pantry. We recently surpassed our **largest day** ever, serving 170 households in one day.

Our biggest priority and request for help right now is Giving Tree! *Here is how you can help:*

- Giving Tree Tags: We have 45 more families enrolled in Giving Tree this year than last year. That is about 180 more tags than in 2023.
 Since Thanksgiving is late this year, we also have one less week with the Giving Trees in Church. We need your help with tags!
- This year, we are offering a new online tag sign up. This will help us expand our reach to those outside the St. Cletus



Parish community. You can share this link with other friends and family that may not attend our parish or be familiar with our program. You can share on social media too!

- Please note, tags on the trees in the Narthex will still be available!
- Grocery gift cards will be available for sale after Masses this weekend and November 23-24.

Please find below text from letters from Cardinal Cupich to several faith communities where Father William Killeen served regarding his reinstatement to ministry.

Last year, I wrote to you about Reverend William Killeen [retired]. The Archdiocese had received an allegation of sexual abuse of a minor while Father Killeen was assigned to St. Patricia Parish more than 40 years ago. In keeping with our child protection policies, the allegation was reported to civil authorities and the person making the allegation was offered the services of our Victim Assistance Ministry. Father Killeen cooperated with my direction to remain out of ministry while the allegation was investigated.

The Archdiocese Independent Review Board met this week to evaluate the results of the investigation. They determined that there is not a reasonable cause to believe Father Killeen sexually abused a minor. In addition, the Board recommended that Father Killeen be returned to ministry and that the file be closed. After prayerful consideration, I have accepted their recommendations and restored Father Killeen's faculties to minister in the Archdiocese of Chicago.

The welfare of the children entrusted to our care is our paramount consideration. Consequently, we take seriously all allegations of sexual misconduct. It is to the credit of our priests that they support our child protection policies. They understand that only by applying a meticulous and impartial process to all allegations can we remain committed to our work of assisting survivors and, with the help of independent advisors, thoroughly evaluate all allegations.

At the same time, I am committed to restoring the good name of those so accused if the case is unsubstantiated. To that end, I publicly affirm that Father Killeen is a priest in good standing and express sincere appreciation for his many years of service to the People of God in the Archdiocese of Chicago. This period away from ministry has been challenging for him. He deserves our respect and gratitude and I hope you will join me in thanking him for his long-standing dedication.

In closing, I encourage anyone who believes they have been abused by a priest, deacon, religious or lay employee to come forward. You will be received with respect and compassion. To report abuse please refer to the Archdiocesan website at www.archchicago.org.




