Note From Father Mike

Advent 3 Liturgical Year 2024

I don't know how many of you saw the two comedic films Bruce Almighty and its sequel Evan Almighty, starring Jim Carrey and Steve Carrell in the title roles. Actually, yes, Morgan Freeman plays God in both films. Both movies had good-intentioned messages for humanity in the end – live like trust that God has everything under control, and do your simple "acts of random kindness" (cleverly, known throughout the second movie as ARK). I don't like giving away a lot of details about these things, but know that one of the lessons many of the characters took to heart in the end was to give God our thanks for everything we have.

Neither of the films is Catholic per se, but both provide good lessons for each of us to learn as we have with many other movies or TV shows. Not every feel-good movie is made for the Hallmark Channel only.

Each year around this time, the classic Christmas "Claymation" cartoons produce by Rankin & Bass from the late 1960s and early 1970s hit TV screens around the world. From Rudolph the Red-nosed Reindeer to The Year Without a Santa Claus, many of my generation would admit their love for these priceless pieces of animation. However, there was only one that I remember that made us think about Jesus – The Little Drummer Boy. It was not AS popular as some of the other films, but it was certainly important enough for the production company to create. Maybe it was just the timing. It shows up AFTER Christmas. We were children. It was probably all of the anticipation for Christmas day. The only thing we didn't focus on at that age was that Christmas doesn't just end. It's a true beginning.

This weekend that we celebrate the Third Sunday of Advent, we give glory to God for offering us hope for eternal life. We may continue to await and anticipate remembering Jesus' birth into history, and we are inching ever closer to the return of Jesus into our time. We set this hope off by a very special symbol – the color rose. The lighting of the rose candle is that "flashing neon sign warning" that God's promised Savior is returning sooner than we might think. Of course, we know that in our head's because time marches on. Yet, it's not our heads that need to realize Christ's return is imminent, but our souls need that realization. Maybe reclaiming some of our childhood lessons we were supposed to have learned can be the focus as we keep on moving through these days.

Being grateful comes with rejoicing as our quick color-change tell us to do – REJOICE! Let the anticipation and waiting continue to swell up within you during these final days of Advent. Technically speaking, we will finish Advent next Sunday morning and then Christmas comes just hours later. You certainly don't want to get caught not paying attention when the Savior RETURNS.

Carry on. The Savior is near! Keep hoping and praying that holy moments will show themselves throughout your life. Peace,

Archdiocese Christmas Mass Guidelines and Approval Letter

Dear Father,

As Advent approaches this weekend, and we begin the journey to Christmas, I write to remind you about the timing of Christmas Vigil Masses on December 24.

Years ago, the pastoral desire for early Christmas Eve Masses was discussed among the bishops of the Province of Chicago. It is understood that families gather to celebrate the great mystery of Christ's Incarnation in a way that helps them share their faith and the beauty of traditions with their children and extended family, some of who have become disengaged with the life of the Church. These early Masses can be a moment of evangelization and allow our pastors the ability to meet the demands made on them in a very busy season.

In scheduling anticipatory Masses, the *General Norms for the Liturgical Year and the Calendar*, notes that the "liturgical day runs from midnight to midnight, but the observance of Sunday and solemnities begins with the evening of the preceding day" (*No. 3*). Based upon this norm, the policies of the Archdiocese of Chicago note that "the time for the vigil liturgy is ordinarily between 5:00 pm and 7:00 pm, but not earlier than 4:00 pm" (202.7, Book IV, Archdiocesan Policies and Procedures, The Sanctifying Office of the Church). Observance of this policy is necessary for the liceity of the Mass and the integrity of the various feasts.

At the same time, as this applies to Christmas, the bishops of the Province of Chicago appreciate that some parishes need to accommodate large numbers of worshipers beyond a single early Christmas Vigil Mass.

Taking this into consideration, pastors may ask and be granted permission to schedule Christmas Vigil Masses beginning prior to 4:00 pm but no earlier than 3:00 pm. All requests for an exemption to the 4:00 pm policy must be made in writing to the Episcopal Vicar, explaining the reason(s) for the request. However, in accord with an agreement by the Bishops in the Province of Chicago, no permission will be given for the celebration of a Christmas Vigil Mass earlier than 3:00 pm on December 24. For the good of the Church and out of respect for Church unity in the Province, Cardinal Cupich requires strict adherence to this policy.

As you welcome people to the many celebrations in your parish during the Advent and Christmas season, be assured of my prayers and gratitude for all that you do to lead and inspire the people of God within your care.


