

Pastor's Note

"Beloved: I am grateful to him who has strengthened me, Christ Jesus our Lord, because he considered me trustworthy in appointing me to the ministry," 1 Tim 1:12

Dear Parishioners,

What happens when Christ becomes part of our lives?

We grow in personal relationship with him. We enjoy chatting and spending time with him. We get curious and want to learn more about him. We let him shape our minds and hearts. We let him fill our lives with his kindness, joy, and peace. Then, naturally we feel encouraged and inspired to share him with others.

This reality is something that I continue to be exposed to as I journey with you. Daily I am lucky to see him present and active in each and every one of you who are so dedicated to him. Below I share with you some specific moments when I experienced Christ present and inspiring us all.

First, on Wednesday, August 31st, 2022, we had two inspiring celebrations/gatherings. At 9:30 AM we celebrated Mass of the Holy Spirit with the entire community of our Parish School. At Mass we prayed and asked the Lord to bless our new school year and send the Holy Spirit upon us. The children actively participated in Mass. The readings were proclaimed by them. The prayers of the faithful were prayed by them as well. The gifts (bread and wine) were brought to the altar by them. Three of them served at Mass as altar servers. The members of the choir were children from our school who did an outstanding job. We are blessed to have such a great team that worked together to allow us such a special Mass with our children. My deepest gratitude to them for their ministry and dedication to us.

The same day at 6:30 PM we held our Evening of Reflection with our Gushers (Greeters and Ushers) in the Parish Center. This was my first encounter with them since my arrival at St. Cletus Parish. We started our gathering by having some time to get to know each other while enjoying some pizza and soft drinks. Then, we prayed with 1 Peter 2:9 which reminded us of our baptismal right and privilege to participate in the ministry of Christ. We all acknowledged that serving Christ and his church is an honor and a responsibility. As a parish community, we are lucky to have many wonderful and dedicated women and men who greet us with a smile when we come to Mass. In each one of them, we clearly see Christ welcoming us with a smile. I take this opportunity to offer them my wholehearted gratitude and appreciation for their ministry to us. Please keep them in your prayers.

Second, on Saturday, September 3rd, 2022, at 10:00 AM, we celebrated a Funeral Mass for Julian Urbina-Medina, who was 14 years old. After spending some time with his grandparents on Sunday, August 28, 2022, he was on his way home driving his bicycle when he was struck by a car and tragically lost his young life. During his 14 years of life, Julian shared his joy, care, and love with all. He is remembered as kindhearted, selfless, funny, attentive, caring, with a good sense of humor. I believe over 800 hundred people attended his funeral Mass. I was moved by the presence, support, prayers, and witness of all those who came. In my prayer as I prepared for Julian's Funeral Mass, I asked Christ to work through me since I found myself with a heavy heart and at loss for words. I take this opportunity to thank all ministers who came to assist at Julian's Funeral Mass. I was able to sense the closeness and presence of Christ throughout the entire celebration as I watched them serving. Please keep our ministers and Julian's family and friends in your prayers.

Then, in the afternoon at 2:00 PM, I celebrated a special Mass at Summit Park District. I was invited by some of our parishioners who are leaders of this celebration that happens yearly. They had music, games, and delicious food. They have a special devotion to St. Jerome, who is the patron saint of the town where they were born in Mexico. They had music, games, and delicious food. I was moved by their hospitality and active participation in Mass. The presence of Christ was noticeable.

Third, today at our 10:30 AM Mass, we will remember and pray in a special way for all those whose lives were taken away on the morning of September 11, 2001. Today, we also give thanks and pray for all the first responders for their selfless dedication and love for other human beings. In their gesture, dedication, and action I see the spirit of Christ alive. May Christ bless them abundantly.

Fourth, on Wednesday, September 14, 2022, at 7:00 PM, Fr. John Lodge will be delivering his talk, Why Pray? We all are kindly invited! We are blessed to have him celebrating Mass for us almost every weekend. Thank you for making every effort to attend such a unique teaching on prayer. If you can, please extend the invitation to someone who might appreciate hearing from you.

May Christ continue to share his grace with us so that you and I might become Christ for others in our daily lives.

Note From Father Mike

Still like yesterday...

I know I am not the only person who feels this way around September 11th. It's 21 years this weekend since the events surrounding the purposeful destruction of the World Trade Center "Twin Towers" by terrorists. I never thought anything like it would happen in my lifetime, and as much as I once wondered what sorts of memories go through the survivors of any of the major wars in recent history, my mind now knows what it's like to relive that day over and over again. It still horrifies me to watch archived video. For the life of me, I don't know why newscasts and documentaries show the stuff every year on television. I know we should never forget the men and women who lost their lives and that we should always be grateful for the first responders who did everything they could in digging through tons and tons of debris trying to find survivors for weeks on end. My heart still aches with the mere image of the ash and dust cloud that blanketed New York City. I vaguely remember the TV news running for days without stopping, the reporters just trying to hold their emotions in check too. Like so many others, they asked "why" and "how could something like this happen in our country, let alone New York as well as the other terrorist act on the Pentagon itself?"

I don't have an answer for any of this. I wish I did.

Years before that fateful day, while a student at Mundelein Seminary, one teacher asked us to respond to the philosophical question "why does God allow evil to happen?" I actually brought up the subject indirectly last weekend (the 3rd and 4th) in my homily. The first reading last weekend (as a reminder) from the Book of Wisdom asked the question "who did God consult to gain knowledge?" I tried to take it one step further and brought up one of the "eternal" questions "Did God really KNOW all of the things that would happen from the moment of Creation?" Why did God give man the capacity for even doing anything against

His goodness? Man has had the right to choose between good and evil from the moment God brought us forth from the dust of the earth. So what was the purpose? Why didn't God just stop right then? Or why did He stop short of destroying all of humanity in the Great Flood by saving Noah's family?

The truth that God has ALWAYS loved human beings above all else is the most basic beginning to try and answer any question concerning good and evil. Does God create evil? No. Man chose to disobey God's ONE thing. We say that is not fair that we should all suffer because of the sin of one man and/or one woman that lived thousands of years ago. Yet, in ALL of the stories in the Bible that have shown man's ability to do evil actions, and ALL of the varied and sometimes unthinkable events of the history of mankind through the centuries, God STILL has loved us completely in allowing us to make our own choices whether to love Him or not. His proof? Jesus, the only-begotten, Son of God and the man who was born into the world through the generosity of a young virgin woman in Bethlehem, Israel. Not only was He born into time, He would eventually give His life on behalf of all humanity to pay for not only the sin of the first man, but for the sins of ALL humanity.

Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord. Amen. May their souls and all the souls of the faithful departed, rest in peace. Amen.






BLESSING OF THE PETS






