Mario presented us a concrete experience where he noticed God being born and present especially in unthinkable places, such as a morgue (Covid 19), shelters for children, and at a location where a mass shooting took place. I knew God being born and present at both of his talks. I


consider Fr. Mario as a genuine bearer of good news and source of harmony, comfort, and peace.

A Note from the Associate pastor's Desk

The Fourth Sunday of Advent has us listen to the story of the Visitation of Mary with her relative Elizabeth. At the time, Elizabeth is at least 6 months pregnant with John. Mary has just said yes to the responsibility to become the Mother of God's Son -she offered her body in sacrifice to the Lord. I find it interesting that the author of the Letter to the Hebrews touches on "Behold, I come to do your will," paraphrasing Psalm 40:9. In the scene just before the Visitation was the Annunciation of Gabriel the Archangel, announcing God's invitation to Mary, and she responds with "I am the handmaid of the Lord. Let it be done to me according to your word." It's not exact in the wording, but the idea in Psalm 40 is certainly present. It's no wonder Jesus used a very similar response when he was in the Garden of Gethsemane – possibly even praying the Our Father.


The wonder of the season continuously calls us to be people of hope. One way that I experience it is through the gift of music. Today (December 22nd) is the concert being given by our very own chancel choir at 4pm. Last Sunday was the Jazz Nativity performance as a part of the Ed Ward Fine Arts Series. Incredible! And now with only days left until the Savior returns, we need to be grounded in the goodness of God and help others to see it in the world around us. The Food Pantry and the giving

tree works are completed, but the season of giving will always give us the opportunities to help the less fortunate. There will always be someone in the world who needs someone to care about them and offer them the same hope that WE have in Jesus' Cross and Resurrection.

Last Monday (Dec 16th) was the end of the seven-week formation series called When You Pray. I want to give a shout out to Monica Herron who led our sessions. She didn't need to do a lot of talking because it was centered around a video presentation by the author. Most of what we did was to have good conversations sparked by the reflections in our books and by the video. I asked the group at the previous class (Dec 9), what they thought and everyone agreed it was an important series. The hope is that there will be future Bible studies more people might be interested in the future.

Food Pantry Updates

What an incredible year it has been for St. Cletus Social Concerns.

- Launched our new website (www.stcletusfoodpantry.com)
- Started a home delivery program that currently serves 46 residents in Lyons Township!
- We have helped with over \$60,000 in financial requests so far this year. An increase of 84% from the previous year.
- Set a new record of 170 families served during a single food pantry distribution evening.
- Provided 402 Thanksgiving meals, another new record.
- Collected and distributed gifts for 1,136 individuals. 45 more families
 participated in Giving Tree this year than last year. Another record setting
 year.
- Hosted our first off-site volunteer appreciation party!
- Collaborated with the LaGrange Farmer's Market to collect donated produce and fresh foods every week during the season.
- Had our official Food Pantry Truck Ribbon Cutting with the Greater Chicago Food Depository, Cook County Board President Toni Preckwinkle, U.S. Senator Dick Durbin, La Grange Village President Mark Kuchler and other community leaders.

Week after week, we continue to see more people experience food insecurity and attending the pantry. We have set new records this year on Thursday nights.

A HUGE thank you to our volunteers! We had over 100 different volunteers move, organize and distribute (literally) over a thousand gifts donated by generous St. Cletus families and community members! The Mission Ladies recently gathered for their end-of-year luncheon. They celebrated another record-setting year of success! This year, they made over 850 items by hand to donate to St. Cletus Food Pantry, Edwards Hospital, Our Lady of the Angels, Hinsdale Hospital and the American Legion.


